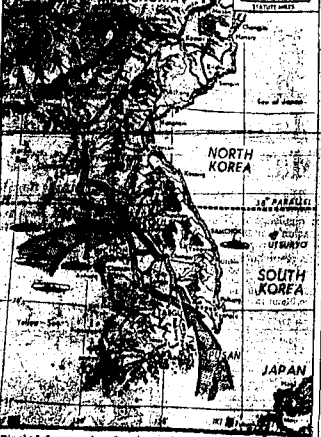

Federal Land Grazers Hold Burley Meet

BURLEY, Sept. 10.—Board of district advisers of Idaho grazing district 3, bureau of land management, concluded a two-day meeting Saturday afternoon with Dan J. Cavanagh, area office chairman, presiding.

Twenty-five range users met with the board regarding various problems encountered in the use of the federal range. Five applications for the transfer of grazing privileges were considered, as were 11 applications for construction of improvements on the federal range. Sixteen applications for grazing use were considered and recommendations made.

The range improvement program for this season was reviewed. So far this season, six reservoirs for livestock watering purposes have been completed. Four springs developed, seven miles of new road constructed, 25 miles of four-mile, two miles of fence, four miles of telephone line, two cattle guards, and maintenance work completed on many springs, fences and other projects. Work has begun on a re-seeding program which will include 8000 acres of depleted range lands between Burley and Blaine river.

Aside from Cavanagh, advisers who attended were Max D. Cochran, Lew Hot Springs; Vern Eames, American Falls; Garnet Kidd, Burley; wildlife representative, Russel O. Larsen, Kimberly; Art Pierce, Malin; vice chairman, Milton T. DeVore, Towner; Tracy, Malad; and Wesley B. Ward, Elba.

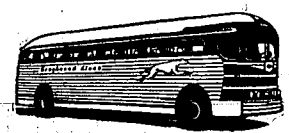
