U. S. Divisions Speeded To Aid Faltering ROK's

TOKYO, (Thursday), Nov. 2 (AP)—Battle-weary American divisions took over from faltering South Korean troops in three sectors of Korea today as communist resistance ground and in the air boiled up menacingly.

The U. S. first marine, first cavalry and several infantry divisions charged into full-scale action against communist forces which had driven ahead in scattered parts of North Korea. Gen. Douglas MacArthur committed the American forces in Korea to the final push toward the Manchurian and Russian borders after the South Koreans, who had set the pace in most of the summer, lost ground to communist counterblows.

Flank Threatened

A sudden communist attack south of Seoul rolled back the U. S. 8th division, and it was the 9th division which had to be sent to the front. There an armored division of the U. S. 24th division fought within artillery range of the communist counterblows.

The 9th division, commanded by Col. Robert E. Quinn, had been in the northwest corner of the Korean peninsula since the fall of Seoul.

Proclamation Of Dogma Is 'Spectacular'

VATICAN CITY, Nov. 1 (AP)—Pope Pius XII formally proclaimed before one of the most spectacular assemblies in the Catholic church today the dogma that Mary, mother of Jesus, went to heaven in body as well as in soul.

The dogma added to the church doctrine was in 1870. The pronouncement, contained in a long papal bull, was read from a temporary throne before the ornate doors of St. Peter's basilica.

The dogma was read to a throng of holy year pilgrims and Romans said by Vatican historians that it was the greatest religious event in the church since the crowning act of the 1925 jubilee.

Loudspeakers and radio carried the Pope's Latin words to the corners of the world. They also picked up the cheering and tolling of bells from Rome's nearly 500 churches.

Massed close about the temporary throne were the 150 members of the 15 living cardinal, 100 bishops and 500 priests.

Well up in front, also, were the representatives of 150 nations with which the Vatican maintains diplomatic relations.

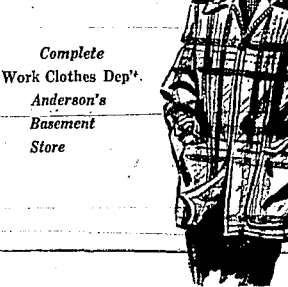

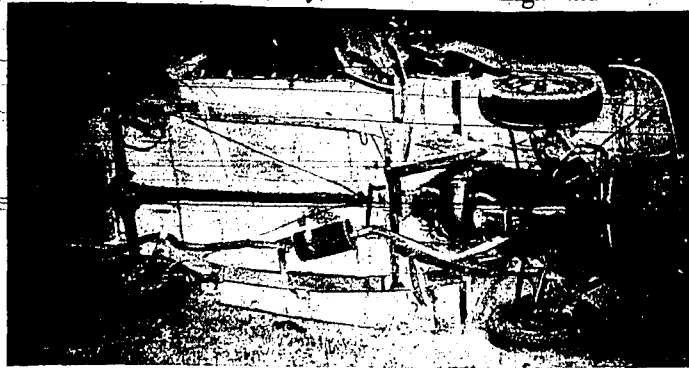

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (AP)—American officials are not surprised at the appearance of Chinese communist troops in the Korean war, still do not expect an open, large scale intervention against United Nations forces.

1. ROM CHINA's determination to protect the huge Babo-Bupung power dam on the Yalu river, which supplies electricity for Manchurian points as distant as Harbin and the Russian naval base at Port Arthur.

2. An apparently determined policy to keep Korea from working out its own peace, by delaying United Nations efforts to pacify, unify and rebuild the peninsula.

Most of the Yalu power installations, toward which American troops are on the march, are on the right bank of the river. But several of the big dams are anchored on the Korean side.

This series of power plants, originally built by the Japanese when they controlled both Manchuria and Korea, is the biggest power producer in North Korea so far as is known here.

Some American officials consider the Chinese reds expect to reap propaganda dividends from their massive appearance in the Korean war. A Chinese propaganda machine could easily twist any clashes between their small units and American troops into charges that western imperialism is assaulting the native defenders of Asia.

The Chinese also can keep alive their political and military ties with remnants of the red Korean army and its leaders. Such ties could be the future of the bulk of the United Nations forces are withdrawn from Korea.

Polio Strikes Most People, Checks Show

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 1 (AP)—Nearly every child has had some form of infantile paralysis at one time or another. That's the conclusion of two surveys made in Chicago and Baltimore by public health specialists and reported to the American Public Health association meeting here.

Big city folks have polio more than rural dwellers in fact, the surveys showed. In the time shown, 40 years old, most city residents are virtually immune to all types of the virus infection.

The two independent studies were made under the direction of Dr. Herman N. Bundeon, head of the Chicago board of health, and Dr. Thomas H. Turner of Johns Hopkins university, Baltimore.

Bundeon reported on the findings of a check financed by the "March of Dimes" and begun in 1945. It

showed that from three to four per cent of Chicago's population become infected each year. It also found that the ratio of the number of reported cases to the number of people actually infected exceeds 1 to 100.

Most of all those who came in contact with a polio case in its infectious period—four days before and four days after the onset of the disease—became infected, Bundeon said. But the extent of the quantity of virus found in all cases results in a comparable degree of immunity.

Catholic Dogma Proclamation Confirms 1500-Year-Old Belief

VATICAN CITY, Nov. 1 (AP)—The assumption of the Virgin Mary to heaven has been a belief in the Roman Catholic church for at least 1,500 years.

It has been the teaching of the church that at the moment of the virgin, her body was preserved from corruption and that shortly afterwards it was "assumed" into heaven and reunited to her soul. (The word "assumed" comes from Latin "sumere" which means "to take.")

This belief has not been an article of faith until today, when the proclamation of this belief as dogma was made.

Nevertheless, Pope Benedict XIV, who reigned from 1740 to 1758, had declared the belief to be "a probable opinion," the denial of which would be "impious and blasphemous."

The feast of the assumption has been celebrated throughout the church on Aug. 15, as a holy day of obligation. No direct reference to the bodily assumption of Mary ever was made in the office of the feast itself, but it has been a subject of explicit belief at least since 161, when St. Justin of Jerusalem declared the belief at the council of Chalcedon and the feast was celebrated in that century. Writers of the same period refer to the belief.

It is a matter of dispute, however, as to exactly when and where the belief. Her burial place is generally believed to have been at Ephesus or Jerusalem. But her tomb in the latter city is not mentioned in ancient writings before the beginning of the fifth century.

The feast of the assumption has been and is now dogmatically confirmed as the principal one of all feasts in honor of Mary.

"DOGMA" DEFINED
VATICAN CITY, Nov. 1 (AP)—Catholic church, is defined as "A truth contained in the word of God, written or unwritten (scripture or tradition), and proposed by the church for universal belief."

All Catholics must believe in a dogma under pain of sin.

Cuts Planned For Usage of Three Metals

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (AP)—Cuts of 20 to 30 per cent in the civilian use of copper, nickel, and aluminum probably will be ordered within the next 10 days, officials here said.

This was the word from an official of the national production authority.

Last week the NPA told manufacturers of radio and television sets, washing machines, refrigerators and other appliances to conserve metal for use in the production of tanks, aircraft, and other war equipment.

More Than 'Tentative'

Today the plan is a bit more than "tentative," and Dec. 1 is said to have been almost positively chosen as the effective date.

Two other questions are less definite.

1. What will be the "base period" for calculating the reductions?

The NPA official, who asked not to be quoted by name, said it probably will be either the 12 months ended last June 30 or the first nine months of this year (ended Sept. 30). The percentage cuts will be based on the average production of the base period rather than on current output.

Percentage Questioned

2. What will be the exact percentage of curtailment for each metal?

The official said the percentage may vary among the three metals, though it will be around 20 to 30 per cent on each. Military orders, of course, will not be counted in applying the cuts to a manufacturer.

Also uncertain is how much effect the new controls will have on the manufacture of civilian goods containing copper, nickel and aluminum—drivetrain sets, refrigerators, auto radios, bicycles and thousands of others.

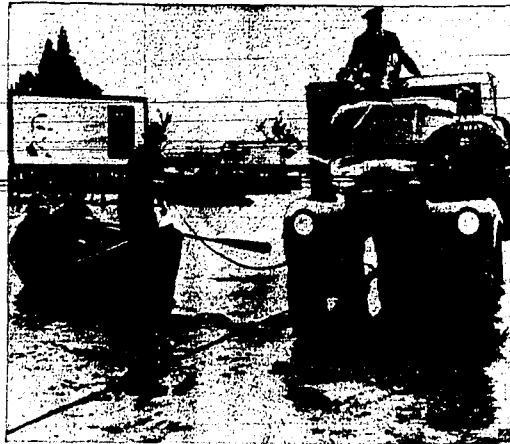

This money, he said, will be allocated on the basis of the number of Indians in average daily attendance, and the need of various school districts in which Indian children are enrolled.

Jones said there are 14 schools with Indian children in attendance. He said there are a total of 150 Indian children attending Idaho public schools.
