Reseeding Project on 7,940 Acres Is Nearing Completion

BURLINGAME, Dec. 2—Bureau of land management crews are completing reseeding projects on 7,940 acres in the Raft river valley, William L. Mathews, district range manager, announced Saturday.

Mathews said the primary purpose of this program is to reseed depleted range lands to prevent the invasion of the poisonous weed, halloglosson, to determine the influence of reseeding in rehabilitating halloglosson infested areas and to increase the forage resources of the federal range.

Areas resseeded during past years at present are doing much to take care of livestock whose former areas of use have become worthless because of halloglosson. Studies on resseeded areas east of Rupert indicate the forage value of present cover is 40 per cent greater than that supplied by the former stand of dense sagebrush.

Of the 7,940-acre total, approximately 3,000 acres are located near U. S. Highway 20N, east of Rupert. Sagebrush was removed by a con-

that forage resources be developed in order to make it possible for the nation to produce the needed quantities of meat and fiber, Mathews said.

Great acreages of federal, state and private lands possess a great potential for forage production through sagebrush removal and reseeding projects, he explained.

Priorly for this type of work should precede other types of land development which produce essentially farm commodities for which there is a surplus, he said.

 countries which have forces fighting alongside Americans and South Koreans in the field. This, possibly could be done by a small military committee which U. N. general assembly could set up.

Finally Britain and France believe only the U. N.—and not the United States on its own—must decide whether to force the armistice on a U. N. war.

British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin and Defense Minister Ernest Bevin will meet in London today to discuss the situation. The conversations were full and frank and established a general identity of view on the part of the two governments in the present international situation. It was agreed that the two governments would continue to maintain the closest contact.

Bevin's decision not to go to Washington apparently stemmed from the fact the Truman-Attlee show-up is not going to be a conference in the formal sense of the word.

Man-to-Man Talk
 It will be more in the nature of a man to man talk on subjects of particular British-American concern.

For one thing, as cabinet minister Hugh Dalton said tonight, Britain thinks the United States is inclined to give insufficient weight to British views on crucial issues.

A James Meadehead
 Three such issues—Dalton touched on them in his speech to a Labor party audience at Devizes—directly affect the world situation.

(1)—Britain wants the west to make a supreme effort to come to an understanding with Russia.

Dalton, who often is spoken of as a possible successor to Bevin at the foreign office, said "no ideological prejudice, no unhappy past experience, no emotional reluctance or mental immobility should prevent that effort."

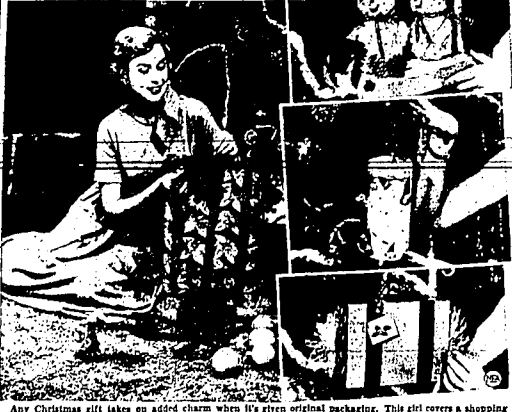
(2)—Britain wants red China admitted to the United Nations, believing that would be the best way of settling the Korean affair.

Dalton said the British cabinet agrees the whole Korean affair might have been avoided if red China had been admitted into U. N. before.

(3)—Britain wants U. N. forces in Korea to stop well short of the Manchurian and Siberian frontiers.

Dalton noted failure of a British move to stop Gen. Douglas MacArthur's ill-fated offensive last week.

Glamorized Containers Make Valued Gifts at Less Expense

 The solution to the problem of wrapping the difficult or bulky Christmas gift lies in converting materials at hand into convenient containers. And in doing this, the gift itself takes on added importance.

Christmas fruit always presents a wrapping problem. One of the prettiest and easiest solutions lies in giving an ordinary paper shopping bag red glamour. Use printed cellophane to cover the bag, securing it with tape. The cellophane roping which trims the top of the bag is held in place with spool wire. Allow enough roping to permit a tow trim for the bag.

A snow man and lady, made of popcorn and mounted on a cardboard sled, can be an attractive, inexpensive gift for a child. They are covered with clear red and blue cellophane and wear ties made of printed cellophane ribbon. Arms are popcorn-filled cellophane tubes, fastened on with tape. Star-Viewing Is Hard Job In December

By J. HUGH FRUETT
Astronomer, Extension Division,
Oregon Higher Education System

Blanketing in December may seem quite ill-fated to some, yet winter nights often are brilliant, and even in the most remote localities the cloud veil occasionally is rolled back to show the firmament of the—
But deaths are revealed in glory to earth dwellers.

Old Sol this month treads a short daily path across the southern heavens, and on Dec. 23 will give us our shortest day.

The gorgeous planet Venus passed from the dawn sky to the evening twilight three weeks ago, but it still is far beyond the sun in actual distance.

Splendor to Increase
Early next year Venus will move into an excellent position in the west and will constantly increase in splendor until late summer.

Mercury, the little messenger of the gods, is now low in the south-west at sunset, but hard to locate. Saturn is in the morning sky and high in the south at sunrise. Red stars are low in the southwest in the deepening twilight but no longer a very conspicuous object. But Jupiter is glowing brilliantly in the south as soon as darkness falls. Nothing compares with it in the evening heavens.

8 p. m. View Good
For the so-called "fixed stars," let us observe around 8 p. m. Look in the sky in the south-southwest, somewhat in the mouth of the Southern Puff, glitter with blue-white light. Fairly low and nearly due west, Altair, the brightest star of Vega is conspicuous between two nearby stars of lesser brilliance. It will well up in the northwest. The brightest star in the western half of the heavens, Vega, is the celestial harp. At some distance almost immediately above Vega, Deneb leads the large group, the Northern Cross. Three stars of about equal brightness—but less than Deneb's—form a conspicuous cross. Fainter stars below extend down to the foot of the cross.

Twins in Northeast
Low in the east-contrast the heavenly twins, Castor and Pollux, appear one above the other. Pollux is the lower and more orange of the two. High above these, yellow Capella twinkles brilliantly. Somewhat south of east three similar stars form the short, upright line of Orion's belt. Almost on a foot with these and to the right, Rigel is brilliant; to the left, red Betelgeuse scintillates.

Trades Above Orion
High above Orion's belt is the horizontal V of the Hyades stars, all dim excepting orange Aldebaran. Still higher, the tiny dipper of the small stars, the Pleiades, catch one's eyes whenever they are turned to that part of the sky.

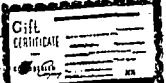
Around Dec. 13 the Geminid meteors may be observed in the eastern evening heavens. About 20 "shooting stars" per hour may be seen—under cloudless conditions if the eyes are kept constantly on the sky.

Life in MAGIC VALLEY

It doesn't take artificial tree lights, expensive lights or even a spruce tree to make a real Christmas. Stella Browns, BUHL pioneer, can vouch for that. When Buhl celebrated his first Christmas in 1906 these things were missing but the day still was a glad occasion.

All that was necessary was the spirit of the occasion and that wasn't lacking in the pioneer settlers of the new tract. Christmas was the first community celebration for those people who spent their days grubbing sagebrush to clear the land.

The Union Sunday school organized by Mr. Brown took charge. H. E. Holmen, the first superintendent, assisted and the entire community worked in some way to insure success of the first Christmas. Bill Rodgers and Henry Trencher volunteered to get the tree and since there was no bridge or ferry across the river at Clear Lake, it was necessary to use a logboat to get a native juniper tree back to Buhl. The undertaking was completed in five days but the tree was installed in the schoolhouse on Broadway and the decorating job was done by Mrs. E. H. Marshall, Mrs. Lilla Sneliker, Lila Peterson, Mrs. Gertrude and Dick Rodgers took care of this.

Gifts were provided by "Aunt" Mary Hill, Mrs. E. H. Holmen and St. H. Osgood and Clarence Peck, who donated nuts and candy. The committee purchased 10 dozens of oranges, all these were in loaves, and presents were brought to the tree by Fred Larson. E. A. Miller substituted for Banta with a costume complete even to flesh boots. Rev. J. W. Casterline and George D. Brown attended the celebration. The program for the evening was given by Mrs. Clarence Peck who played the organ, and Edith Miller, who sang.

Another BUHL Christmas story comes from Lila Hartwell Lough, an early resident of the Roseworth tract and the first child born at Three Creek. Travel to Roseworth was not easy at any season of the year but in the winter it was even more of a problem. This led to a tendency to make Christmas "homemade" gifts. Articles could be ordered from a catalogue early or purchased at the general store miles away, but neither of these was practical or necessary. Everyone liked the homemade gifts. As a young bride Mrs. Lough usually celebrated Christmas with her husband. Christmas was a special occasion on the aspect of a community gathering when the children and their families attended.

Christmas day always meant a sleigh ride. Usually a cowhide was fastened to the front of all sleds so they could fit on it were treated to a fast ride through the snow.

Mrs. Lough also recalled another Christmas when she and her husband, the late Frank Hartwell, rode 23 miles across the winter trail to the valley to spend the week with the William Turner family. On Christmas as they rode northward to the home of a neighbor for a party, the evening nearly ended in tragedy when the winter trail (Leonard Wilson) reached into the tree for a gift and the cotton on his costume caught fire, burning him severely after the face and hands.

Meat Ration for Britons Slashed

LONDON, Dec. 3 (AP)—Britons long anticipating a cut in their fresh meat ration because of a lack of imports from Argentina, heard the bad news today.

The food ministry announced that beginning tomorrow, the ration will be cut from one shilling apiece of corned beef to nine shillings apiece (16 2/3 cents) worth of fresh meat. However, each ration bookholder will be entitled to four pence (four cents) worth of corned beef. Corned beef has not been a part of the meat ration since last August.

The ministry said the reduction was the direct result of the government's refusal to pay higher prices which Argentine authorities have been asking for their meat.

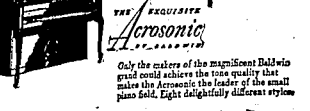

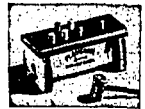

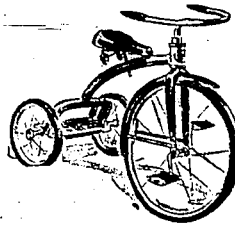
