TOKYO, (Friday) Sept. 29 (AP)—The red invaders of South Korea were fleeing heading north towards the 38th parallel today, their last resistance inside Seoul at an end and their entire army in imminent danger of annihilation. A U. S. 10th corps communique early today said the enemy from Seoul withdrew along roads leading north to Uijongbu. That is 12 miles north of the Korean capital and only 15 miles south of the 38th parallel boundary which the communists crossed in their surprise assault June 25. The communique, issued at 8 a.m. (11 a.m. Thursday, MPT), covered operations through midnight.

The trouble is inflation, says one in it already. Getting out of it will take some doing and some luck.

Everybody is talking about inflation here in Washington, but not about it being done about it.

Meat, eggs, fish, cheese, butter—bust—sit are up. Some heavy

### Defense Chief Warns Nation In Great Peril

CLEVELAND, Sept. 28 (AP)—Secretary of Defense George Marshall said last night the nation is going through a time of "great peril" and urged that the people be "ready to discount the possibility of atomic attack."

Speaking before a group of American Red Cross volunteers, Marshall announced that the Red Cross is going to take the lead in training as many as 200,000 Americans in first-aid technique.

He called for hundreds of thousands of Red Cross volunteers and declared that part of their task would be to build up motor and cancer services "in preparation for any sudden emergency which might require large-scale movements of people on short notice."

Volunteers who will aid in the Red Cross program, Marshall said, are essential in the case of shock and burns and are "the only known treatment for radiation sickness."

In another step, he said, the Red Cross will "greatly expand" its medical services to include as many as 100,000 women as nurses aides.

Addressing a meeting of Red Cross volunteers, Marshall said in a statement:

"We face a grueling period of hard work, self-denial, and sacrifice. I ask you to bear in mind that if the fighting in Korea should stop, the nation will still be in peril. The nation has been alerted and organized to defend itself, but must remain on the alert for some time to come."

### Production of Industry Hits Postwar High

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28 (AP)—The federal reserve board has reported that industrial production in August and July should go sharply ahead of last year's output of the nation's goods.

The board's report was based on the index of 207 principal items in the August average which was 108.7, up from 107.1 in July and 106.1 in June.

The board forecast that the September index would be 109.5, which would not only exceed anything since the war but also would be within 14 per cent of the historic peak of 247 reached in 1929.

The report added that not even the high levels of output in August and September had had any effect on wages and business and consumer demands.

As a result, it said, "additional short-run increases in prices are not expected." The report on production showed that output in August increased "dramatically" in all major groups of industries except primary metals.

Output of non-durable goods—textiles, paper and paper board and other items—rose to 124.3 per cent above the 1937-39 average.

### 11 Red Leaders Enter Appeal in U. S. High Court

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28 (AP)—Eleven communist leaders notified of conspiracy to advocate violent overthrow of the U. S. government have filed an appeal in the supreme court.

"This is an testimony in the record of this case," they appeal stated, "that during the entire period of the indictment any of the persons named or advocated that the government of the United States government be overthrown by violent means."

The 11 were indicted Oct. 14 after a prolonged and stormy trial before U. S. District Judge Harold R. Medina in New York. The U. S. circuit court in New York unanimously upheld the convictions on Aug. 1.

Justice Jackson of the supreme court last Monday ordered bail continued pending the high tribunal's first action on the appeal filed today. The justice department had asked that they be retained on the ground that freedom for them is a security risk.

### Small Kaiser Auto Goes on Display Here

The Henry J, new car made by the Kaiser-Frazer company, will go on display at Music Valley Mall on Friday afternoon.

The car is Kaiser's entry in the low price field and will sell for substantially less than the low-priced standard cars.

The Henry J is small-but is considered standard size in comparison to other Kaiser-Frazer "compact" cars. It has a 100-inch wheelbase and a tread of 45 inches. Its weight is 2,241 pounds and the car comes with either a four-cylinder, 58-horsepower engine or a six-cylinder, 80-horsepower engine.

The manufacturer claims to have kept the price down by cutting fluff. The only chrome on the car is found on the bumper, massive grill, hub-caps, hood ornament and windshield strip.

The body design of the car is based on aerodynamic curves with the standard-sized Kaiser's providing most of the streamlining.

Interior upholstery is something completely new in automobiles. The seats are woven wood or plastic trimmed with a "dragon-skin" plastic. Dragon-skin plastic panels upholster the doors. A feature of the seat upholstery is that the covering fits over the seat frame like seat covers and can be replaced at the cost of seat covers.

Another new feature in the car is the lack of a deck lid in the luggage compartment. Luggage is placed in the rear and over the back seat which folds down to make extra luggage space for trips.

At present the car is made only in a two-door model with a large, comfortable front seat and a smaller rear seat.

Concomitant to a great selling point to the car and the Henry J is reputed to operate at more than 20 miles to a gallon of gasoline. Rear fenders are bolted on to make replacement easy in case of collision.

### Swedish War Scare Caused By Broadcast

STOCKHOLM, Sept. 28 (AP)—A radio program based on war in Europe in 1812 frightened scores of listeners in Sweden on Wednesday night. The broadcast was interrupted by the announcer.
