# Labor Board Deadlock on T-H Act Ends

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6 (AP)—The national labor relations board today has ended a three-year deadlock with its general counsel over the scope of the agency's operations under the Taft-Hartley act.

Seven clear-cut areas were staked out in which the board's general counsel told a news conference that George B. Lott, board's general counsel, concurred in the policy.

**End to Bickering**

That meant an end to the bickering which had taken place for three years—since the Taft-Hartley act became effective—between the five-man board and former general counsel Robert N. Denham, who was ousted by President Truman on Sept. 15.

Generally, Denham had initiated the board's authority to determine what cases it would handle because the law said any enterprise which affected interstate commerce fell within the board's jurisdiction. The board contended that it can decide what kind of cases affect interstate commerce.

**Seven Jurisdiction**

In today's statement the board said that because of the mobilization program, it would take jurisdiction of cases which affect interstate commerce in the following areas:

1. Any instrumentality or channel of interstate and foreign commerce, such as a radio station, whether part of a network or not.
2. All public utility and transit systems.

**Establishments Included**

3. Establishments which operate as parts of an interstate enterprise, such as a chain of stores, a national or interstate organization.

4. Enterprises producing or handling goods or services for interstate shipment valued at \$25,000 or more a year.

**Other Enterprises**

5. Any other enterprise which has:

- (a) A direct inflow from out of state of material valued at \$500,000 a year.
- (b) An indirect inflow of material valued at \$1,000,000 a year.
- (c) An annual inflow or outflow of goods which add up to at least 100 per cent of the amounts required points 4, 5, and 6.

# State Rushes Plans on Aid For Disabled

BOISE, Oct. 6 (AP)—The state department of public assistance today rushed plans to set up a program to provide monthly benefit checks to Idaho's totally and permanently disabled persons.

Bill Child, commissioner, said a plan was being developed for submission to the state's newly established public assistance board.

Atty.-Gen. Robert E. Boyle ruled yesterday in an opinion that the state department of public assistance had the authority to adopt rules and regulations governing such a plan.

**Security Act Amended**

Child said new amendments to the federal social security act recently passed by congress set up the program for the disabled.

"The government will provide to the state assistance on the same basis as for old-age assistance—three-fourths of the first \$20 payment and one-half of the balance up to a total payment of \$50.

Less Than 1,000 Cases

Child estimated the case load for this type of assistance will be somewhat less than 1,000 cases. He explained that the case load would be that large "with a few provisions must be set up to review the case load."

Child said he did not know how large the grant to the totally and permanently disabled will be. He explained that the grant would be determined by the state and periodically reviewed as new receiving assistance from counties.

**SEATTLE, Oct. 4**—A group of 100 Washington state medical men were told Thursday: "There is no specific drug available to combat radiation sickness after an atomic attack."  
 The speaker was Dr. John R. Hogness, chief resident of internal medicine at the University of Washington school of medicine, in a seminar of doctors and physicians, including 75 from British Columbia, who are studying aspects of the atomic bomb.  
 "The best treatment we have for radiation sickness is supporting measures," Dr. Hogness said. "They include hospitalization, administration of sedatives, good nursing care and possibly blood transfusion."  
 "At all times there is no wonder drug available in sufficient quantity to effect a cure-all of radiation sickness encountered after an atomic explosion."

**Connecticut's POP Looks to 1952 Election**  
 The Connecticut POP (People's Organization for Progress) is looking ahead to the 1952 election. The group, which has been active in the state since 1948, is planning to field a slate of candidates in the November election. The POP's platform includes the abolition of the income tax, the elimination of the sales tax, and the establishment of a public health service. The group also advocates the nationalization of the steel industry and the creation of a federal reserve bank for the state. The POP's candidates include Governor Raymond E. The group is currently working to build a strong base of support for its candidates and is planning a series of public meetings and rallies in the coming weeks.
