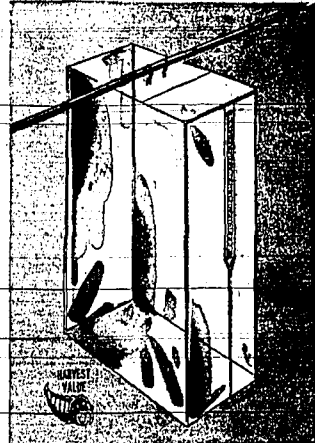

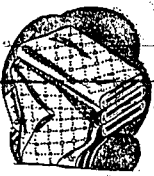

Cities Desire Air Link for West, South

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)—Representatives of a score of cities have told the civil aeronautics board that through airline connection is needed between the south and the west.

Six carriers have asked the board for an opportunity to establish that service. An examiner who heard testimony from these carriers presented recommendations to the board.

An alternative is an interchange of equipment between lines now serving the area. American Airlines and Delta Air Lines.

Many of the city spokesmen backed Eastern. Some played no favorites among the contestants. But all supported the idea of an east-west route through the south.

Earlier, John T. Lorch, attorney for United Air Lines, argued that the east-west traffic now traveling the southern route was developed by present airlines.

GOP Leader Scorns Trek To M'Arthur

BPOKANE, Oct. 12 (AP)—Chairman Guy Gabrielson of the Republican National committee charged last night that President Truman "doesn't know the score on the Korean war and has to ask General MacArthur what's going on."

"Did he ever know the score?" Gabrielson asked in a speech at a GOP rally in BPOKANE, Idaho, that the North Koreans were ready to go south for the summer.

"Ignored" Warning

"Since Mr. Truman didn't receive this information, or else he preferred to ignore it, he doesn't say, perhaps from his side of the pot, the bitter fact is better that he doesn't talk."

Gabrielson also scolded the President of "having inflation" by spending too many federal dollars for "waste-getting purposes."

Declaring that inflation is going down into debt at the rate of \$100,000,000 a year, Gabrielson said:

"There's nothing wrong taking an average of one day wages out of four have been raised 20 per cent, with even higher taxes promised. The public debt is climbing, and inflation is creeping up the higher wages and cheaper dollars."

Gabrielson said the American people "hadn't been in the credit administration in 1916 and they've had too much in 1950."

DETROIT, Oct. 12 (AP)—Regulation W has slammed the brakes on new and used automobile buying across the country, a United Press survey showed today.

New car dealers, especially in the medium and higher price fields, complained that sales have dropped 25 to 50 per cent since the one-third down, 21 months to pay credit curbs took effect three weeks ago.

Used Car Dealers Howl

Howling the loudest, however, are the nation's used car merchants, who almost unanimously report a nosedive in buying as sharp as 75 per cent.

"The used car market is dead," wailed one big New York dealer in second-hand vehicles.

Men who sell new cars costing over \$2,000 appeared just as unhappy. A Detroit Hudson dealer said the return of regulation W has driven most of his customers to cheaper cars—the Chevrolet, Ford and Plymouth.

High Payments Blamed

Many thought the high monthly payments required under regulation W were more important than the one-third down, which many previously required.

Locker Plants Handle 54 Tons of Big Game; Many More Animals Expected

If you need proof that big game hunting in Idaho is big business, just take a look in the cooling rooms at the Twin Falls frozen food locker establishment. You'll see a large part of nearly 54 tons of deer, moose, elk, and hunters still are bringing in meat to be frozen.

One concern reports it is doing the largest business in processing big game of any year since it opened. Another reports employees working nights to keep up with the rush and accommodate hunters coming in at late hours. A third suggests now is a good time to expect quick service on regular locker plant processing—there's just too much seasonal business.

Some of the concerns, despite the large size of their cooling rooms, are being forced to use the floor for storage space. It's the first time for one. Hooks from which the carcasses hang are now being loaded with as many as 100.

One locker plant operator, who has eyed many a carcass, says hunters this year were much luckier in location of their shots—heads and necks for most of the part—and there's little meat wasted. Another recalls one hunter whose shot resulted in only a four-pound roe being salvaged from a hind quarter.

He also noticed the animals are heavier this year. Last year he found deer averaging about 65 pounds. This year they're averaging closer to 80 pounds.

A Times-News survey of the five establishments showed these totals: Nearly 1,100 deer, about 64 elk, four moose and a couple of bear for a total of approximately 1,170.

"Atomic Calendar" Indicates U. S. Life 10,000 Years Ago

SCHENECTADY, N. Y., Oct. 12 (AP)—An "atomic calendar" indicates today that man first lived in North America 10,000 years ago, shortly after the glaciers receded.

The calendar, based on a study of radioactive carbon which can be dated, was prepared by a team of Chicago scientists and described at the autumn meeting of the National Academy of Sciences in session at General Electric's new research laboratory.

The study was by the University of Chicago, leader of the group preparing the master calendar, said it also showed:

The first known human beings on North America lived in Oregon and Nevada, and man did not live on the east coast until 5,000 years ago. In 4,000 B. C. Egypt had a staple industry and agricultural existence, by 3,000 B. C. it had its first dynasty. Mexico was inhabited at least 7,000 years ago. The famous pyramid of the sun near Mexico City was built about 300 B. C. The volcanic explosion which created Crater Lake, Ore., occurred 6,500 years ago.

These estimates are based on a study of radioactive carbon formed in the upper atmosphere by cosmic rays, which have what scientists call a "5,568-year half-life. This means the substance loses half its radioactivity in 5,568 years. After one 11,136-year period only one-fourth amount of radioactivity can be detected. Thus the atomic calendar

Secret Parley Will Not Have 'Secret' Topic

It will be a secret conference President Truman and Gen. Douglas MacArthur will hold in the Pacific this week.
How can they keep the Korean war from spreading into a World War?
The United States took a bold gamble when it went to the aid of the South Koreans. If the Chinese communists or the Russians had de- cided to send troops and planes into the fight, World War III would be going on now. Apparently we have won that gamble. But as vic- tory comes closer in Korea, other danger points exist. In the far east, even a slight miscalculation could result in war.
Responsibilities Differ
Mr. Truman, as chief executive of the nation, carries the responsibility of deciding issues of an in-

ternational political nature. MacArthur, as commander-in-chief of the United Nations forces in Japan and Korea, carries the responsibility of taking military decisions.
But the situation in the far east is so complicated that in some places the political and military blend and blur. Like Formosa, for instance, Mr. Truman has ordered the U. S. seventh fleet to protect Formosa against the threat of a communist invasion so long as the Korean war is on.
Attack Feasible
He did not say he would protect it forever, and it is possible that some day the seventh fleet will be withdrawn.
The communists will try to sail in from the mainland of China and crush Chiang Kai-shek and his na- tionalist army on the island.
MacArthur believes Formosa is vital to our far eastern defense line. He wants to hold it as military in- surance. But Mr. Truman has given evidence that he believes our con- tinued protection of Formosa could be a liability on the stage of inter- national politics.
His reasoning is that if we held onto Formosa the Chinese commu- nists would say, in an I-told-you-so tone of voice, that America was out to conquer all of Asia.

Unfairness of Price Boosts Draws Attack

CHICAGO, Oct. 12.—Murray K. Lincoln, president of the Cooperative League of the U.S.A., believes some businessmen are "making unfair advances" of the times by lacking up prices of war and consumer goods.

"I know that other American businessmen deplore this situation also, for they recognize with me that the 'win-if-at-all-possible' business is a small minority in our prepared population," he said in a prepared address at the biennial meeting of the league.

"However, they are a powerful group and ones who affect the real incomes of millions of our average consumers."

Some businessmen, he said, had "around four war orders for fear their competitors will get business away from them while they are busy on a government job."

Lincoln, who lives in Columbus, O., and is head of an insurance firm, said people around the world—"some of them with guns in their hands"—are seeking a greater share of the material resources to raise their standard of living.

State to Aid Cities' Water Fluorination

BOISE, Oct. 12 (AP)—The state public health department will aid Idaho cities in providing laboratory services and water analyses for fluorination of city water supplies.

Glare said water departments "may properly participate in a program of fluorination of public water supplies... in communities where the health department has developed sound procedures for the full approval of the local water supply for communal health."

Glare said the health department has available the services of its laboratory for preliminary and periodic water analyses and water and sanitary engineering who will cooperate with city engineers in installing needed equipment.

Living Standards Held at Top Level

BRISTON, Oct. 11 (AP)—The American standard of living has been related to its highest level in history during the Truman administration, Claude J. Burenshaw, Democratic candidate for the four-year term, said today.
