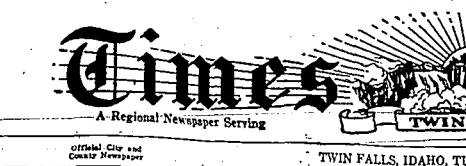

U.S. Charges China With Red Hordes Swamp Line

TOKYO, Nov. 28 (UP)—A horde of 200,000 Chinese communists swarmed over North Korea today, threatening to trap desperately fighting allies in an offensive which Gen. Douglas MacArthur said marked the start of "an entirely new war."

The Chinese, pouring like locusts over the countryside as far as the human eye could see, ripped through a widening hole torn in the right flank of the U.N. line. They could be seen along "every road, every gulch and every ridge-line," a first corps spokesman said. As the Chinese seized the offensive and rocked the allies by the defensive, MacArthur issued a blistering statement accusing the Chinese of hurling the major part of their fighting force against the U.N.

MacArthur said China's full-scale intervention in the Korean war posed issues beyond his authority and asked the what they were intended to do about it.

"In a special communique," he said, "China had shattered his 'high hopes' of an early end to the Korean war that would get American troops 'home by Christmas.'"

The Chinese, he said, had broken the front lines in North Korea in the last 10 miles south of the point from which the U.N. offensive started.

Burley Woman Hopes Nobody Pulls the Public 'Sweettooth'

BURLEY, Nov. 28 (AP)—Mrs. Bessie Lee, Burley, has a "sweet" business, one in which there are no labor-management problems.

Mrs. Lee is in the candy business and the only way she could have difficulty of opinion between labor and management would be for her to quarrel with herself. She's not only the boss of the outfit, she's the entire staff of workers. Not with her own hands she makes thousands and thousands of hand-dipped chocolates, packs them and supervises them.

It's a "sweet" business, all right, and it's only a year old.

Shortly after the death of her husband, the late District Judge T. Bailey Lee, pioneer Idaho lawyer, Mrs. Lee was faced with the problem of filling the lonely hours as well as providing an income for herself—she turned to what she felt was her only talent, candy making.

For years, at Christmas time, Mrs. Lee had made hundreds of pounds of home-made candy as gifts for friends and relatives and so her reputation already was established.

If her candy then was undipped but she became "fascinated" as she called it, a friend dipping chocolates and decided to try it herself. She mastered it and with the mastery, Mrs. Lee's finished "home-made chocolates" came into being.

Realizing she could not go into debt in her venture, Mrs. Lee purchased only the supplies she felt she could use immediately for candy making and while the first few weeks were anxious ones, large orders, just before the holidays, gave her the boost and courage she needed. Since then, her chocolates, packed in one to five-pound boxes, after electric fringes in the kitchen is the "candy room." All of the cream fillings are prepared there and each takes less than 10 pounds of sugar and, with the addition of apricot and other flavors, 10 pounds of sugar makes approximately 15 pounds of candy.

The candy is "carefully" kneaded and rolled and then taken to her basement working room for dipping. This operation requires care and skill. The temperature must be perfect, Mrs. Lee says, with both the candy, the cream and the room. There must be no draft, since even the smallest variation of tempera-

Mrs. Lee drops the cream centers into the chocolate with one hand and brings them out with the other. Each piece must have its distinctive "curry-que" on top to indicate the flavor of the chocolate.

The candy then is lined up in trays preparatory to packing in boxes to keep until they are packed in fancy boxes for sale or shipment.

Except for three varieties, all of Mrs. Lee's chocolates are hand-dipped. "Mother was a wonderful cook," Mrs. Lee recalls, "but I don't believe she ever made a batch of candy for her life."

All of the candy making Mrs. Lee does by herself but does call on her daughters to help with the packing and mailing. Mrs. Mary Lee Scott, Mrs. Sarah Reed, both Burley, and Mrs. Eleanor McMillan, Rupert, are proud of their mother's accomplishments and help when the packing rush is on. Irene Scott, a 12-year-old granddaughter, also lends a hand.

When Mrs. Lee started her candy business she had only two tables and some wooden boxes for packing purposes. She had to use the chocolates back and forth as she selected varieties for packing. When a local store remedied this year she bought a discarded wrapping counter to replace the tables and boxes.

The packing room has had pleasant memories for Mrs. Lee. It was Judge
