Homebuilding Dip Is Noted In U. S. Tally

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—Homebuilding declined in October for the first month this year, the Bureau of labor statistics has reported. This apparently reflected the new government credit rules on homebuilding. The bureau said, however, the effects of these curbs cannot be determined as yet. Homebuilders started a total of 10,000 new permanent non-farm dwellings in October. This was a 10 per cent drop from September, but almost equal to the volume of October, 1949, when housing activity was at a peak for that year. Every other month except October has shown a big jump over last year in housing starts. During the 10 months through October this year a total of 109,000 new dwellings units were put under construction. This total is 42 per cent above

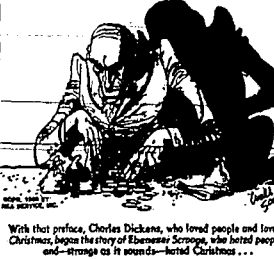

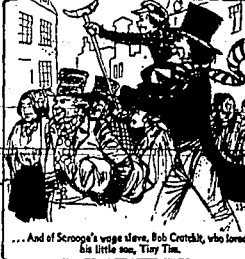

Using a penny postcard from her mother's desk, the eighth-grader from nearby Hyattsville, Md., wrote Mr. Truman this message:

"My name is Linda. I'm 12 years old. I think it would be nice if at noon all radio programs and went stop and everyone would pray for the boys overseas. God will surely protect us all."

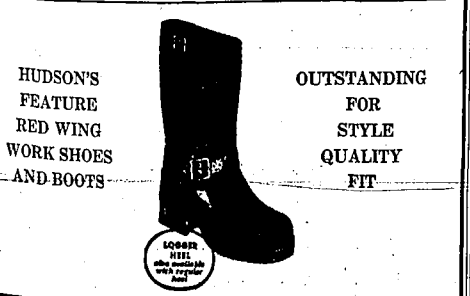
