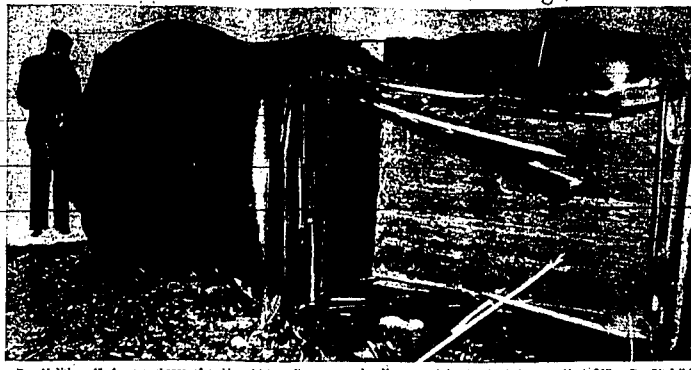
Rede Monarch Joins Ancestors

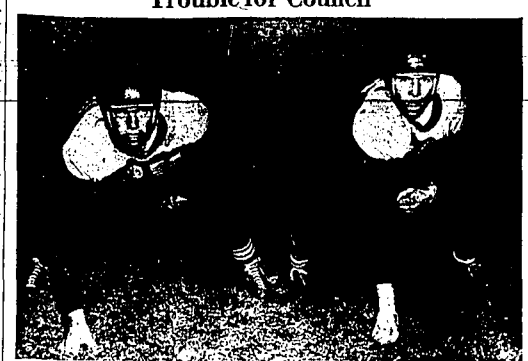

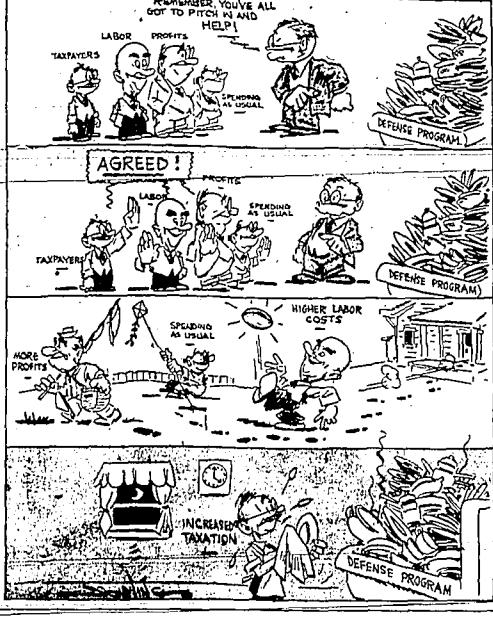

Market Chiefs Are Happy on Vote's Results

NEW YORK, Nov. 9 (AP)—Wall Street, traditional citadel of conservatism, is well pleased with the results of the election. The voting was regarded as a welcome shift away from the left.

Financial district leaders had hoped for and expected a turn in this direction, but most of them said they were surprised that the trend was so sharp.

They regarded Senator Taft's victory in Ohio as an especially welcome indication that labor's voice would be heeded.

General approval was expressed over the public's selective voting, its apparent breaking away from strict party lines across the country.
