Job Openings Dip to 98 for Valley Offices

Job openings in Magic Valley continued to decline last week and numbered only 98 on Saturday, Hugh Nelson, acting manager of the Twin Falls Idaho state employment service office, announced Wednesday. However, only 29 unemployed persons were listed at 1235 offices in the valley.

Mining also was expected to increase employment if experienced workers could be found.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 (Special)—Last week's Republican victories may open up some choice committee assignments to Idaho's two GOP senators. Both Henry Dworshak and Herman Welker are eligible for two committee assignments each.

Approximately half the committees in the last congress had a ratio of eight Democrats to five Republicans, the other half were balanced seven to six in the majority party's favor. In the newly elected 82nd congress, however, all committees probably will be set up on the more equitable ratio of seven to six with the GOP on the short end because they almost, but not quite, captured the senate.

In addition the 31-man appropriations committee, the most powerful group in the senate, is scheduled to be reorganized to include two more Republican members.

Senator-elect Henry Dworshak agreed on both the house and senate committees and assignments committees and assigned to all on the same committee.

fly or bait fishing angling.

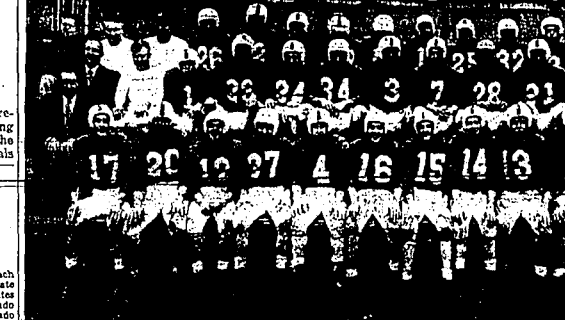

Men Demand Ups Shipping Of Reservists

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13 (AP) — The demand for trained troops in Korea has speeded the overseas movement of reserves, defense officials report. They maintain, however, that this has not broken down the priority system based on age and previous combat service.

Individual reservists and groups stationed in camps around the country have been complaining to their "home-leave" newspapers that friends that they were being pushed overseas while other reservists with less World War II service were being permitted to stay in the country.

The reserve assignment program was announced by the defense department last month. This program set a schedule for the eventual release of reservists and a point system to determine which men would be sent overseas.

The whole program, army and department officials pointed out, was based on the "precedence of the services." They said that in plain language this meant and still means that military service will first in every decision that has to be made regarding the sending or shipment overseas of reservists.

The late fall season is a good time for farmers to complete their irrigation conservation practices, J. A. Winkle, chairman of the Twin Falls county production and marketing administration committee, said Tuesday.

Now that the irrigation season is over, farmers can construct ditches, canals and install siphons, flumes, drop boxes, weirs, diversion gates and pipes; construct or enlarge dams and levees; or build their "home-leave" conservation structures will be in operation and ready for the saving of water and soil.

To qualify for assistance under the agricultural conservation program, he explained, the farmer must obtain approval from the county PMA committee for such work before the work is started.

New 'Atomic Age' Helper Is Disclosed

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 12.—A new atomic age development which may revolutionize the diagnosis and treatment of thyroid disease—including thyroid cancer—has been announced to the medical world.

It's a new application of a radioisotope detection instrument called a Geiger counter.

Doctors said the instrument "should largely replace" the well-known Geiger counter in various other medical applications dependent upon the detection of atomic radiation.

Opens Possibility

They said it even opened up the possibility of unattended use of a variety of radioactive materials for research in hospitals, industry and agriculture.

At present, these materials are restricted to use by certain especially equipped institutions because of potential radiation hazards.

The doctors told the Southern Medical Association of the use of the instrument in diagnosing thyroid disease. In this application, it detects "rays" of radioactive iodine given to patients as a tracer material. The iodine settles in the thyroid gland and a diseased condition can be determined on the basis of radioactive signals given out.

More Sensitive

Up to now, the Geiger counter has been the only instrument used for this same purpose. But the scintillation counter was described as 100 times more sensitive than the Geiger counter in detecting a certain kind of atomic ray.

And, because it is so sensitive, it allows use of as little as 1/250th the amount of radioactive iodine required when a Geiger counter is employed. This makes it possible to perform repeated tests without danger to the patient.
