JEROME, Sept. 20.—The first polio emergency volunteer course to be held in Magic Valley was held here last week at Washington school. Instructions were given by Mrs. Anne Knight, Twin Falls, acting supervisor of the south central district health unit. The course was sponsored by the Jerome county chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

Mrs. Knight gave instructions and demonstrated how to prepare hot packs with the use of an ordinary pressure cooker and how to use the vacuum cleaner and ear syringe for suction purposes. In all instructions Mrs. Knight stressed that the hot pack should be used under doctor's orders. Instructions for the vacuum cleaner and ear syringe were also given. A respirator, inhalator and aspirator were demonstrated by Verle Sullivan. An iron lung described by Bill Herrett, Piler, also was demonstrated.

On the final night of instruction all those taking the course were given an opportunity to apply the instructions. Barbara Jo Hamlin was the patient during the demonstration.

Kimberly Man, 96, Remembers Advising Custer Prior to Famous "Last Stand"

Kimberly, Sept. 20—(Special) Young Kenton, Ore., says Custer might not have been forced to make his famous last stand if he had listened to a advice of a group of buffalo hunters in the settlement of Billings, Mont., back in June of 1876.

In that group which urged Custer to take a larger force was a man who still remembers Billings Bull, Col. George Armstrong Custer and his outfit. Custer, George Anderson, hale and hearty in Kimberly at 96, Anderson was well acquainted with Billings Bull. Anderson said he and Custer thought easy to tramp and talked with Billings Bull many times before and after the battle of the Little Bighorn. He and Billings Bull frequently traded for buffalo robes and blankets and Anderson had a good time of what made Billings Bull.

But Custer wasn't having any of Anderson's knowledge of Billings Bull and Custer wasn't interested in what other buffalo hunters and traders knew of the land and the Indians.

When Billings Bull had had and said "Anderson recalls," and he told him, "You're making a mistake—get more men or join your other force."

Comparing Custer to Gen. Nelson A. Miles, Anderson said Custer was bull-headed and younger, but Miles was a warrior—a pretty good of general, he knew what was what.

Miles had more men than Custer, Anderson remembers, and didn't want to capture the Indians. He just wanted to drive them out. His policy was to keep them on the move, firing them out, exhausting their supplies.

It was Miles who defeated Nez Perce Chief Joseph Oct. 4, 1877 and it was in 1877 that Billings Bull retreated across the Canadian border. Anderson was in Canada then and he and Billings Bull camped near each other. Anderson bought a horse from Custer's horses from Billings Bull and learned much about Custer and his outfit.

Anderson allowed Billings Bull to come to his Canadian camp on the promise he would believe himself. Billings Bull had split his retreating forces into three parties to go to three towns for supplies, before the Canadians finally asked the Americans to send a party for the Indians to come for their Indians.

Board Rejects Offer of Road As State Park

BOISE, Sept. 20 (AP)—The state land board Tuesday declined to accept as a state park the skyline drive built on Mineral mountain along the Latah-Benewah county line.

State Land Commissioner Edward Woolsey said the board couldn't accept the area offered by Virgil McCroskey, Parlaton, Wash., without legislative action. McCroskey had shown a plan of a section of land bought in that area would be put up for sale.

In most places we now have the "holding-out" on Mt. Deok, William S. Kean's 25th division front, beyond which the enemy was making a tactical withdrawal. The most ferocious nature. The enemy advanced again and again, fanatically screaming, yelling, throwing hand grenades, and firing heavy guns.

On three sides Col. Mike Mitchell's troops threw back attack waves which once had them fighting on three sides at a time.

North of Targu, we have packed in the artillery four rows deep. I visited one battery of 160-millimeter howitzers, which, while I was there, fired two rounds, constantly filling their range as the enemy fell back.

In Targu, the windows rattled furiously during the night. The front is a 30-minute jeep drive from Targu and out extremely rough. From Targu to Measui is about 40 minutes. This area is a good example of our bridgedhead in terms of travel.

And our course, jumping 20 minutes to the front from Targu, is a trifle less mileage than 20 minutes on the Grand Central parkway on the east coast.

Upon arriving at the first cavalry front above Targu, we parked our jeep on a high ridge, from which there was an excellent panoramic view of the battlefield. Plenty of smoke was showing where the communists were catching hell, and presently a GI poked his head out of a foxhole and drawled:

"So we left. We saw many tanks going up, grim, grimy faces above the machines."
