Firm Donates 2,500 Cases of Baby Food to Salvation Army

Twin Falls Salvation Army workers loaded 2,500 cases of baby food into a truck Saturday at the scene of the Zion Wholesale company fire to store it for distribution to needy families.

The 6,000 cases of food were donated to the Salvation Army by the Gerber Baby Food company after the cans were soaked with water and dented by debris in the fire. The company wanted to keep the damaged cans off the market, so repurchased the entire stock from salvage operators.

The canned foods are not harmed in any way since they were protected by the cans. Many of the cardboard cartons showed little damage.

Lt. Rice Montgomery, local Salvation Army leader, said Saturday that the fire food will be distributed to local needy families. Some of the cans will be sent to Salvation Army child welfare institutions in other states.

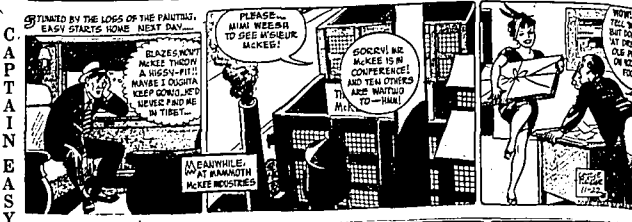

Big Drop Due On Radio, TV Building River

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22 (AP)—A two percent drop in the price of aluminum stock after a year in which it rose 25 percent was reported by industry leaders today as a national production of aluminum alloyed with cobalt by 70 percent.

The price of cobalt, a steel-hardening alloy used in the production of aluminum, was reported to have risen from 10 percent to 15 percent because of "very high" demand for the metal. It was reported to have risen at only 20 percent of the volume during the first half of this year.

The industry faces dwindling production in the first quarter of 1945 and is expected to have a "very tight" market for the remainder of the year, according to a spokesman for the Radio-Television Manufacturers Association.

Meet NPA Chief

Representatives of the association met Monday with NPA Chief, J. H. Harrison, to discuss the problem caused by heavy demands for stock and the possibility of raising and electronic equipment.

The session was closed, but it was learned that the industry group came away with the impression that the NPA would provide materials to keep plants running at a reduced rate until defense orders "take up the slack."

\$1,149,000,000 Expenses

The department said that military pay and allowances, civilian employment, research and development, and other non-military expenses accounted for \$1,149,000,000. The report also said that the defense department was preparing to ask Congress for an additional \$100,000,000 to finance the remainder of the fiscal year ending June 30.

THIS YEAR's appropriations are \$1,342,000,000 of defense spending authorized by Congress. It has authorized \$3,225,000,000 for foreign military assistance.

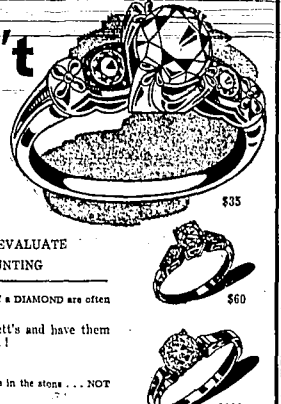
