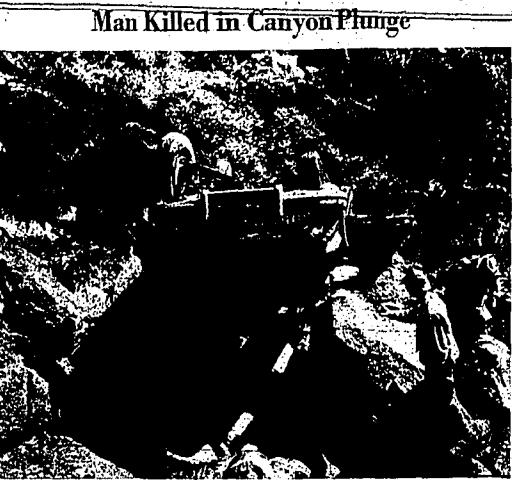

# TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

**WASHINGTON**—Solicitor-General Nathan Perlmutter has advised Attorney General E. A. Tamm of his challenge of a California court decision that certain civil rights provisions of the United Nations charter supersede state and national laws affecting the lives and properties of minority groups living in this country.

This particular provision of the United Nations charter provides that the civil rights of all persons are equal and that no one shall be subject to discrimination on the basis of race, sex, religion, or national origin.

The California court decision held that the United Nations charter is a treaty and that, under the terms of the treaty, it is the supreme law of the land. The court held that the California laws which discriminate against minority groups are therefore unconstitutional.

Many other commonwealths, especially in the south, are interested parties for fear that U. N. guarantees may be cited by superior courts to nullify state laws affecting the colored race. So, the attitude of the administration has become a matter of grave concern in legal and political circles.

**LIST**—The genocide treaty, incidentally, was recently ratified by the necessary number of 20 nations, and is now in effect as a body of international law, although not applicable to countries which have not yet approved.

### Meat Expert Demonstrates How to Fix Less Desirable Cuts for Use in Home

The continual demand for loin steaks, chops and roasts drives the price up and as a result they cost more for other cuts which do not sell so readily. V. E. Bigler, meat specialist for the National Livestock and Meat Board, told meat cutters and dealers Monday night at Legion hall.

Bigler emphasized the value of preparing meat in several ways so it is more attractive to the homemaker and easier to carve.

The early part of Bigler's talk and demonstration dealt with efficient operation of butcher shops and how the operator can figure out what to write on the market order.

Demonstrating butting techniques on beef, lamb and pork, the speaker pointed out that some cuts represent good buys because they lack demand. These include ham shank and butt, rib end and sirloin end of pork loin, lamb shanks, lamb breast and shoulders, beef skirt ribs, beef flank steak and beef heel.

However, these cuts contain just as much nutritive value as cuts in high demand, he continued.

Concerning the nutritive value of meat, Bigler said "studies revealed that meat is valuable in the diet of infants as young as 6 weeks old. Most research also has shown that meat supplies high quality protein and liberal amounts of minerals and vitamins. Liver has shown its value as a food high in protein, iron, phosphorus and vitamins A."

Bigler demonstrated several ways of cutting the less desirable portions so they would be more attractive to housewives—in the main they consisted of removing bone which

makes carving difficult and in trimming and cutting meat so that it can be used in different ways.

For the housewife he advised "low temperature" cooking meat—will do as much as any single factor in giving a tasty economical meal dish.

"Put on meat is one indication of quality and tends to a tasty, juicy meat dish," he continued. "Least meat will dry out unless it is cooked with moisture and will lack flavor contained in the latter product."

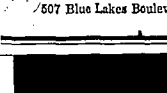

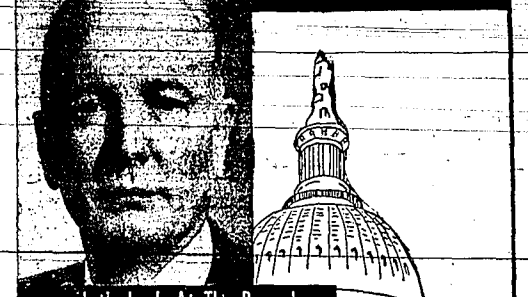

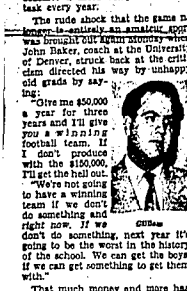

### Malik Given U. S. Lecture On Red Aims

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21—(AP)—A high American diplomatic official was reported Monday to have read to Joseph Malik a lecture—right out of the Red's own mouth—the Russian's own explanation of the incident occurred last Thursday night when John Foster Dulles, Republican foreign policy adviser to Secretary of State Acheson, talked with Soviet ambassador Malik at Dulles' New York home.

Representative Malik is Russia's representative on the United Nations security council.

Diplomatic officials here said that during their talk, Malik repeated the Russian line that the Soviet union wants only peace and happiness for everyone and is not stirring up communist revolutions throughout the world.

Dulles produced the book on the "Principles of Leninism" written by Soviet Premier Stalin himself, and read from it to show Russian purposes.

Trade Increase Discussed

Officials said Dulles and Malik also talked over the prospects of Russia increasing its trade with the United States.

They said Dulles assured Malik that Russia can buy from American companies without being charged exorbitant prices.

State department officials said Dulles' remarks in no way imply that the United States is willing to lift the present ban on shipments of strategic war materials to Russia.

Dulles and Malik were said to have talked for more than two hours, chiefly on the question of Japanese peace treaty.
