



U.N. Debate Assured for U.S. Police Force Plan

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21 (AP)—Secretary of State Dean Acheson's plan for a United Nations police force will be debated today by the assembly's 14-nation steering committee.

The plan calls for a "peace patrol" to check on trouble spots and the designation by U.N. members of stand-by military forces to back up United Nations decisions.

Over Soviet objections the steering committee also voted for a full U.N. staff of 10,000 men and 10,000 horses.

John D. Hickerson, assistant secretary of state, today announced he will meet with the U.N. members in New York tomorrow to discuss the plan.

TOKYO, (Friday), Sept. 22 (AP)—American marines, advancing on Seoul from two directions, battled on the northern outskirts of the Korean capital and seized the bulk of the southwestern suburb of Yongdugpo Thursday against some of the strongest red opposition.

The marines fighting through Yongdugpo were thrown back once in a while by Communist troops, but finally crashed through and cut the main railroad and highway leading south from Seoul.

AP correspondent Tom Lamber, at the front with them, reported they had to hack their way through with bayonets and with the aid of flame, mortar and machine gun fire.

The marines were reported to have moved up from Inchon, a score of miles west of Seoul.

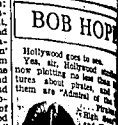

Bureau Seeks Hell's Canyon Drilling Bids

BOISE, Sept. 21.—The bureau of geology will accept bids Oct. 4 for drilling test holes for the proposed Hell's canyon dam. The rugged lava river gorge along the Idaho-Oregon border is being investigated as part of a project undertaken to determine the depth of gravel in the river channel. It will consist of drilling three test holes estimated 100 feet of overburden above an estimated 50 feet of post bedrock.

Not Yet Authorized
The dam, not yet authorized by congress will be the highest in the world constructed. It will be located about 104 miles north of Weiser.

Because the site of the operation is an inaccessible area for 6,000 foot deep canyon, the bureau of geology is soliciting prospective bidders to the dam site next Monday and Thursday. It can be reached only by pack trail.

Difficultly Predicted

Bureau officials said the drilling project would be a difficult operation because of the suddenness of the river and the number of bidders.

Plans call for the low bidder to dig a road down the side of the canyon to the dam site, anchoring the large lava pipe, driving a four-inch casing down the hole and filling with material and diamond drilling through the side of the canyon.

One test hole must be completed in 60 days and the other two in 120 days.

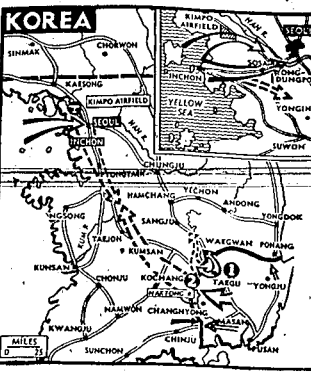

Farmer, Wife Display New Corn Developed Near Jerome

Field Corn Adapted to Magic Valley Is Developed by Jerome County Man

A field corn designed especially for the high altitudes and short growing season of Magic Valley has been developed on the C. H. Carlsdon farm west of the Jerome County town. The problem Carlsdon faced was to find a corn that had a larger ear, a deep kernel and early maturity. The early maturity problem was the greatest because, according to him, the corn which matures early in the Midwest sometimes will not mature at all in Idaho. The cold nights of the higher altitudes slow the growth considerably. But Carlsdon descended from an Iowa family and feels qualified to solve the local problem of growing wheat. When he moved to the Magic Valley area in 1903 he must have known that corn was a crop to work with because he brought with him some of his father's blue carriage corn from Ohio. The blue carriage has a deep kernel and a dark blue color. It is a good corn but takes too long to mature to be used in Idaho. So it was not until 1914 that Carlsdon had the nerve to plant some near Idaho Falls. He planted it in boxes inside the house. When the weather got warmer he transplanted it outside but still had to cover the young shoots on cold nights. The small crop took the entire season to mature and the farmer, discouraged, was disappointed.

In 1933 the family moved to Hellsden and Carlsdon planned soon once more, this time his first crossbred corn planned for early maturity. He crossed the blue carriage with corn from another short-eared, deep-kernel corn from New York. He had ordered several cold climate varieties from New York and picked out the best one, not bothering with the variety. The crop the first year "wasn't anything," but he held it for a year or two until it was big enough to plant the next year. Apparently part of the first year crop did not cross right and demonstrated this coming crop always taking from this crop he added yellow dent corn to the mix. This year he had 20 rows of kernels to the ear. This year he planted in the field and had the early crop of large-eared corn with deep kernels. After turning out the good crop of corn with his experiments, Carlsdon

is now growing his new variety for a few years and spent his time selecting the best kernels for the next crop. In 1941 he moved to Wendell and then to Hellsden. The next year, in 1941 he returned to Magic Valley and began farming west of the Jerome County club. In 1940 he again got interested in his corn experiments and planted several acres. However, he had no luck on the crop and wind damaged his yield to 80 bushes to the acre. Not discouraged, he picked the best 100 ears from the 1940 crop and used as seed for 1950. This year he planted four acres of the corn and turned out what he terms "lovely corn." The corn is deep yellow in color with a few of the blue carriage kernels mixed in. The ears are long and plump with deep and large kernels. Most of the ears carry from 20 to 35 rows of kernels. But best of all the corn is hardy and does not take a long growing season. Carlsdon planted his 1950 crop April 15 and it will be harvested in October. He has named the new variety Daniel Boone in honor of the Kentucky pioneer where his family first started growing corn. Another feature of the corn is that it looks like it will make excellent silage. With the ears ma-
