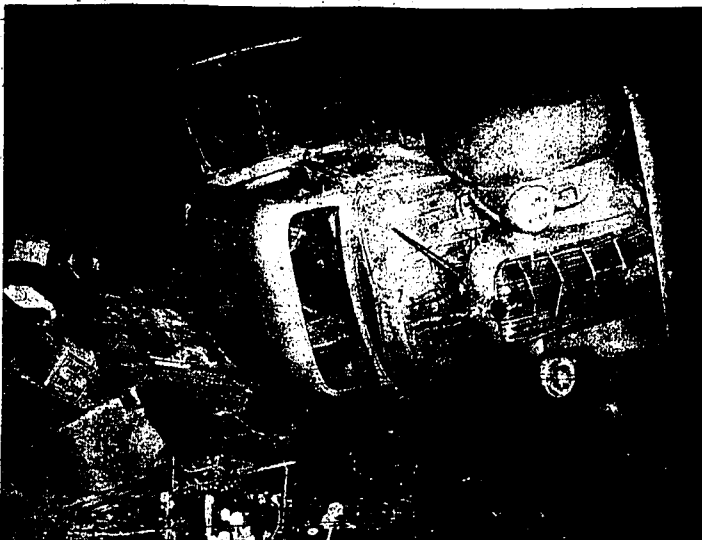

# U. N. Forces Gain; Some Red Troops Fade Mysteriously

SEOUL, Nov. 7 (AP)—United Nations forces expanded their slim bridgehead north of the Chongchon river today as some communists mysteriously withdrew on the northwest Korean waterfront.

Two U. S. 24th division regiments and the British Commonwealth brigade moved ahead two and one-fourth miles after a heavy air bombing in the Pakchon area north of the bridgehead at Anju. Mopla was slight on this front although red concentrations had applied heavy pressure as late as Monday.

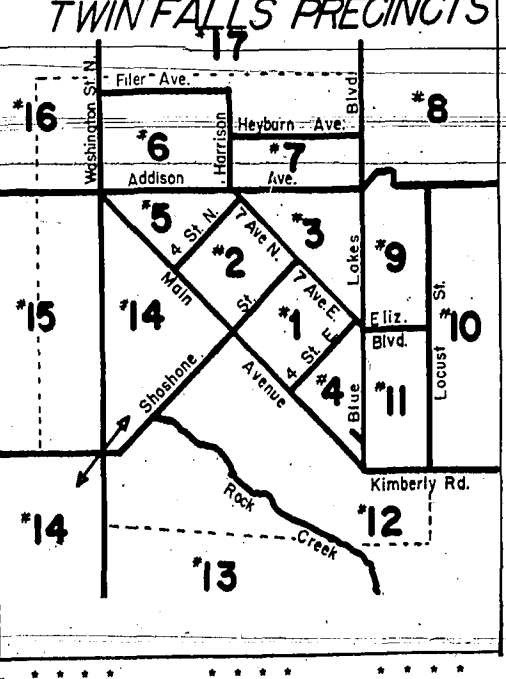

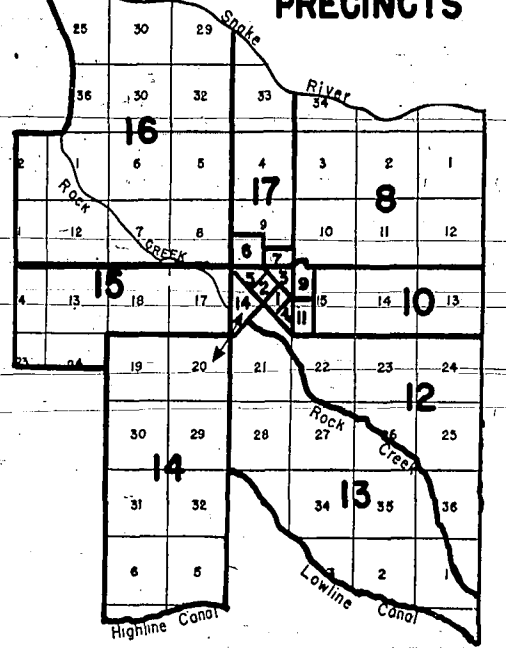

# 84 Aspirants Seek 32 Top State Offices

This is a day of decisions for 84 candidates for 32 governorships, Pennsylvania, New Hampshire, Kansas, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, New York, Colorado, Connecticut and Oklahoma, three each. As a practical matter, the race in each state holds down to the Democrat and Republican.

In 19 states, including Idaho, only a Democrat and Republican are in the race. In six states, including California and Tennessee, Democratic candidates are unopposed.

There now are 25 Democrats and 10 Republicans for the two year term, the Democrats needs a net 12.

This year, 12 Democratic and 18 Republican nominees are in the race and the race is still in the advance they will make many gains on the Republican side. It is expected that the Republican side will be responsible for a number of the gains.

The Republicans contend to the Democratic the southern states of Alabama, Tennessee and Texas, along with New Zealand's Rhode Island. These four, coupled with the three states in which Democrats are the majority, reduce to 10 the number of states where the GOP hopes to pick up 11 seats.

**Demos Write Off**  
A national Democratic spokesman has written off Kansas, Minnesota, and Wisconsin as being lost to the Democrats. Vermont and Wisconsin were considered to be in the number of states where the Democrats hope for all or part of the gain.

The major battles in the 18 disputed states shak up in Idaho, New York, California, Tennessee, Ohio, Michigan, Connecticut, Maryland, Oklahoma and Massachusetts. Many of these states will be won by the Republican governor last Sept. 11.

**Crops Set Mark For State School**  
ST. ANTHONY, Nov. 7 (AP)—Farmers at the Idaho state industrial training school has produced record crops for the school this year, according to reports from the school.

Nearly seven of wheat produced 13,820 bushels of grain while one bushel of oats were harvested from 34 acres.

Wheat was the second most profitable crop for the school, with 100 bushels of grain from 100 acres. The school also produced 2,500 bushels of corn from 100 acres.

**Arkansas Young On Liquor's Ban**  
LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Nov. 6 (AP)—Arkansas voters will decide today whether to lift the ban on liquor.

The state has been the first to prohibit the sale of liquor since its ratification of the constitution in 1901.

Some 210,000 voters registered to vote on the proposition today. The vote will be held in 15 counties, which were visited by intensive propaganda drives.

The prohibition issue was inspired by the Arkansas United Youth, which has succeeded already for locally strong up half the state through local option elections.

### Large Crowd Views Opera By Television

NEW YORK, Nov. 7 (AP)—The Metropolitan opera played to the largest audience in opening night history Monday night—but most of the viewers at home, watching the curtain go up via television.

The performance, Verdi's Don Carlo, was televised on the American Broadcasting company's network—expanded since the opera was televised for the first time last year.

Money flows into the box office just the same. Under a new arrangement, members of the first night audience had to buy tickets for three operas to get into the first one of the 1950-51 season. They will use their other tickets later.

The opening night's receipts under the package arrangement totaled more than \$100,000—or about \$20,000 more—when divided three ways and the taxes extracted.

In previous years, opening night receipts were \$15,000.

**New Setup Used**  
The new package arrangement provided three tickets for \$50. About twice as many such an arrangement would have cost last year when single tickets were about \$10.

The crowd of gaping sidewalk on-lookers—police estimated it at about 3,000—saw a glittering and glamorous parade heavily laced with society figures, show people and the stars of the world.

Mary Garden, who made her operatic debut 50 years ago, was there—the first time she ever attended an opening, she said.

Among the singers in the audience were Gene Raymond, Gladys Swarthout and Hilda Stevens.

Such traditional society leaders and Mrs. Marville Dresselhaus, Mrs. George Washington Kavanaugh and Mrs. Betty Henderson represented the four hundred diamond, emeralds, milk or garnet and with top-hatted escorts.

### Allies Lay Plans To Slow Material Flow to Red Bloc

LONDON, Nov. 7 (AP)—American, British and French negotiators have laid down new arrangements for slowing the flow of strategic goods and materials to Russia and her friends.

Informal sources reported today that the newly-reached agreement of top secret talks in London—stemming from a decision of the big three foreign ministers last week—will be September to try to plug all holes through which military valuable goods are leaking.

Whole objective of the new policy is to extend all the shipment of certain defined classes of manufactured goods and raw materials to the red bloc of Europe and Asia without imposing a total economic blockade.

### Spectacular Fire Blamed on Youth

BROOKLINE, Nov. 7 (AP)—Safety Commissioner Carl Caswell said yesterday police and firemen now believe an 11-year-old boy set the spectacular \$200,000 McAllister warehouse fire here September 11.

Caswell said the youth, now in the state school for boys at Chelsea on another charge, has admitted being in the building "just before the fire was discovered by police on any connection with it.

The 11-year-old boy said the boy was in the building "cutting marshmallows" at 5 p. m. At 5:20 an automatic alarm went off, indicating someone had entered or left the building. A few minutes later firemen were called.

### AEC Given More Priority Powers

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7 (AP)—The national production authority today gave the atomic energy commission more priority powers.

The effect is to permit the use of "DO" (defense order) priority ratings in the construction and operation of plants that serve the atomic energy commission but are not owned or operated by that agency.

A "DO" rating requires contractors and subcontractors to put an order ahead of orders that don't have this rating.

### Writer Asserts Education of People Can Cut Atom Deaths

SEATTLE, Nov. 7 (AP)—Atomic bomb casualties can be cut by more than 50 per cent if civilians know what to do, Howard Blakeslee, science editor of the Associated Press, said in an address here Monday.

Blakeslee, talking to Associated Press members of Oregon and Washington, urged that school children be taught about atomic energy, including what can be done in case of bomb attack. He said children can understand better than their parents because they don't have so many prejudices.

He urged that defenses against atomic attack be set up immediately. Blakeslee said there soon would be thousands of atomic bombs available, and he is afraid they will be used.

### Marines Are Set For Winter War

### 9 Key States May Indicate Ballot Trend

If there is a Republican trend today there is a good chance it will show up in nine of the 11 states where the GOP won Democratic senate seats in the 1948 election.

President Truman turned back the 1948 GOP tide by capturing the electoral vote in seven of the nine in 1948—Idaho, Massachusetts, Missouri, Nevada, Ohio, Utah and Washington. The other two—New York and Pennsylvania—went Republican in the President race two years ago.

All nine states today hold electoral or gubernatorial elections, or both.

Should the trend break the off-year tradition and keep the Democrats grooving, the state watch for indications are California, Connecticut, Illinois, Wisconsin, some of the above-mentioned, particularly Massachusetts.

In Connecticut, which elects senators and a governor, and Massachusetts, choosing a governor, publishers have won every state election in non-presidential years since 1924.

Speculated Democrats in California outnumber Republicans there, but Republicans have won but one gubernatorial election since 1958.

### Woman 'Dead' 4-11 Minutes Regains Life

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7 (AP)—Columbia hospital has reported the case of a woman who apparently died but came back to life. Mal-Oen Albert W. Kenner, superintendent, said the time period during which the woman showed no signs of life has not been determined exactly, but that it was from 4 to 11 minutes. It is probably the longest such period in modern history, he said.

More than a dozen people, including six doctors, were present. From their reports the hospital is attempting to determine accurately how long the signs of life were absent.

Relates Story  
Kenner gave this account: The woman, 31, Negro, came to the hospital last week for the birth of a baby. She showed symptoms of eclampsia, which in severe cases may result in convulsions and death.

When the woman failed to give birth in a normal manner in 35 hours, the doctors decided it was necessary to deliver the baby by cesarean operation. A spinal anesthetic was injected. A short time later all signs of life, including pulse, disappeared.

A heart stimulant and artificial respiration were administered but apparently had no effect.

Operation Performed  
The doctors then performed what they considered a post-mortem operation, removing the child.

After the baby had been removed, signs of life appeared in the mother. In a short time she had a good pulse and other evidence of recovery.

"But the doctors agreed that for a time she was as dead as she ever will be," Kenner said. "There were no heart sounds and there was no breathing."

Kenner said the whole period in which the incident occurred was about 15 minutes but nobody in the room was positive how long the patient actually was without signs of life.

### East Reich Zone Plans to Use TV

BERLIN, Nov. 7 (AP)—The Russian zone government was reported today building a dirt cheap television set to pipe communist radio into millions of German homes.

A West Berlin film and radio agency said the communist regime would be ready to deliver television sets, "The Life" in 1952 and at a price of 600 east marks (\$225).

At this price, the industry officials would have to be subsidized by the state.

Reports this industry was considering releasing him to prevent his death behind bars.

### Burma Court Cuts Charges On Seagrave

HANOON, Burma, Nov. 7 (AP)—American Dr. Gordon B. Seagrave, who became famous as the "Burma surgeon," escaped a possible death penalty Monday when treason charges against him were reduced by a special tribunal.

The court, as the prosecution wound up its case, altered the high treason charges against the 53-year-old doctor, eliminating the count which carried the death penalty and giving him the opportunity to refute three newly phrased charges which subject him to possible banishment for life or a prison sentence of up to 10 years.

Seagrave, who for a quarter of a century fought disease and trained doctors and nurses in Burma, was arrested Aug. 15 at his Burma military hospital and charged with high treason, abetment of treason and failure to report rebellion, by Karen tribesmen against the government.

The three-man tribunal today accepted these amended charges against him: 1. That he provided comfort to government enemies by entertaining at his the Kachin rebel chief Naw Seng, a former Burma army captain who deserted.

2. That he gave the rebels free access to the grounds of his hospital in the isolated China-Burma border town of Mamban, allowed the rebels to take up positions from which to fire on advancing government troops, and that he wrote threatening letters to prevent his nurses betraying his rebel sympathies.

3. That he gave the rebels medical supplies during their second occupation of Mamban in December, 1949.

Called to the stand, Seagrave pleaded guilty to each count in a firm, clear voice. The tribunal will set a date tomorrow for resumption of the trial and Seagrave's defense.

### Fire Razes Costly Merry-Go-Round

DALLAS, Nov. 7 (AP)—On the merry-go-round burned down—at state fair park Monday.

And it was the only one of its kind in the world, said co-owner R. J. Slinnett. He said \$50,000 worth of cover its loss.

Slinnett said it was the last of three original hand-carved merry-go-rounds.

One burned in Santa Monica, Calif., several years ago. The other went down aboard a sinking ship on its way to England.

As it had for most of its life—the merry-go-round played out before a near-capacity audience.

Thousands of children and grown-ups who had ridden the horses watched them burn.

After it was over, Janet Locke, 6, walked up to fireman G. G. Edwards, lacking the ice cream off her fingers, she asked wistfully, "Mr. Fireman, did all the horses burn?" They did.

### Man Acts as Own Lawyer, Gets Divorce

RENO, Nev., Nov. 7 (AP)—A Brooklyn, N. Y.,ologist found a way of beating initiation Monday—much to the consternation of Reno divorce lawyers.

Jack Fabricant, 24, went into court, told the judge he was his own attorney and got a divorce from Joyce Fabricant, Chicago.

"It was just that simple—and the time in the memory of recent divorce-seekers—has tried it here.

Paid Attorney  
Fabricant said he paid a New York attorney \$100 as a retaining fee and was recommended to an attorney in Nevada. He said he was under the impression the \$100 would cover lawyer's fees in the divorce action and that he had no more money.

So Fabricant went through old divorce files in the county clerk's office, learning the proper legal forms to prepare a complaint, appearance and waiver, findings of fact and conclusions of law.

The Washoe County Bar association recommends that lawyers charge \$50 for this service. But as one attorney put it, "That's the kind of fee you dream about any more in routine cases."

Reno divorce lawyers have fallen off considerably since its postwar record boom.

Take Dim View  
Reno has more than 100 divorce attorneys, and several attorneys took a dim view of Fabricant's activities.

One protested to reporters, "Surely you're not going to broadcast this to the world."

Others figured maybe they had the last laugh when Fabricant went back to court later in the day and told the judge he had forgotten to ask that his wife's maiden name be restored.

Just as A. J. Mastrelli told him that was too bad, "You are the lawyer in this case," said the judge. Mrs. Fabricant said she has her married name.
