Tests Set for Civil Service Jobs in Utah

Civil service examinations for positions as instrument mechanic at Hill air force base, the Utah general depot and the Ogden arsenal, all near Ogden, Utah, were announced Friday by Anna Bromk, Magic Valley civil service secretary.

Fields of instrument mechanics covered in the examinations are general instruments, aircraft general instruments, aircraft electrical instruments, flight control instruments, aircraft camera and optical fire control instruments. Vacancies exist in most of these fields at present.

The examinations cover helper, journeyman and senior levels of each specialized instrument repair field. Initial rates of pay range from \$12.10 to \$14.90 per hour. Pay increases within grade may go up to a maximum ranging from \$164 to \$148 an hour.

Applications must have had from six months to four years of experience or training in the instrument specialty for which they apply, depending upon the level of the position desired. Experience in other trades involving repair of intricate mechanical devices may be substituted for the entire six months needed for helper and half the experience required for other levels.

Exciting New Drug Helping Heart Ailment

BALZ LAKE CITY, Dec. 1 (AP)—Perfume has given science one of the most exciting new drugs, good for hearts, arteries and other things. How this discovery was made is the college of medicine of the University of Utah by Dr. Mark Nickerson was told by his chief, Dr. N. R. Goodman, professor of pharmacology.

The Swiss perfume firm, Glaxo, had several hundred different chemicals, left-overs from making pleasant odors. These chemicals looked like water, and had no odor. What they were unknown because their original makeup had been changed by the essences that go into perfume.

Began Experiments The college of medicine got a lot of these bottles and began trying the chemicals on animals. Nothing happened until Dr. Nickerson came to number 13. This chemical had no name, and it was the notation in which he picked up this bottle.

Thirteen was placed along with several other chemicals for tests on blood pressure. Presently something appeared to be going very wrong. Ordinarily, the doctor's best way of raising blood pressure, occasionally was doing just the opposite. What 13 was suspected, but when tested it failed to lower pressure.

Dr. Nickerson then, after the records he had been keeping for weeks on the effects of all the chemicals in the pressure tests, and discovered that number 13 had a delayed action. The living body was changed by this queer chemical and after the change number 13 would reverse its action.

Resembles Iron Poison Thirteen was found to be chemically similar to the heavy metal iron, with gas, nitrogen mustard, but lacking the poison. It was given the jaw-breaking name of dibenzyl sulfoxide. More than 300 modifications of dibenzyl sulfoxide, with varying results, were made in search for medical uses.

This synthetic chemical acts on the vascular system, which means both heart and blood vessels, the same disease it kills more than 500,000 Americans annually. It has been used for ailments which have been treated by arsenic, lead and cyanide. In surgical operations it keeps the heart beating, and in high blood pressure it relieves very bad attacks that cause partial blindness. It is not a cure. It helps diagnose cancer.
