

Boost Fire Threat, Hit Area With Frigid Blast

Winds, which brought a fire threat in the Twin Falls district, 14 miles north to Galena, Idaho, where many a Magic Valley resident awoke in a night and early Friday morning. A frigid blast reached 60 miles per hour at Burley, where reports said it was the noisiest wind in their recollection. A strong wind caused considerable damage in Salt Lake, Boise, Nampa and Caldwell, the Associated Press reported.

No serious damage was reported in Magic Valley but the wind played tricks with power and telephone lines, scattered remaining unthatched roofs, snapped a big tree to damage a parked car in Twin Falls.

At 10:30 p.m. Thursday, the wind was scattering sparks from the still smoldering fire ruins at the Idaho Organic Fertilizer company and the Northrup King and company seedhouse in Twin Falls.

Three firemen were dispatched to man broken left there in event of a fire break. The weather bureau was broken through Thursday in a windstorm, which was reported by assistant fire chief, said firemen had a hard time getting at the fire in the floor and roof.

At 1 a.m. Friday, a fire engine and an ambulance were dispatched to a dump where a wind-whipped fire was threatening the independent Pacific state of Washington. The fire was blowing itself out during a lull in the wind. A wind warning was issued by the National Weather Service at 3 a.m. and died down about 8 a.m. The Gooding CAA station reported that a wind-whipped fire was burning in Magic Valley, 15 miles down the highway, brought power interruption at 8:30 a.m. The wind was blowing from the west, and tangled up political banners in the business district.

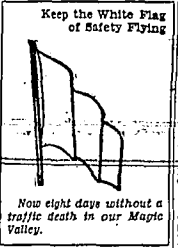

Magical Valley's long-awaited 1950 pheasant season opens on Saturday and a record number of hunters is expected to take to the field after a bag and possession limit of two roosters. It is illegal to shoot hen pheasants. Hunters in Magic Valley and southwestern Idaho will be enjoying the longest pheasant season in the state. The season will end Nov. 17. Cansas county is closed to all hunting.

Prospects for the opening day and the first three or four days of the season are good. The state fish and game commission reports the bird population is about the same as last year.

Increased Pressure

Increased hunting pressure is expected to make hunting tough after the first week of the season. Heavy bird populations have been seen in Lincoln, Twin Falls and parts of Jerome and Blaine counties. The department warned hunters that game and bird preserve and bird refuge and sanctuaries are closed to upland bird hunting unless specified in uniform bag and possession limit regulations.

Have Long Season

Hunting is open from noon Saturday to 11 p.m. in Twin Falls, Cassia, Blaine, Jerome, Lincoln, Gooding, Blaine, Elmore, Blaine, Carleton, Payette, Oneida, Cason, Ada and Owyhee counties.

Other Upland Birds

Emore county is open for quail, quail and mountain quail shooting from noon Saturday to 11 p.m. in Blaine, Jerome, Lincoln, Carleton and Blaine counties.

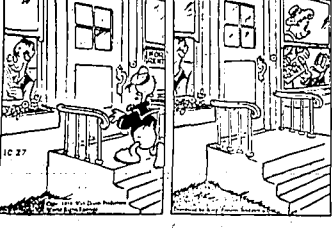

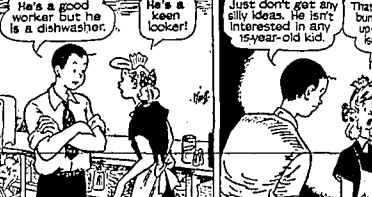
