Assisting Hawley at the scene and in the investigation were Deputy Sheriff Floyd Stewart and State Patrolman Marvin Snyder. Solberg's body is at the Goodman mortuary in Rupert.

### Community Chest Board Functions All Year, Eliminates Unnecessary Drives

The Twin Falls Community Chest, which is an organization which functions 12 months of the year, for the purpose of providing funds for a single public fund drive each year, at the public fund drive each year, charitable and character-building. The idea of the Community Chest is to protect local citizens from "wildcat" drives and improper accounting for funds donated by the public. To fulfill its function, the Community Chest board, made up of representatives of the public, collects funds for community services. It then provides money to these services in accordance with needs and under proper accounting systems. The Community Chest board is governed by local by-laws. Each year in June the board has its annual meeting with the public invited to attend. At this meeting board representatives for the community are chosen and policies made. The board organization includes 12 members, one each for the six participating agencies and an equal number of representatives for the public. Present plans call for an amendment to the by-laws at the 1937 annual meeting to increase the board membership by adding one representative from each of 15 non-participating civic agencies. These representatives would attend meetings in an advisory capacity. Each year the board receives the budgets of the various participating agencies and turns these budgets over to the Community Chest budget committee. This committee is composed of two experienced members from non-participating agencies and three persons representing the community at large, all appointed by the chairman of the board. This committee is qualified to analyze carefully the budgets before they are submitted to the board for approval.
