At the same time India's Socialist party leader urged that the United States and Britain should join in a pact to defend the future of the priest-ridden country often referred to as "the roof of the world."

China's Communist party newspaper, Pravda, published a dispatch from a correspondent in Lhasa, capital of Tibet, which advised that the Chinese government had ordered the capture of the capital. The Red Chinese are driving a wedge between Britain and the United States.

Probe Shows No Arson for Three Blazes

Bright Flash Raises Query In East U. S.

Residents of the northeastern United States and eastern Canada speculated today whether a gigantic meteorite or a royal Canadian air force rocket crashed in the Adirondack forest which lit up last night's sky like day.

Newspapers and radio stations in a 10,000 square mile area extending from New York to Ottawa, Ont., received thousands of telephone calls from persons who were frightened by the blue-green fireball which streaked across the heavens at 7:33 p. m. EST as brightly as a photo-flash and faded away in a ray of light.

Astronomers said the illumination apparently was an unusually large meteor, occurring through the earth's atmosphere. But a Colonial Airlines official in Syracuse, N. Y., said the U. S. air force had advised the company that the glare was caused by an RCAP rocket launched at the Rockville, Md., base. RCAP officials categorically denied the report.

The Harvard university observatory said the flash was a "rare but not extraordinary meteoric phenomenon" caused by the disintegration of a sun or stony mass in atmospheric gases. Officials at the observatory said there was no evidence that the meteor had struck the earth.

3 States Face Possible '51 Water Crisis

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 (AP)—Parts of Arizona, New Mexico and Oregon face possible irrigation water shortages next year, the reclamation bureau said Thursday.

For this year, however, farmers on federal reclamation projects generally are completing a bumper season, Reclamation Commissioner Michael W. Stratus said in a report to secretary of the interior Chas. E. Wilson.

As of Sept. 30, the close of the water year, all reclamation areas are in good shape and it appears reclamation farmers will have fifth \$500,000,000 crop year in a row, Stratus said.

Big Reservoir Drops

"Lake Mead, the world's largest artificial storage reservoir, shows a decline in storage of more than 1,000,000 acre-feet," Stratus said.

Lake Mead, in Arizona and Nevada, has a normal active storage capacity of 2,700,000 acre-feet. It contained 19,761,000 acre-feet Sept. 30, Stratus said.

On the Vale project in Oregon, he said, the agency and Warm Springs reservoir, with an active storage capacity of 20,000 acre-feet, "are down to the lower level of the outlet gates with no usable holdover storage."

Development Needed

"These shortages, spotty as they are, all point to the necessity of pushing forward with integrated water resources development in order that water not required for irrigation may be stored for years of need," Stratus said.

His report on the water situation by regions included:

1. The Columbia river watershed. More water in storage than last year on most projects. Except for the Vale, Ore. project, there has been abundant water to irrigate crops.
2. Upper Colorado river basin and other parts of Utah and Nevada. Satisfactory carry-over except on the Uncompahgre project in Colorado.—The Strawberry reservoir in Utah is at the highest level in 20 years.

Stores Accused of Unfair Labor Acts

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 3 (AP)—The AFL meat cutters and butchers union Thursday filed charges of unfair labor practices against Salt Lake City, Utah, Safeway stores.

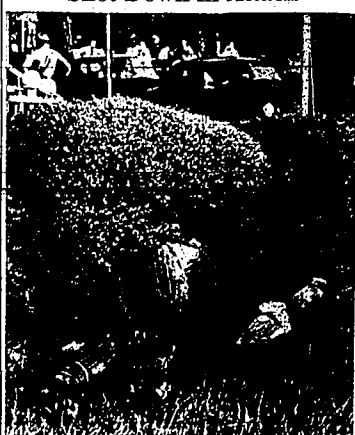
The Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butchers' union, 1000 North America, local 537, Salt Lake City, charged that Safeway Stores Inc., which operates 16 stores in Salt Lake, discharged 16 union employees on Oct. 1 "without any just cause."

The charges were filed with the national labor relations board by Ray Burdick, Salt Lake City business agent for the union.

The union charged that Safeway stores discriminated against the discharged employees "in regard to their terms of employment, to discourage membership" of the employees in the union.

The union said that Safeway's action "is a violation of the national labor relations board's bargaining agreement" was being negotiated between the two. The previous agreement terminated Oct. 31.

Utah Plant to Be Test Ground for Toxic War Agents

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 (AP)—The chemical warfare plant which the army plans to start building this year at Dugway, Utah, will be the only field test, proving ground for research-war agents.

The army announced it proposes to spend \$8,025,150 on the plant, which is to be located 20 miles

southwest of Salt Lake City.

Tests are to be made of the use of toxic agents for both offense and defense in radiological, biological and chemical warfare.

The building program outlined to the house appropriations committee earlier this year listed laboratories and operations building, warehouse and utilities building, as air strip and operation building, HQ barracks and dormitory, outside utilities and roads.

An army engineer officer told the appropriations committee it is expected the plant can be completed in 18 months to two years.
