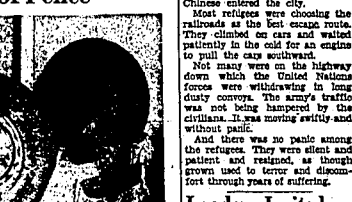

## Comparison Seen Between Atom and Diesel Engines for Submarine Power

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6 (Special)—Engineers feel the top-priority submarine motor being built at Arco will have seasonal peacetime applications. They like to compare its history to that of the diesel engine, which proved in World War I that it was really adaptable to many other uses than that of propelling submarines.

Before 1919 the diesel was looked upon as a clumsy, stogy machine that was useful only in land-based power plants or the largest ships. When marine designers crammed it into the tight confines of a submarine, it was proven the engine could be used in buses, trucks, trains and small ships.

Similarly, nuclear reactors called piles for brevity—have been built for general marine use since the 1920-30s, after its phenomenal success in World War I submarines. In 1924 the engine was installed in streamlined locomotives for the first time.

Atom people like to point to the example of the diesel engine. They say that petroleum came into use as a fuel, even when it cost a great deal more than coal, because it was more convenient than coal for moving equipment.

Today, the navy, sooner than commercial users, will pay a high premium for the even greater convenience of a practically weightless atomic motor.

In a decade or two, it may be absurd that any vehicle, land or sea or air-going, will devote a large share of its space to carrying fuel. It may seem natural that all types of locomotion should run months or years before anyone even glances at the fuel gauge.

Yet Washington engineers are hoping to complete within two years an atomic motor that will fit into a conventional diesel-type submarine, which is smallest of all navy combat vessels, 1,900th the size of our latest battleships.

The British, not so optimistic about shrinking atomic applications, are looking at the Arco experiment with particular interest, is the air force. So far, it has been unable to get a go-ahead from congress for a project operating personnel from deadly rays.

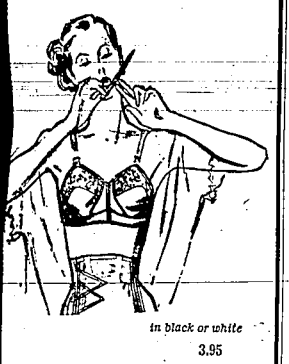

### Former Buhl Resident Fulfills Promise to Self in Tree Trade

Buhl, Dec. 6.—Ever wondered where all the Christmas trees come from?

A former Buhl man can tell you where a part of them are from. He supplies approximately 6,000 for residents of Magic Valley every year.

Raymond Rugg's business of supplying Christmas trees came through a promise he made to himself when he was a boy in Buhl and when neither he nor his friends had trees for Christmas.

It is a little farfetched to say there were no Christmas trees in those days. Many families had puny and overcast spruce as Christmas trees but such makeshifts didn't take the place of spruce trees.

Rugg, now a resident of Montana, has been bringing trees into the valley for the last seven years. Shortly before Thanksgiving every year he begins cutting trees for the coming Christmas. Cutting earlier than around Thanksgiving makes the trees usable since there must be a hard frost to "condition" the trees for their intended use.

Rugg's trees this year come from around Lookout mountain near the Canadian border in Montana.

Rugg says he purchases most of his trees from lumber companies.

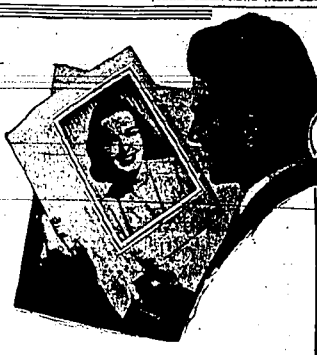

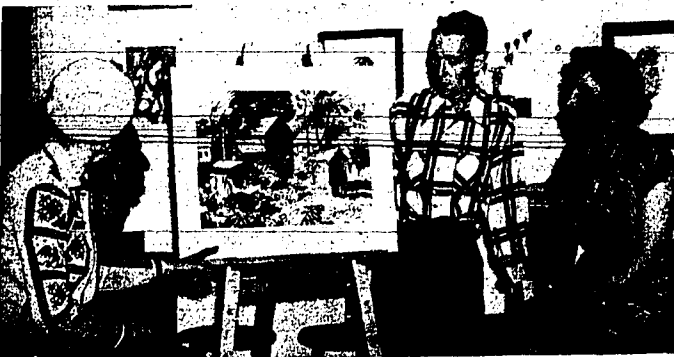

### Burned Man Alive as Wonder Hormone Performs 7 Miracles

CLEVELAND, Dec. 8 (AP)—A man, with 70 per cent of his skin burned away by fire, was saved from death by the wonder hormone ACTH, the American Medical Association has been advised.

It was a near miracle that he lived. Loss of half your skin almost always is a painful death sentence. But there were six other near miracles, an exhibit and pictures by Dr. M. James Whitehead, Phoenix, Ariz., revealed.

The man was freed from dreadful pain. He escaped shock and poisoning. He had relatively little scarring. He escaped crippling of muscles that comes from contracted scar tissue, and he survived pneumonia and appendicitis.

Perhaps most miraculous of all, grafted skin from other persons took root and spread on his own body. This kind of successful grafting, except in identical twins, is something new in medical history.

The man is T. C. Gains, son of a rancher near Parker, Ariz., who is scheduled to make personal appearances at the fourth clinical session of the AMA this week.

His recovery, and that of a few other burned people since, holds out promise of a new treatment in burns. Burns are one of the common, and most serious, of battlefield wounds. Gains contributed another near miracle in his own courage. He was burned when gasoline caught fire as he was filling the tank of a tractor, and a farmhand lit a cigarette. The gas spilled over young Gains. Men caught him as he ran, beat out the flames.

His whole body, above the belt, front and back, his buttocks, right leg and hands were burned severely. His left leg, arms, face and neck were burned less badly.

Gains received ACTH for 22 days, getting a total of about one-seventh of an ounce of the precious hormone, costing some \$100.

Gains' story has a completely happy ending. He was married two weeks after he left the hospital.

The couple had found a house in Carey Chase, Md., on the outskirts of D. C., although the grounds do not compare with their ranch in Idaho, Welker says that "we just

had to have a house. I was raised in the west and I don't know what it is like to live in an apartment. We like large areas. As for exercise, Welker says he hopes to play some golf and, maybe, "borrow" Sen. Wayne Morse's horse" for riding purposes. His daughter, an accomplished rider, recently received a horse from singer Bing Crosby, but it will remain at home... The Welkers received flowers from several well-wishers on their arrival, including Sen. Kenneth Wherry of Nebraska, senate GOP leader, and Welker told the Times-News following his duties with GOP leaders that this country faces "the most serious time in its history. We must be Americans now rather than politicians. We must forget politics as usual and remember the kids in Korea."... He pledged cooperation with the President in everything worthwhile "for the country" but wants "some cooperation in return."

### Smog Posing L. A. Threat, Expert Says

**LOS ANGELES, Dec. 6**—Meteorologist Ericke has predicted a smog disaster which one day could kill at least 6,000 persons in the Los Angeles area unless smog control laws are revised. In a statement, Dr. Ericke, operator of a private weather forecasting service, cited the Donora, Pa., smog tragedy Oct. 20, 1948, which took 20 lives and left hundreds ill, and said: "Donora's population is 13,000. Ours is about 4,000,000. The Donora smog came largely from one plant. We have many. If the smog trend here continues upward, forecasting it will unless checked—a smog concentration of potency equal to that at Donora could mean the death of at least 6,000 persons. "Some day a catastrophe could occur here the like of which has had no parallel in history." Ericke was a witness at the state assembly hearings on smog here. He said the situation is so serious that "no one should stand on formalities to get it corrected and as soon as possible."

### Trappings Go Up, but Tree Price Steady

**WASHINGTON, Dec. 6**—Inflation prices of Yule trappings may make a big dent in your Christmas dollar, but your Christmas tree isn't likely to cost any more this year than last. That's what the department of agriculture said today after a coast-to-coast survey. The reason: Retailers have not forgotten 1949 when rebellious consumers refused year retailers a job of unsold stock on their hands when the Christmas season ended. The department says prices this year are likely to run from \$1 to \$1.50, depending on the species and size of the tree. On the basis of similar prices retailers last year crossed \$20,000,000 on the sale of 28,000,000 trees. Demand is expected to be modestly higher this year. Canada, as in past years is expected to furnish about 7,000,000 trees for the American market. The rest will be harvested domestically. Red-barked holly, however, will be harder to get this year. And the price will be higher. Washington and Oregon, which supply a big share of the nation's holly output, has a short crop this year as the result of adverse weather last winter. Holly, which last year sold for \$1.50 a pound is expected to reach \$2 this Christmas.

**BURLEY, Dec. 6**—Magic Valley cattlemen Saturday took part in the second annual sale sponsored by the Idaho Cattlemen's association at Weiser. Over 100 bulls were sold for \$44,000. The average was \$22.17 apiece. Walter Schmidt, Burley, was sales manager, and E. O. Walker, Piler, was auctioneer. Leon Weiler, Boise, secretary, said the sale this year topped last year's sale by an average of \$200 a head. Sold for \$22.85 were 30 grade A bulls for an average price of \$720.00. Twenty-five grade B bulls brought \$14,720 for an average of \$589.00, and 18 grade C bulls sold for \$7,245 for an average price of \$402.50. The top price of \$1,252 was paid for a bull sold to Theron Adcock, Oreson.

### Boost for Parcel Post Rate Asked

**WASHINGTON, Dec. 6**—A postoffice department official today urged the interstate commerce commission to approve parcel post rate increases averaging 25 per cent to eliminate an annual \$100,000,000 deficit. Deputy Assistant Postmaster-General Nelson B. Wenzel said the proposal rates will help "substantially" in making parcels pay their own way. The department may apply either to congress or the interstate commerce commission for changes on fourth class rates. "Congress is reluctant to boost the rates, but directed the department to ask the commission for such increases as may be necessary to insure revenue sufficient to pay the cost of such service."

**CHICAGO, Dec. 6**—(AP)—Military personnel in uniform will be offered reduced round trip fares on the nation's railroads during the Christmas holiday season. The fares, good in coaches, will be cut for the servicemen and women from Dec. 15 to Jan. 10. They will be at the rate of 2 cents a mile and will have a return limit of Jan. 15. The cut in fares was approved at a meeting of the Transportation Passenger association. The reduced fares compare with 3.312 cents a mile in the east and 25 cents in the west.
