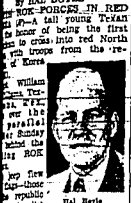

Medic Relates 2-Minute Test Of Alcoholism

NEW-YORK, Oct. 4 (AP)—A two-minute test to determine whether you are an "alcoholic" will appear in a new book by a physician.

The book, *Never Again*, listed 10 questions and said if the answer is "yes" to two or more, then you are probably an alcoholic.

Here are Dr. Teson's questions:

1. Do you crave alcohol at a definite time daily?
2. Do you drink in the morning?
3. Do you lose time?
4. Do you lose time from work due to drinking?
5. Is your drinking harming your family in any way?
6. Do you get the "inner shakes" unless you continue drinking?
7. Has drinking changed your personality?
8. Does drinking cause you bodily complaints?
9. Have your initiative and ambition decreased since drinking?
10. Do you get the "inner shakes" unless you continue drinking?

Dr. Teson believes chronic alcoholism is "not a habit or activity, but a disease."

He said that during the last 10 years the alcoholic problem has received an increased amount of attention, and that more and more people are becoming convinced that alcoholism is the problem of the doctor.

50,000,000 Drink

"It has been estimated that about 50,000,000 people in the United States partake of alcoholic beverages," he said. "Of these, it has been estimated that about 2,000,000 people drink to an extent which renders them liable to alcoholism as we understand it."

"It has been further estimated that there are in this country about 600,000 individuals who are considered chronic alcoholics."

In regard to the 10 questions, Dr. Teson said a person who believes he is an alcoholic should consult an Alcoholics Anonymous or the county medical society.

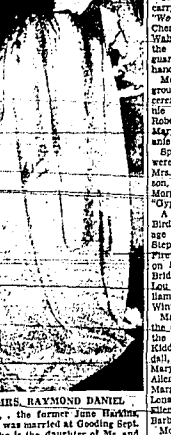

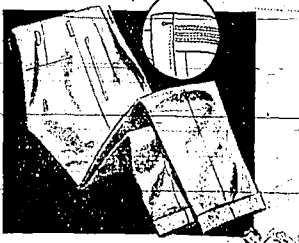

Delay of Reds Hints Lengthy Guerrilla War

The Korean communists are taking so long to reply to Gen. Douglas MacArthur's demand to lay down their arms never will end in the sense that they will sign a formal surrender.

That doesn't mean American troops will have to occupy Korea indefinitely, but it does mean the communists may take to the hills and conduct guerrilla operations for years while the South Korean army tries to root them out.

Communist tactics have a precedent for such strategy. Several years ago it appeared that the Ku-klux-klan had crushed the Chinese communists. The reds had been beaten in battle and had no alternative but to retreat.

They began the famous "long march" which carried them across some 6,000 miles and put them out of the reach of Chiang's troops. Then they hid their men until conditions were right and ultimately they won. Patience is a virtue that communists can cultivate when necessary.

Don't Follow Reds
Most nations admit when they are licked and send some high-ranking officers to arrange an armistice and make-for-peace terms. But the communists don't play that way. The odds of war must not be in their favor as witness the certified cases of atrocities committed against American and South Korean troops.

No in Russia likely to bring pressure on the Korean reds to end the war with a formal surrender. If she did that she would be signaling, in effect, the gave-the-signal to start the war and was in position to give the signal to end it. The official Russian position still is that the South Koreans attacked the North Koreans and now are conducting an aggressive operation against the 30th parallel.

Already
Sanctions already has accused the Korean red leaders as holding them responsible for their atrocities. According to precedents set after World War II, that means the leaders would be brought to trial before an international tribunal and, in extreme cases, hanged if found guilty.

For that reason it is going to be difficult to find a North Korean who will admit to being anything above the rank of corporal. Most prisoners claim the communists forced them to fight "for" Americans when all they wanted to do was stay home and tend their rice paddies.

Chinese Reds' Worries Over Life Clarified

HONO KONG, Oct. 4 (AP)—Why is Communist China apparently so worried about the possible loss of Korea? The answer is simple. Communist China is worried about the possible loss of Korea because it is a vital link in the chain of power to their vital Manchurian industries.

Presumably the Chinese red view is this: If all Korea is unified under the United Nations the all-important Yalu river power dams will pass into hands contrary to their interests. The fear of such a development could explain the many threats Chinese communists have made to intervene in the Korean war—threats which appeared efforts to discourage U. N. forces from driving into North Korea.

Red China's Premier Chou En-lai said Sunday in a speech observing the first anniversary of the communist government of China that his country will not "suspiciously tolerate seeing their neighbors being savagely invaded by imperialists."
