1. Reform, reinforce combat units and hold the communists out of the whole of Vietnam before the French Nations for a negotiated settlement.

2. Yield the strategic foothold in Indo-China to communism.

3. Fight a costly, unprofitable to French. Point 3 is repugnant to the French people.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (AP)—Government officials are not alarmed by the prospect that a business slump will come between the checking of the civilian boom and the full flowering of defense contracts.

### Limited Service For 4-F's Urged

NEW YORK, Nov. 18 (AP)—The War Department is urging that limited army service be recommended by a committee in the office of the U. S. army surgeon general.

Col. Warner Brown, chief surgical consultant for the army, disclosed the proposal to halt discharges of 4-F's at a session Friday of the Association of Military Surgeons.

He said the committee recommended that selective service quit disqualifying large numbers of men who still do most general service requirements. Instead of classifying them as 4-F and cutting them off from any army service whatsoever, they should be classified for limited duty according to their capacity.

This procedure would make available a large reserve reservoir of manpower, Brown said.

### 10,630 More Hunters Seek Elk and Deer

BOISE, Nov. 18—Some 10,630 more hunters stalked Idaho's hills and valleys in pursuit of deer and elk during the 1930 season than the previous year. Tag sale figures released by the Idaho fish and game department show.

With a total of 37,476 deer and 13,778 elk tags sold during the April 1 to Oct. 31 period, 1930 sales showed an increase of 9,339 deer and 911 elk tags over 1929.

During the same period, Federal combination license sales showed a decrease of 569, only 108,229 having been sold as against 109,498 for 1929.

Resident game license sales, however, showed a gain of 314 over 1929, total of 15,254 having been sold this year. Non-resident big game license sales during the seven-month period dropped 48 under the 1929 figure, only 631 having been purchased this year.

With 37,477 resident fish licenses issued, sales in that department showed a gain of 2,445 over the previous year. Non-resident fly, trap and season fish licenses showed gains of 1,150 and 20,973 respectively, out-of-state sportsmen having bought 8,691 season and 20,973 fly-trap licenses this year.

Trophy license sales also decreased, only 141 having been sold this season, a drop of 26 under the 1929 figure.

Overall resident and non-resident license sales records show increases in both types, the department said. Residents this year bought 3,011

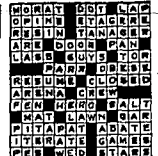

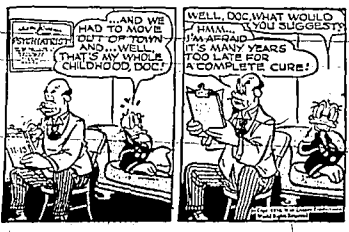

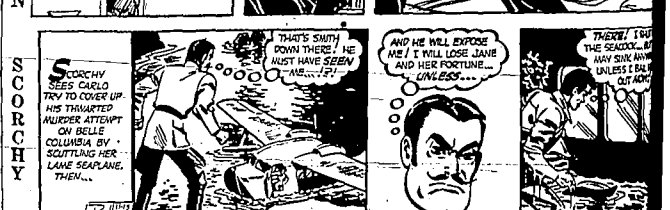

### Present Divas Handed Scorn Of Songstress

 HOLLYWOOD, Nov. 10.—Long-time singing star Blossom Seeley, here to prepare her life story for the screen, says the modern songstress doesn't have the stuff that made oldtimers great.

"They don't have to work for it," said Miss Seeley as we lunched with Betty Hutton, her husband, and a singing star in his own right. "These young girls have everything handed to them. They have their own microphone, they get a big publicity buildup and suddenly they are stars."

Miss Seeley varied.

"But they have no individuality, no style, no heart. They all sound alike. Back in the old days we had stars like Nora Bayes, Fanny Brice, Bette Baker, Sophie Tucker, Marion Dixie, and one was so different. We could all play the same vaudeville and the public would love it. Because each of us had a different style."

Blossom, who made "After You've Gone" and many other songs his famous, said the youngsters lack the training of the old.

Started in San Francisco  
 "I started out as a kid in San Francisco," she said. "I had years of training before all kinds of audiences—honky tonks, clubs and vaudeville—before I hit the Broadway big time."

She described her style: "Whatever I sing had to have a meaning; it had to have a beat. And it had to tell a story. The songs with the new girls are too slow and they don't put me into the words."

Blossom had to "feel" her song. Once, when she was starting for Florenz Ziegfeld, she asked to have a song removed from the show because she didn't feel it. "I am Ziegfeld and you will sing it," the producer declared.

Quit Show  
 "I am sick and I quit," she answered. And she did.

Blossom made three exceptions to the rule of no new songs. She said that Martin Luther King, Jr., and Ethel Merman and the Gaynor Trio, have some of the oldtime classics.

The singer, who was born in Seattle since 1928, has been the story of her life for George Benson and William Perleberg, who will film the story. Betty Hutton will star. Blossom said the yarn for \$50,000 on the basis of a four-page synopsis.

### Farm Policy Issue Raised In GOP Gain

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10.—Republican gains in the congressional elections have raised a question whether the Truman administration will revise its farm policies and personalities in a move to retain farmer support in the pivotal corn belt.

The first upshot as to whether changes are in store may come in a speech "Secretary of Agriculture Brannan is scheduled to make at the national convention of the National Grange at Minneapolis Nov. 27.

Blamed for Shift  
 The President's backing of Brannan's controversial farm plan has been cited in some quarters as a factor in shift of important corn belt states back to their traditional Republican positions. These states helped Mr. Truman stage his upset victory in 1948 when the farmers were worried about their future price prospects. A similar shift of traditional Republican corn belt states helped elect Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1932.

In off-year congressional elections, however, the corn belt helped elect a Republican congress.

Democratic leaders eyeing the 1952 presidential campaign are asking how they can be allowed to find their own level on the market, without benefit of government price supports. Through a system of "production payments" (subsidies), the government however would guarantee the farmer a "fair" return.

Believe Plan Hurt  
 Several Democratic leaders who asked that they not be quoted by name, said they believed the Brannan plan hurt the Democratic cause in the recent election. Several Independent Senator Anderson, New Mexico, Brannan's predecessor as agriculture secretary—have said they believe the new Democratic congress will stand firmly behind existing farm laws. These laws have been attacked by Brannan as inadequate.

On the other hand, Brannan will not concede that Republican victories should be charged to his program. He says no active campaign was put on the behalf of his program.

Mr. Dewey Brannan  
 Reports received before the election that party leaders would urge Mr. Truman to strip both Brannan and his plan if the Republicans made decided gains in the farm belt. These reports were helped along by a campaign statement by Vice President Barkley that neither he nor the Democratic party was committed to the Brannan proposal.

### Safety Harness for Airmen Is Tested by Ride on Rocket sled

 NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—Come along for a daring ride on a rocket sled.

Shot by rockets, it whizzes along on rails. It gets going 150 miles an hour and then seems to fly a solid brick wall.

Your body suddenly feels like it weighs 4,000 to 6,000 pounds. Special brackets slow you down as quickly, in 1/100th of a second, that you're subjected to a force 20 to 30 times greater than gravity.

But a special new safety harness keeps you sitting safe and snugly in the sled's seat.

This harness now is ready to save airmen in plane crashes, and will give them a far better chance of walking away, Maj. John B. Stapp, U. S. air force medical officer, said today.

The harness was developed and proved in 45 test rides on the sled in 10/100ths of a second, that you're subjected to a force 20 to 30 times greater than gravity.

"When the brakes go on, there's a terrific jolt," he said. "The jolting hit all over at the same time. Then there's a feeling of great pressure, for a fifth of a second, with your body thrusting forward, and the straps seem to be imbedding themselves in your torso—your back, for the straps are somewhat elastic and you get some whipping back or rebound."

"At the end, the sensation is one of feeling things through a green fog. But you never 'black out' out."

The new safety harness has six straps, made of two or three layers of special strength nylon, to hold a
