Utah's Famed Governor Will Talk in T. F.

Gov. George H. W. Bush has been quoted as saying that he would like to visit Twin Falls.

Before he was elected governor, he was mayor of Pico, Utah. First elected in 1918, he won by two votes, "he took me 800 and took 20 days to prove those two good votes," he says.

He carried out his campaign of "no more government" administration.

As mayor, his principal achievement was elimination of property taxes for a period of three years, and in keeping the municipal government solvent by financing such public works as a school auditorium, park improvements and modernization of the water system.

Shortly after the election, one of the governor-elect's chief qualifications for the gubernatorial office was described as a "talent for comparing different political and economic theories."

This talent is being put to the test, since he faces a legislature and a public opinion that is demanding a program, he terms eliminating certain taxes back to the people. His estimate would knock \$1,843,000 out of the state budget approved by the legislature.

So when the Germans captured him the fourth time they decided to end the trouble he caused them. The firing squad rattled his stomach and lung and a mid officer, to make sure Cocks was dead, shot him through the back with a pistol. Bill Altra
But when villagers returned to the scene hours after the execution the American officer still was alive. The villagers nursed him and hid him from the Germans for 48 hours until allied troops entered the area. The long stretch in hospitals with 17 operations followed.
For his war service, Cocks shows the silver star, purple heart, shot three clusters, the bronze star with clusters, the French Croix-de-guerre and other medals. He was recommended for the distinguished service cross on the field of battle. He returned after the war as a major.
Joined in 1941
He entered military service in 1941 and is a graduate of the basic and the advanced officers course, Ft. Benning, Ga.; the command and staff school, Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas.
He served as rifle company commander, service company commander, battalion executive officer, battalion commander, assistant plans and training officer of the 1st division and had special duty with the third division. He rose from second lieutenant to major between March 21, 1942 and Nov. 8, 1945.
Joined Legion
Cocks became a Legionnaire immediately after his discharge from service in 1946 and has been post service officer at Dawson, Ga., since. His interest and energy in Legion community service, rehabilitation and national security led to his appointment to major between March 21, 1942 and Nov. 8, 1945.
Under his leadership the Georgia American Legion department won the Dan Rogers trophy awarded by the National American Legion commission each year for the largest increase in post-sponsored Junior business membership in the state. His strong advocacy of national security built on universal military training led to his appointment in 1928 as national security chairman of the American Legion. He held this position in 1937 and 1939 and traveled across the United States to address public meetings and national rallies on the importance for national security. He also appeared before congressional committees to urge military and other preparedness measures.
Favors Training
His interest in universal military training is based on his feeling that that proper training saved his life in combat. He claims that the survival insurance for American youth just as much as it is security insurance for the nation.

Recently he became assistant to the president of Delta Airlines. He also operates a 1,200-acre farm at Dawson and raises cattle.

HONG KONG, Oct. 15 (AP)—Last winter's famine in China proves the Chinese communists can keep a secret. Nobody knows its toll. But enough information has leaked through the bamboo curtain to show...

Comets Better Than Halley's Believed Near

NEW YORK, Oct. 15 (AP)—Dr. Fred L. Whipple, Harvard astronomer, believes the world may see comets far more spectacular than Halley's the comet which last appeared in 1910 and is destroying long lights out of a lot of people.

Whipple, who recently developed a theory of the makeup of a comet, told the National Academy of Science 100 billion comets are roaming around in the solar system now.

His studies show the nucleus of the average comet is about two miles in diameter and the larger ones, such as Halley's, go up to 10 miles in diameter.

Whipple said the comets move with the sun and undoubtedly come have been lost when they got too close to the sun or some star outside our solar system.

His new theory says ice, ammonia and methane are inside the head of a comet. The cosmic 'snowballs' reflect light from the sun and their tail is made up of gases and vapor caused by evaporation of the ice as the comet nears the sun.

Value of Jets Is Proved in Korean Fight

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (AP)—Gen. Floyd G. Vandenberg, leader of the South Korean campaign, clinched the case for jet air force.

Vandenberg, the first chief of staff, said combat experience shows jet fighters will take more punishment from either air or ground fire than piston engine fighters. This contrasts with previous fears that jet fighters would be more easily put out of action.

Many Advantages He said jets now can match piston engine planes in range and capacity to carry bombs, rockets and guns while far exceeding them in speed and climb. And jets are easier to maintain.

The boys feel better in jets. Vandenberg said about pilots who have fought in Korea, "they found the jets can take the gaff better than conventional types, and they can get out of hot spots in a hurry or go upstairs and fight if attacked."

Consolidates Views On a broad basis, the air force leader said Vandenberg consolidated our previous views—we know we have to have a plane that can fight its way through enemy air opposition and also do ground support work.

Beyond the fundamentals of jet fighter operations, the air force leader didn't learn a whole lot in South Korea because the one jet-type-in-service was not especially designed for ground support work and there were no enemy jets in the air.

Some Changes Due The North Korea phase will see some changes in operations because of the tremendous advantage of airplanes near the battle line, Vandenberg said. In South Korea, most fighters operated across the Japan sea. That was quite a handicap for the Lockheed F-80 Fighting Star until extra large wingtip fuel tanks were improvised.

Vandenberg said Gen. Douglas MacArthur had committed only half his available fighter aircraft to Korea at a time, rotating the units so that all got action.

U. S. Wants 'Good' Stenographer Aid

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15 (AP)—The government posted a "help wanted" sign for qualified stenographers today.

The civil service commission reported that a shortage of "good" stenographers, first felt before the end of World War II, has been growing more in the past few months because of increased needs of the defense department.

It said qualified girls are sure of jobs if they can meet civil service standards.

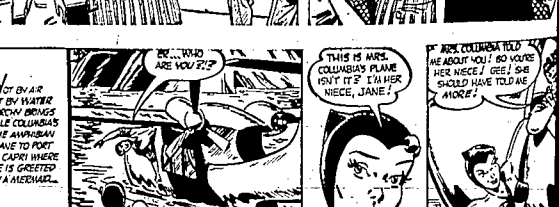
