President Approves War Tax Boost Bill

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23 (AP)—The \$4,700,000,000 war tax bill, adding new and heavy obligations to individuals and corporations, became law late today with President Truman's signature. The measure cleared congress only yesterday, and Mr. Truman lost no time approving it. The administration was now billions promptly to help pay the cost of the Korean fighting and the general rearmament program, and to combat inflation.

NOW WE FEEL THE PINCH
The United States now finds itself in about the same predicament as the spendthrift who steals when the money he can beg-borrow or steal when the conditions are good...

THE PRESENT NATIONAL ADMINISTRATION, which is much more interested in spending money to socialize the country than to reduce the national debt, continued to operate on a deficit basis even after it became apparent that it was getting into international difficulties.

THE PEOPLE were encouraged to buy more and more savings bonds, and the government continued to spend more and more money on a lot of vote-getting socialist ideas. Then war broke out in Korea!

But now, in spite of all the "free" money that has been thrown around to give them, they're finding it increasingly difficult to make both ends meet. And the news that they're going to be called upon to pay the debt which their government has been piling up again.

"SOUL GRAPES" HALSEY
While attending the Idaho-Major League conference at Boise, Pocatello Mayor W. W. Halsey unburdened himself of a charge that sounds mighty like sour grapes. He has made it known for some time that he's opposed to the city manager form of government. In spite of the opposition, however, the voters of Pocatello selected a city manager plan at the polls last Tuesday. That, no doubt, prompted Mayor Halsey's charge that "propaganda is being used in which the city manager is being sold as the manager form of government."

HE WENT on to point out that "machine control" of a city through city management is "easy" and Idaho law. Boise's Mayor Howard joined in the chorus to the extent of expressing "fear" that under city management municipalities would lose the volunteer service of "many other outstanding citizens who now serve on various committees and commissions."

French Student, 20, Visits Twin Falls During Bicycle Tour of United States

He entered Idaho and spent his first night at Idaho Falls. Then he rode to Pocatello where he met two families of French ancestry and spent two days visiting them. He then rode to Boise and arrived in Twin Falls Saturday afternoon.

When he arrived in Twin Falls he was down to \$3.50 of the \$50 he had started with. His finances were straining him some weary because other funds were having trouble catching up with him. He has been writing an article every two weeks for a Montreal newspaper but the checks for these stories still are behind him. He also is sending articles to Paris newspapers but cannot receive pay for them until he returns home. Dollars cannot be sent out of France.

At Twin Falls he could look back on about 2,800 miles of highway over deserts, mountains and suburbs cities, farm lands and forests. Ahead of him remained more than 100 miles to his destination, San Francisco, the Pacific coast and the spot Franco thinks La Vendemie was headed for.

He has carried 30 pounds of equipment with him the entire way. He lights his load only by wearing light, cordless shoes. He has had two flat tires, got his legs scratched by a thistle bear in Yellowstone park, wrecked his bicycle once and had to have it rebuilt, and has slept in jails, hospitals, homes and along the streets.

His most novel experience was getting a traffic ticket for speeding in Wisconsin. With a downgraded license he was stopped. He was crowded to the side of the road by a police car and informed he was traveling 30 miles per hour in a 20-mile-per-hour zone. The \$5 fine was forgiven when the policeman discovered the cyclist was a student.

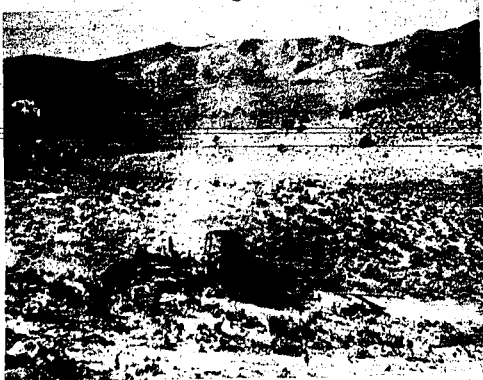

Experiments in Reseeding Range Being Conducted in Minidoka Forest Region

BULLEY, Sept. 22—Before the snow begins to fall in Minidoka national forest this year, Supervisor A. E. Briggs hopes his crew of workmen will have completed reseeded of 6,000 acres of forest land in the Brewer Dam-Pinch cattle allotment area southwest of Oakley.

The Brewer Dam-Pinch reseeded is one of several areas chosen for a long-range program by the U. S. forest service to help build up forage for grazing in the forests as well as provide a covering for the land to help prevent erosion, Briggs said.

"The reseeded program is definitely a long-range one and will entail a great deal of work and expenditure of money—but it will certainly pay dividends," Briggs said. "The cattle and sheep industry, so important to this part of Idaho, is being curtailed due to lack of forage in the hills on which livestock graze. Some 30 or 40 years ago, the oldtimers had no thought that in time there would be a shortage of grazing ranges, but today the industry and government are facing that problem."

The land chosen for this particular reseeded operation is rugged, hilly and sage-covered. With the help of heavy equipment, such as caterpillars, tread tractors, tractors and other machines, the ground is grubbed of sagebrush and other growth and prepared for the reseeded with crested wheat grass.

In the Cassin division of the Minidoka national forest, the land made available by overgrazing, fire, erosion and lack of controlled range management, will again provide the lush grazing forage it once had, Briggs believes. If the long-range program can be completed as planned.

On western rangeland, there are 90,000,000 acres of sagebrush land, with a large portion partly or wholly unproductive, government officials say. These are a challenge to the livestock industry which grows more forage, and it can be grown on millions of acres of sagebrush lands. The forage on 10 to 15 acres of this rough sagebrush land is required to graze one cow for one month, while it turned into grassland, one acre will graze one cow for one month.

Some of the land being reseeded in the forest is covered with heavy brush, while other land is bare and rocky. Different kinds of equipment are needed to complete the job because of the varied terrain, Briggs said. In rough areas, a wheel-and-pull, pulled by a caterpillar, is used to grub and kill the sagebrush, while it prepares a seed bed at the same time.

On the more open and extremely rough lands, a machine called a "disk drag" is used. This narrow disk is made in two sections. Its feet are about eight inches long and act similar to a regular harrow when pulled over the ground. It will penetrate the earth even though rocks are present and will not do too deep digging.

On the tractor which pulls the "disk drag" is a mechanical broadcaster operated by a small gas motor which broadcasts the crested wheat grass seed immediately in front of the harrow. The harrow thus prepares the ground for the seed and also assists in covering it after it has been broadcast. An extra man rides on the caterpillar and uses a hand-powered broadcast broadcaster to cover a portion of the area which would be missed by the mechanical broadcaster because of the irregular lay of the ground.

Also used to clear the sagebrush was a patrol pulling a double-section disk. When these areas are completed, a smaller tractor pulling a regular grain drill will seed the land. It is estimated about 100 acres per day can be prepared and seeded by this crew, Briggs said. It will take at least one growing season to observe the results.

Crested wheat grass has proved to be the most satisfactory grass for reseeding both forest and range lands, Briggs said. It is a native grass of the steppes of Siberia, and after much experimentation, it was found to meet qualifications necessary for growth here. It is drought-resistant, which meets the needs in this area where there is little moisture. It is hardy, long-lived and deep-rooted. When once established, crested wheat grass will not only increase the grazing capacity of the land, but will prevent erosion and to some extent retard fires that are always a menace to grazing lands.

Even with reseeded of range lands, it will be necessary to continue strict enforcement of range-management controls, Briggs said. With the cooperation of sheep and cattle men and the interest shown by people of the communities adjacent to these areas, officials feel that within the next few years rangelands will again be able to handle the stock industry as they did many years ago.

Cost of the reseeded operation is estimated at about \$2.25 per acre for seed, clearing and fencing. Experiments have shown that sheep showed 11 times more meat per acre was grown on the reseeded areas compared to the cattle grazed outside of the seeded lands. The experiments also show that the grazing capacity has increased seven times.

The reseeded lands are difficult to reach by ordinary cars, but tucked away in accessible grazing areas, they give a good lesson in a type of government project not often seen or appreciated by the average person. In the Almo park area southwest of Oakley, land which was reseeded almost three years ago and fenced off has grown up with smooth brome, timothy, orchard grass and mountain oats. This land will provide excellent grazing for years to come.

Already, the fight put up by the young plants against erosion of the soil can be noted in the Almo area. Overgrazing and other factors have caused serious soil erosion in parts of Cassin county. Reseeding of forest lands is proving a great help in fighting erosion, as well as providing grazing which will improve beef production as much as 15 times, according to the forest service.

Valley's Turkey Business Didn't Make Sense; Pair Figures Out Improvements

FILED, Sept. 23.—Their second year of raising turkeys, Gene Hull and his father, A. V. Hull, are working on a processing plant on the E. C. Moreland farm west of here. Moreland farm was of his. Moreland is the younger Hull's father-in-law and rents the Hulls a small tract and building.

The Hulls entered the turkey business for several reasons. A job opportunity was advised for the elder Hull who had worked inside many years and his son figured the way turkey production and distribution were changing just didn't make sense, "I felt he could improve."

Neither man had more than 200 day knowledge of the birds. At 27, Gene has spent four years in the army and taught at Piler two years, in addition to other jobs before the war and his college years at Albion, Provo, Utah, and Lubbock, Tex.

He had spent one and one-half years in the Pacific theater, flying what he calls the "fast fast, B-29 and P-51 fighter planes. His unit was one of the best in the world."

Meanwhile he was pondering the turkey business. What didn't make sense to him was Idaho turkey growers shipping their birds to Utah, Massachusetts and points in between, while Magic Valley markets shipped in birds from outside Idaho.

And he thought he could improve on the way birds were shipped. In frozen, with their heads and feet

still on, then thawed and drawn. He plans to sell fresh, open-drawn birds at Thanksgiving and frozen open-drawn birds at Christmas.

Last year the Hulls raised 400 birds and sold more than 3,000 in the Twin Falls area. Gene says he would have been able to market the rest except that his teaching prevented him from having the necessary time. That's why he has given up teaching.

"The Hulls found some sales trouble last year in resistance of small families to big birds. They hope to overcome that this year by suggesting other than customary roasting for the traditional holiday main course."

Gene and his wife, the former Shirley Ann Moreland, have been collecting and testing a variety of turkey recipes. They find that a small family can get four deliciously tasty meals from one bird without having to eat turkey for days on end, thanks to improved methods of preparing and keeping the bird.

"This is how it's done: First meal, thick stews cut crosswise through the breast from one-half of the bird; second meal, traditional meal, broiled drumsticks, sliced wings, and fourth meal, a thick chowder from the rest of the turkey."

Another thing Gene couldn't understand was a buyer's refusal to take a large portion of the 5,000 turkeys being raised and have them processed by a second com-

When Gene pointed out he could do the processing himself with a saving for the consumer, the buyer lost interest.

The Hulls are installing new equipment to handle their crop. Their plant will have an assembly line for killing, dressing, drawing, cooling and packing in plastic bags. They will hire six or seven persons when the season reaches its peak.

Despite memories of turkey prices that were as high as \$10 a pound in relation to other main foods, there is considerable expense to producing a turkey.

How would you like to go feet on 2,400 pounds of grain, 3,000 pounds of meal, 500 pounds of oats and 200 pounds of grit each day? How would you like pumping 1,000 gallons of water through 600 feet of garden hose every day?

Then there's the high initial cost of day-old pouls of which 20 per cent can be expected to die. Turkeys are cannibalistic and the Hulls have "stick" pens for the victims.

The pouls are placed in two brooder houses, 60 and 100 feet long, heated with a combination of gas and electricity. The brooder houses have sunporches.

Although the climate here is good

for turkeys, there are natural hazards which can cut deeply into a flock. Turkey disease, Gene says, are not far beyond the identification stage. Young turkeys can drown in a heavy rainstorm. "The Hulls maintain a 24-hour-a-day guard against predators, both four-legged and two-legged."

And much as he hates to admit it as a pilot, Gene says a low-flying plane can stampede the turkeys against a fence until the fence breaks and birds are trampled.
