VICTORY IN KOREA

In mid-September the allied forces in Korea were pinned down in a final bridgehead in the Pusan corner. Two weeks later they were in command of the entire peninsula.

Not even the most optimistic Americans probably imagined that such a miscellaneous change in the Korean fortune was possible.

The key to the Korean situation was the supply lines to the south, and thus could be used to choke off the flow of men and materials to the North Koreans pressing against the Pusan bridgehead.

This was the problem in the final days of retreat.

The first clue that the story would be different came on Friday, Sept. 22. It was announced that troops of the Inchon-Seoul force had swept into Suwon 20 miles below Seoul, and at the same time that Pusan bridgehead forces had sprinted northward 200 miles from their old perimeter.

Now South Korea is free again and the only question is how far we shall go into North Korea.

General MacArthur, U. N. commander in Korea, merits the lavish praise poured on him by the President and the Pentagon for his bold and tactically superb leadership.

But no amount of leadership could have done the job without the remarkable cooperation of all the fighting forces involved.

Every American holds this achievement. Even the American public's eyes are turned to what they may expect wherever and whenever they seek to narrow further the area of world freedom.

MORE DOUBLE-TALK

The Russians, when they finally came up with an idea, broadcast to the world that U. N. forces had attacked in the Inchon-Seoul area to "save face" after humiliating defeats at North Korean hands.

There is a bit late with that notion. If any face-saving had to be done, our G.I.'s did it weeks ago by their brave fighting against tremendous odds of men and material.

At the moment, it would be more proper to inquire what the Russians are doing about saving face. With Seoul recaptured and U. N. forces slicing the enemy into bits, the North Koreans would seem to be in a rather unhappy position.

It will be interesting to see what verbal parlor tricks Moscow can resort to in order to make this sound like victory for their side.

AIRLIFT COST

The airlift from the United States to Korea has proved one thing to the Pentagon's satisfaction: It is one of the most costly operations in military history.
