76 KILL IN TRAIN COLLISION

Over 300 Injured N. Y. History's Worst Rail Crash

NEW YORK, Nov. 23 (AP)—Two crowded Long Island railroad passenger trains crashed last night with a blinding flash during the Thanksgiving eve rush hour, killing 76 persons and injuring more than 300. Many of the injured are in critical condition.

Of the 76 dead, 75 have been identified tentatively. One body, that of a dark-haired girl wearing a green sweater, lay unidentified in the Queens county morgue.

"It was the worst railroad accident in the history of New York state and the worst in the nation since 1918, when 246 people were killed in the wreck of the Pennsylvania railroad's Congressional limited in Philadelphia," a New York Times editorial said.

Not until 3:30 a. m. (EST) today—nine hours after the crash—remains of the wreckage were being removed from the wreck site.

Most of the dead were wedged in two telescoped smoking cars which were finally pulled apart at 4:45 a. m. All night long ambulances and fire trucks crowded the scene of the crash.

The disaster was the second in a series of accidents on Long Island railroad, busiest passenger line in the United States. The crash occurred at 10:57 p. m. at a head-on wreck at Rockville Centre. The quiet residential area of New York City is about 20 miles from the crash site.

Fossilized Bones Show Valley Area Once Roamed by Camels

MOSCOW, Nov. 23 (AP)—Large numbers of camels roamed the Snake river plains in Idaho a million years or so ago.

So says the University of Idaho's geology department which annually sifts through hundreds of bones dug up by chance and sent in for identification.

Fossilized camel bones come in every year with such regularity that the department has decided the animals were common in the prehistoric days of the Gem state.

Pieces of camel bone come most frequently from the Hagerman section of southern Idaho.

The geology department has identified many other types of bones but they are much more routine than the camel.

"Fossil specimens seem to come in cycles and from certain areas," says Dr. Walter Youngquist, assistant professor of geology at the university.

"From the territory south of Brunau in Owyhee county pieces of every sort jawbone of an extinct form of carp have been coming lately."

Dr. Youngquist and his staff get all types of ancient material for identification and much of it can be quickly discarded.

"Some bones are common and so are fossilized plants that some people think are bones of ancient animals. One such plant which grows up regularly from southeastern Idaho is a peculiar fern which at first glance appears to be a cross-section of a dinosaur bone."

Telling the fossil collectors what they have found is one of two identification services performed by men in the school of mines at the university. The other, a cooperative with the state bureau of geology, aids prospectors in mineral identification.

AEC Official Pleased by Atomic Work, But Warns More Expansion Is Needed

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22 (Special)—Atomic energy commission, reports he is encouraged about the progress of this agency's work and says "we have got to be expanding and we cannot be behind in facilities that we have."

"We've got to go the limit on this thing," he continues. "I think that the strength we develop in this thing may mean the difference between whether we have a war or not, and it certainly may, if war comes, make the difference between winning or losing it."

Dean's comments were made in the course of an interview with the weekly news magazine U. S. News and World Report this week. The atomic reactor at Arco, where work is being rushed on a top priority plan for propelling submarines.

He also feels the security requirements in atomic energy installations are presenting a great difficulty in speed of the agency's work and believes that the time might come when it will be necessary to have security regulations even to the point where size, weight and shape of the atomic bomb are made public.

As many an Idahoan knows who has applied for jobs at Arco, Dean points out that an average of 63 days is required by the FBI for clearance of applicants who are not on classified papers. He says the cost of each check ranges from \$100 to \$200.

He reports no more than 150 persons in the U. S. now know how to build all the materials. He added, "The time may come when as many as 300,000 to 400,000 people must know things at the operational level to have real readiness."

Meaning, there is a feeling here that the "cat is out of the bag" so far as extending Russian knowledge of the conventional atomic bomb. Dean says that Klaus Fuchs, the British atomic scientist who turned over valuable information to the Russians, advanced their atomic bomb race to two years. He now is serving a 14-year prison term.

Kenneth De Courcy, British journalist who first reported the Russian had the bomb, believes they have a stockpile of 50 and are making out current output.

It is known to have excellent intelligence sources, including close contact with the Vatican.

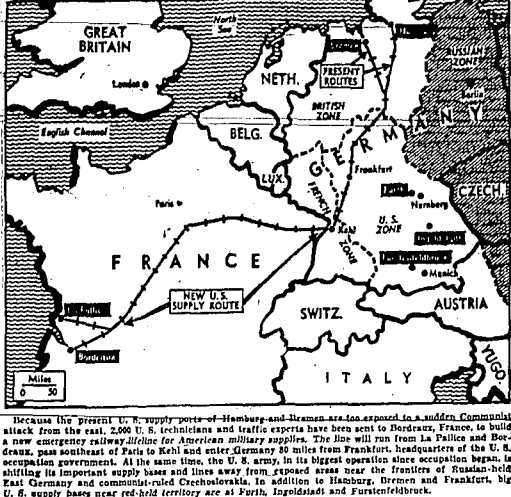

Ada County's School Gains Leading State

BOISE, Nov. 23 (AP)—While Idaho's population increased 40,278 between 1940 and 1950, the elementary and high school enrollment gained only 8,044, the Associated Teachers of Idaho reported Wednesday.

The report showed more than half the school-age population in Ada County.

Enrollment in Idaho's population was placed at \$24,872 in 1940 and \$28,318 in 1950 with the school enrollment 130,287 in the 1940-50 school year and 140,011 in the 1949-50 school year, the report showed.

The school pupil increase in the Boise independent school district was from 6,118 in 1940 to 6,222 in 1949, or 1.76, the report showed. Merger of school districts accounted for some of the increase.

Other items in this report showed: An increase of teachers in elementary and high schools from 4,137 in 1940 to 4,902.94 in 1950. A drop in teacher load from 28.8 pupils per teacher to 23.1 in the same 10 years.

An average state-wide cost per pupil instruction, from \$66.92 in 1940 to \$71.64 in 1949, the report showed. A decline in the value of the dollar from the 100 index in 1939 to 81 in 1949.

Counties which showed smaller school enrollment in 1950 than in 1940 were Adams, Benewah, Blaine, Blaine, Boise, Bonner, Boundary, Camas, Cassia, Franklin, Idaho, Idaho, Jefferson, Latah, Lemhi, Madison, Owyhee, Teton and Valley; the taxpayers organization said.

Boise Lake county which lost more than 100 pupils between 1940 and 1949, had a gain in school enrollment from 1949 to 1950.

Blaine county, with a 7,000 population gain, had an increase of 70 in school enrollment, the report said.

Crime Probe Concluded in Western U. S.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 10 (AP)—The senate crime investigation committee concluded its western hearing last night with a denunciation of Patrick Mooney, former member of the federal revenue at Reno.

Chairman Sen. Felix Kefauver, N. Tenn., said that Mooney's handling of the Mountain City Consolidated Copper company of Nevada was a "very serious, most reprehensible matter and a criminal one if the facts are as presented to us."

Ex-Agent Testifies

The company story was told to the committee by William Burkett, former special agent in the internal revenue department.

Burkett, resigned in protest against what he said was failure of the department to act on information he obtained.

Burkett's story was that Orestes Jenkins, a convicted abortionist, had given him an affidavit that she had paid \$5,000 to escape law prosecution. She said she paid the money to Mooney on the pretext she was to receive stock in the non-operating copper mining company, but, she added, she never had received the stock.

Lists Stockholders

Kefauver said that the committee is getting a complete list of the stockholders of the copper company.

Asked if the committee had inquired into whether Jenkins had any interest in a Nevada gambling club, Kefauver said he had no interest in such matters.

The committee, whose other members are Senators Alexander Wiley, R. Wis., and Charles McNary, R. N. H., will return to California for further hearings next week.

Earlier the committee heard William Robertson, club operator and weekly gambler operating in San Diego, Calif., and Lou Wolcher, coin machine company operator.

Kefauver said that they had testified "frankly" about their operations in building up Jenkins' operation was a member of the Los Angeles police force from 1912 to 1920. He resigned in 1920 during police commission investigation of his sources of income.

Wolcher told the committee about his "million dollar a year" coin machine business, Kefauver said. Wolcher heads the Advance Automatic Sales company. Wolcher told the committee he discontinued during the handling of slots when they became illegal in California last July 16.

Nature Playing Trick on AEC's Radiation Rules

IDAHO FALLS, Nov. 10 (AP)—Navy officials here are playing a trick on the radioactivity rules of the U. S. atomic energy commission.

The rules permit atomic workers an annual dose of radioactivity from their work areas "far" than that the radioactivity that comes rays give as one mile altitude.

But the commission's new reactor site on the Snake river plains is almost a mile above sea level, with twice as much natural radioactivity as the rules permit in the plains.

If anyone cares, you get many times greater natural radioactivity at a mile-and-a-half, and really big amounts of cosmic radioactivity while flying, and none of it does any harm. That cosmic radioactivity is far more penetrating than that from reactors, but it is in volume.

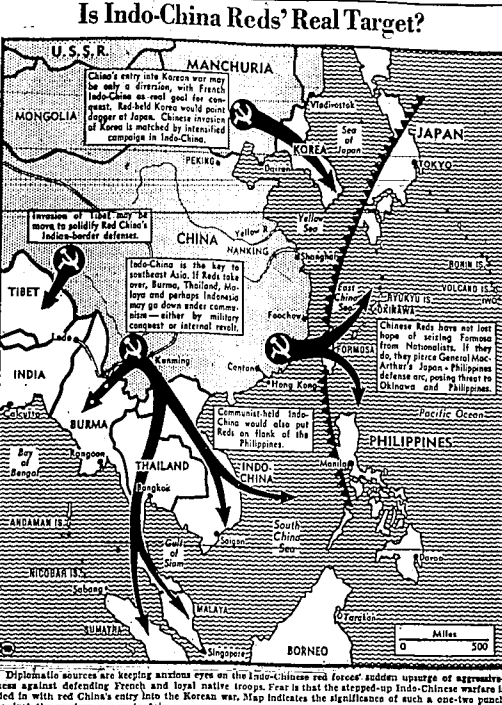

Both men were held in bonds of \$200 each for a hearing Dec. 6.

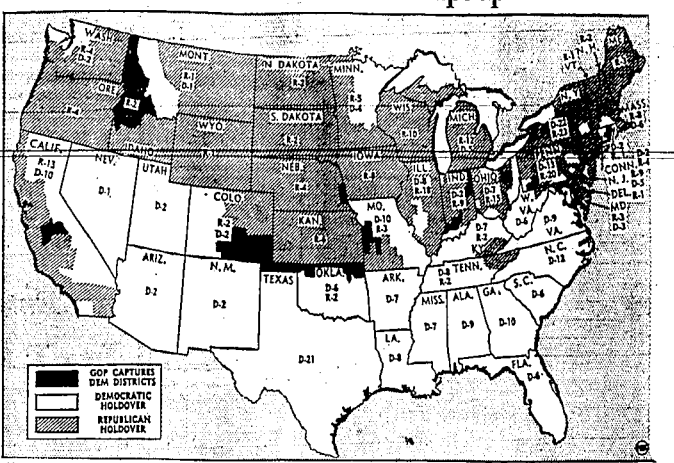

GOP to Seek Broadening of Congress' Instructions to Prepare Next Tax Bill

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23 (AP)—The Republican members of the House today are expected to ask Congress next week to broaden the writing of its instructions to prepare a new tax bill.

The present directive is: Write an excess profits tax on corporations.

The Republicans—lacked almost solidly by businessmen—want the instructions changed so that the committee also could consider a "corporate defense profits tax," which in effect would amount to a straight percentage increase in the present corporate tax rate.

During the seven days of hearings which ended today the 18 Democrats on the committee repeatedly have overridden the 10 Republicans and refused to receive testimony about any other tax than one on excess profits. The Democrats say that is what Congress ordered.

Representative Reed, R. N. Y., top Republican on the committee, said in a statement approved by his colleagues that he is "quite confident that neither the senate nor the house intended to railroad during the short session of Congress which convenes next Monday."

The end of the hearings found committee members in disagreement as to what ought to be done. While all concurred that more money must be found to foot the cost of defense, there were sharply conflicting views about how it should be obtained.

Influential Democrats held their earlier predictions that the committee will follow in general outline the administration's recommendations. They did not rule out the possibility of some modifications.

However, there is already support for a combination of an excess profits levy and an increase in the regular corporate tax rate.

Today's printing testimony for public utilities testified that consumers may have to bear the burden of any excess profits tax that is levied on the utilities.

Predictions of higher taxes for gas, electricity, telephone and transportation service to offset any tax were given to the house ways and means committee by spokesmen at the utilities industries.

They were the final witnesses at the committee ended seven days of public hearings on the administration's request for an excess profits levy to raise \$4,000,000,000 more revenue.

The committee will meet again Friday behind closed doors to start writing a bill. It hopes to have the measure ready for consideration during the short session of Congress which convenes next Monday.

HAGERMAN, Nov. 23—Veterans of the World War II have made several inroads on farms in the Hagerman valley, but instead of being "straw" workers, they are now construction of farm buildings.

These veterans, now well established farmers in the community, are enrolled in the Veterans Training program in vocational agriculture, commonly known as the "On Job Farm Training." Propaganda's Screen Hides Real Combats

 For the last two weeks a propaganda screen which hides the real combats in Korea.

The smoke screen could hide no more. The United States and China which would lead to a full-scale war. On the other hand, it could be simply to gain a better bargaining position in the United Nations to gain a compromise in the disputes over Korea and Formosa which in effect "would be a complete victory."

Both Play Casually
 It is apparent that both ideas—United Nations forces allied in Korea against the communists on the one hand, and Russia and China on the other—are playing their cards cautiously.

Neither wants to be caught in a position from which it cannot withdraw.

In the five years since the end of World War II, the western world's outer defense perimeter has been under constant probing attack by communist-led forces. The outbreaks in Iran and Greece were communist-inspired. Communist China expects to turn to the Indo-Chinese rebels, and communist troops now fight in North Korea.

No Russian Troops
 Yet it is interesting in all these conflicts that nowhere have Russian troops been committed. In fact, in each case, a western resistance formed, Russian policy is limited only to apply the pressure elsewhere a little later.

Ready expansion is a fundamental Kremlin policy.

Russia can't afford to stand still. Her actions so far have shown she will pick up any plum ripe for picking—but she doesn't want a war—not yet.

And what about China?
 Red Dictator Mao Tse-tung has war aims far beyond the Yalu river from Korea in Manchuria alone.

But he also has vast troubles. Guerrillas fight his winter base. His army still cannot be said to be under his firm control. Starvation has been a major problem in the China rice bowl. And Mao already is involved in wars of a sort in Tibet, Indo-China and Korea.
