Air Support Branch Gets Equal Status

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—The air force division has been given equal status with the ground support division as a separate command.

It announced the present joint air command will be split into three equal air commands: 1. The tactical air command, responsible for close cooperation with the army, previously an operational headquarters under the continental air command. It will maintain its present headquarters at Langley air force base, Hampton, Va.

2. An air defense command, responsible for defense of the United States against air attack. Its headquarters will be established temporarily at Mitchell air force base, New York.

3. The continental air command which will retain its responsibilities for administration and training of the air force. Its headquarters will continue to be at Mitchell air force base. The tactical air command will have as its primary job the development and training of the army units to support the expanding army. Under the tactical air command will be the ninth air force at Fayetteville, N. C.

Cannon to Command
As previously announced, SAC will be commanded by Brig. Gen. John K. Cannon when he returns from his present post as air force commander in England.

The air defense command will be commanded by Lieut. Gen. Fred Whitehead, now commander of the continental air command.

Maj. Gen. William H. Hale, now commander of the ninth air force at Mitchell air force base, will become commander of the continental air command.

Report Directly
All three of the commands will report directly to Gen. Carl Spaatz, chief of staff of the air force. That situation is similar to that of the strategic command, a branch which may critics have emphasized the air force of over-emphasized.

Other existing major commands include the air material command, the military air transport service, the air training command, and a research and development command now being organized.

TWIN FALLS, Nov. 19.—A portion of a survey to find the natural radiation level of the Snake river plains where plutonium is being produced has been completed. The sampling of plants and animals, soil, water and air of the area was conducted by Frank B. Blevins, under a contract with the Idaho operations office of the atomic energy commission. Blevins, who worked with Dr. Edwin McMillan, associate director of biological sciences.
