Wood Product Boosters Test Sawdust Food

SPOKANE, Dec. 7 (AP)—Members of the Timber Products bureau, who meet once a week and talk nothing but wood, finally said their word Wednesday. They spread it on bread and said it "tasted just like sawdust."

The staff was "wowed" by the spread of pine tree sawdust that is spruced up in a laboratory and comes out like a white, sweet and digestible.

I. V. Anderson of the government's experiment station at Missoula, Mont., added the syrup to the lunch-room menu of the bureau, a Chamber of Commerce committee. The report from the U. S. forest products laboratory in Madison, Wis., where it was developed.

"I'm not trying to push it for human consumption," he said. "I think it may have a big future as a cattle feed."

Some heads the forest products service at Missoula, said inland empire loggers have been burning up a fortune in "rotting wood" since the turn of the century. One ton of sawdust will produce to about 200 gallons of the syrup.

Lumber Industry Is Ready to Increase Production Rates Despite U. S. Curbs

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 7 (AP)—The lumber industry is ready to produce as it never has produced before, the Western Forestry and Conservation association was told Wednesday.

Several speakers at the association's annual convention here complained that the federal government is going wrong to smother the industry's growth.

Richard A. Colgan, Jr., Washington, D. C., executive vice president of the National Lumber Manufacturers' association, told the delegates the lumber industry stands ready to produce to its maximum capacity, but the machinery has been forced to stand idle because of the lack of specific directions or plans.

Colgan complained that the government has "thrown a web of control around the nation's business economy and has knocked that economy sharply out of focus."

Other speakers said the "curbs" on cuts in an emergency were presented to leaders of the woods' "number one" interests and representatives of public forestry agencies.

Some 500 representatives heard Lyle Watts, chief of the United States forest service declare: "It may be many, many years before we are again permitted to pursue our ways in peace. It is essential, therefore, that we keep ourselves strong in basic resources."

Watts said there would be "tremendous and continuing demands on the forests," but "we have enough land to do the job, provided we manage that land well."

He said the yearly cut can be increased in the "timberland forests" as much as 32,500,000 board feet a year, but first \$1,211,000 must be appropriated for "road construction to make the new areas accessible."

American lumber industry stands ready to produce for any emergency that might be ahead, R. A. Colgan, executive vice president of the National Lumber Manufacturers' association, told the convention.

"If military and civilian defense demands should call for it, the out-

put could be increased even above the phenomenal August rate"—highest in 20 years—he said.

Watts denied reports that the forest service would become a regulatory agency for the wood products industry in an emergency.

"The powers and duties of the federal government under the defense act as they relate to forest industry," he said, "will be focused in the department of commerce."

"However, the chief forester added, "I can tell you that the strength of our organization will be maintained and brought to bear on any and all problems of forest products requirements and supply that may develop... The forest service wants to see defense requirements met without unnecessary damage to the resource."

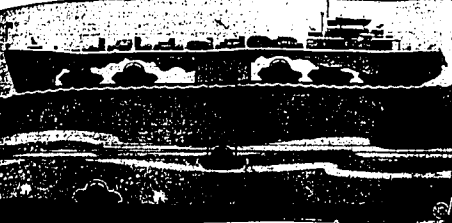

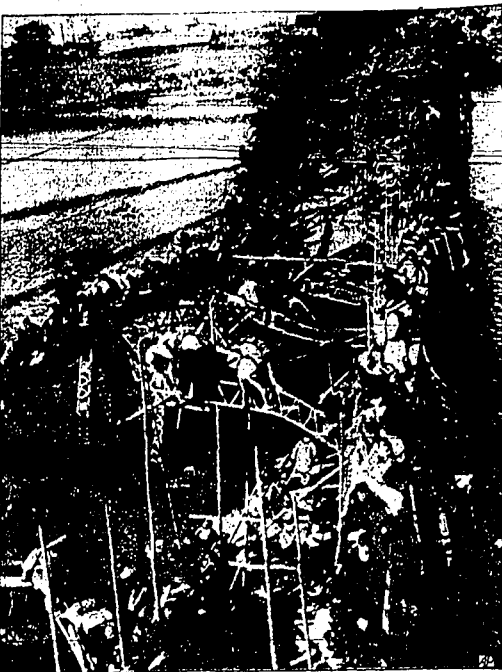
Lean Starved

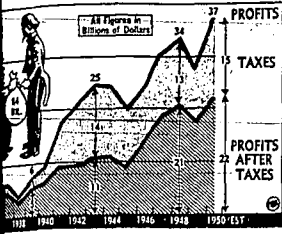
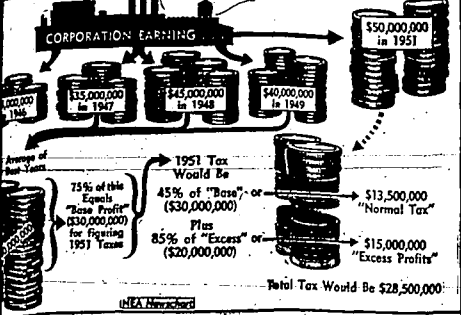

Baby Bonus in U. S. Urged at Youth Meeting

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—Some countries the government may be called a "baby bonus" to every youngster in the nation. A suggestion was made Wednesday that the U. S. should do the same thing.

The idea came up at the mid-century conference on children and youth, a shopper of an affair with 6,000 delegates. Their aim: to find ways of developing healthy personalities for youngsters.

Export Controls On Shipments to China Tightened
WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—The commerce department tightened its controls on exports to red China again yesterday amid angry demands by U. S. senators that the U. S. and Britain impose absolute embargoes against such trade.

The department would be interested in some coverage by China, Hong Kong and Macao—highly developed under general export licenses before exports of all kinds to those places were brought last week-end under license controls that previously covered only "strategic" commodities.

Doctor Scoffs At High Blood Pressure View

By ALTON L. BLAKESLEE
 CLYDELAND, Dec. 9 (AP)—Relax, you may not really have high blood pressure, even if your blood pressure reading was called high.

For many so-called "high" blood pressure may be normal, if you sit in the doctor's office.

Dr. Arthur M. Master, heart specialist of Mount Sinai hospital, New York, said today.

There seems to be a widespread phobia or worry about high blood pressure, he told the American Medical Association's clinical session, designed primarily for family doctors.

New Standards

Blood pressures of more than 7000 persons were analyzed in a study to set up new standards of what constitutes high blood pressure or hypertension, he reported.

The lower limits for hypertension thus established are higher than are generally accepted. It may be unnecessary to attempt to lower the blood pressure if it is within the new normal range for the age and sex of the person being studied.

Women over 45 usually have slightly higher blood pressure than men of the same age, he added.

Allergy Blame

In another report, Dr. Arthur J. Horech, assistant professor of pediatrics at Western Reserve University School of Medicine, said it might be an allergy that makes a child a bed actor.

Often, he said, children with behavior problems change their whole attitude when the thing they are allergic to is found and removed. The allergy might be due to some food, to dogs, cats, feathers, overstuffed furniture or other things.

The allergy might cause hay fever, eczema, hives, colic, diarrhea or susceptibility to colds and bronchitis. A child may lose his sensitivity to the offending substance if it is removed, early in his life.

Nearly Blind Vet Beats Whole Nation in Organizing Defenses

NEW YORK, Dec. 9 (AP)—Bob Lackey, a nearly blind war veteran who figures he "beat the whole country to the punch" in setting up a civil defense program for his area, took advantage of today's Pearl Harbor anniversary to alert even more of his neighbors.

"I distributed close to 3,000 throw-away cards telling the people to sign up tonight for their preparation insurance," Lackey said. "Their premium is just one hour a week of their time devoted to preparing for an atomic attack."

He was picked as director of civil defense for the village of Levittown, a sprawling, post-war housing development on Long Island with a population of 55,000, even though he is totally blind in one eye and can barely perceive light and shadow through the other.

"I'm not trying to sell anybody a bill of goods," the 39-year-old veteran said. "But if we get caught like we did the last time, nine years ago, we won't be so lucky."

He already has civil defense offices set up in three public schools and two village grocers. A special alert was civil defense radio station, the first in the country, also is ready.

The federal communications commission has prohibited us a license, but it hasn't come yet," Lackey said. "It was a shock to them that anyone set up so quickly."

He managed it by contacting amateur radio operators and getting them to donate time and equipment for the station.

"We tested it when we had the terrible storm a little over a week ago," Lackey said proudly. "Within 25 minutes after I gave the alert the crew was operating the station, ready to take distress calls and arrange for evacuations from flooded areas."

His big problem is basements. Nobody in the housing area has a basement. Only a few big buildings have them.

"We'll have to get some of those ready-built shelters I guess," Lackey said.

"I'll need about 100 block wardens, and I hope I get most of them from volunteers who sign up tonight."

His civil defense job is done in his spare time, since he travels 30 miles into Manhattan each day to his job as a receptionist at the veteran's administration.

State Council Seeks Jobless Benefit Boost

BOISE, Dec. 7 (AP)—The state employment security council yesterday recommended increased weekly unemployment benefits extending over a six-month period of time.

In a resolution to be forwarded to Gov. C. W. McGowan and the industrial accident board, the nine-member council recommended that the maximum benefit be raised from \$10 to \$20 weekly for a maximum of 26 weeks.

Payment Cut Three

The group also approved an expenditure rating schedule for employers' tax and recommended a reduction in payments for employers having a record of stable employment and few employees dropping out.

Minimum tax is now 1 1/2 per cent and the council recommended it be reduced to 3/4 per cent for some employers.

Frank A. Rhea, Episcopal bishop of Idaho, endorsed adoption of a plan by the unemployment benefit scale ranging between a minimum of \$10 to a maximum of \$20 weekly.

Payment Has Surplus

The employment security fund now has a surplus of more than \$7,000,000.

The council recommended that employers tax range from 3/4 per cent to 2 1/2 per cent with 3 per cent difference between classes of employers. Employers are based now between 1 1/2 per cent and 2 1/2 per cent with a 4 per cent difference between classifications.

H. P. Garrett, executive director of the ESEA, explained that the rate of tax would be based upon the employer's actual experience in unemployment.

Historical Group Presents College Bible of Whitman

SPOKANE, Dec. 7 (AP)—A 115-year-old family Bible, purchased and used by the parents of Marcus Whitman, was presented Wednesday to Whitman college by the historical society.

Dr. Chester C. Myers, president of Whitman, accepted it from Dr. Joel Ferris, president of the Eastern Washington Historical society.

Dr. Ferris described the book as "extremely rare, a collector's item" which would command a high price in the hands of a dealer.

The book is the gift of Miss Elona N. Underwood, Fern, W. Y., a good niece of Marcus Whitman. It was sent to the society for presentation to Whitman college.

The Bible was printed in Philadelphia in 1808 when Dr. Whitman was 6 years old. He and his family were killed by Indians at the Whitman mission in 1847.

Presentation of the Bible was made at a meeting of the Whitman college committee which is working with the Marcus Whitman foundation on plans to install a statue of the missionary in the hall of fame at Washington, D. C.

Hull Blasts Red Threat to Peace

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—"You know what I said about the Japanese at Pearl Harbor... that's exactly how I feel about the situation today."

Cordell Hull, elder statesman who as secretary of state administered tongue-lashing to Japan's peace envoys after the Pearl Harbor attack nine years ago today, yesterday voiced his feelings about communism's threat to the democratic world.

"I feel the same," he added, "to ward other godless peoples who would subjugate the world by force. The bitter days are the same whether they are dumped out from Tokyo, Moscow, or any other citadel of ignorance, bigotry and hate."

Hull was interviewed at his home here by Gordon Turner of the Nashville Tennessean who is attending the White House conference on children as a delegate from Tennessee. The Tennessean published the interview in a copyrighted article.

Hull said today's situation is darker than it was before Pearl Harbor.

U. S. Retail Food Prices Increase

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—Retail food prices increased 0.7 per cent in the first two weeks of November, the bureau of labor statistics estimated Wednesday.

Increases in prices of fresh fruits and vegetables were mainly responsible for the rise. Small price changes for other food groups were mixed, with rice recorded in 20 items, drops in 20 items, and no change in the prices of two others.

On the basis of its survey of 39 foods in eight cities, the bureau estimated the retail food price index on Nov. 15 to be 205.5 per cent of the 1913-19 average. That was 2.3 per cent above the June 15 index, just prior to the outbreak of the Korean war.

New Setup Urged On Civil-Defense

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—Spokesmen for 10,000 cities and towns called on congress Wednesday to scrap the present civil defense administration. They urged instead a department of civil defense in the Pentagon on even terms with the army, navy and air force.

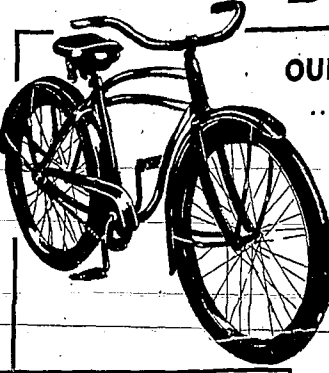

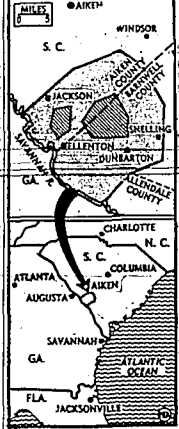

Pearl Harbor Anniversary Finds U. S. Facing Grave Threat of World War III

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 (AP)—Nine years ago today the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor and catapulted America into World War II. Dec. 7, 1941... In the words of Franklin D. Roosevelt, it marked "a day that will live in infamy."

Today, the parallel between them and now stands forth in the light of a grave new crisis arising from the assault of a Chinese communist army in Korea and the lines of Soviet arms massed half across the world.

Is the United States prepared for World War III if it should come? Carefully weighing both sides of the question, military and diplomatic experts said the nation's prospects for war today is vastly greater, in many respects, than in 1941.

But—and this they emphasize—there are tremendous handicaps and hazards that would have to be overcome now in an all-out war against Soviet Russia and her allies, compared to the war against the Tokyo-Berlin-Rome axis power.

On the one side:

1. In manpower, the Soviet over-shadowed the United States and its allies about two to one. In December, 1941, the ration was roughly 12 to 1 in favor of the allies against the axis.
2. "Old" today "old" western powers know their warships "better" than the United States and its allies. They boast of an "impenetrable" Maginot defense that crumbled like puffballs under the wheels of the Nazi war machine.
3. Strategically, Russia and the Red satellite nations already have the advantage in any immediate war that might erupt in Asia or Europe. Once again, the United States would have to fight on distant fronts.
4. Politically, Russia is known to have built up a vast, interlocking network of communist spy and sabotage rings. Officials have no doubt that a dangerous "fifth column" would have to be reckoned with, especially in Europe.
5. Much depends, of course, on the all-important element of time.
6. If the Kremlin holds back, every month gained will mean that much more insurance against the conquest of Europe where the odds now are well stacked in the Soviet favor.

Why, if Russia is bent on world domination, does the Kremlin refrain from its vast land armies from an all-out assault?

Experts say there may be two primary answers:

First—That Russia, still struggling

Aid to Mines Promised by New Bureau

NEW YORK, Dec. 7.—James Boyd, chief of the new federal minerals administration, promises full federal help to mining operators who will increase production of defense materials.

- Boyd told the annual meeting of the American Mining Congress the FDMA, under the department of interior, can help mine operators:
1. Get a government guarantee of a private loan for mining work.
 2. Get a government loan.
 3. Obtain contracts for disposing of their output at satisfactory prices.

Fourth Method Available
A fourth method of obtaining aid is available under the internal revenue act of 1930. This allows an operator to apply for his income tax and get a credit for his plant or for his equipment under certain conditions. This aid is available through the national securities production board.

"We must get the maximum production possible, every available pound, from existing facilities immediately," Boyd said. "Second, we must create new sources—to develop known but unworked deposits—to meet the continued expanding demands of mobilized economy. And third, we must make concentrated effort to find additional deposits of ore."

Priority Metals
Boyd said the FDMA will give priority consideration to projects designed to produce these commodities:

- Antimony, selenium, beryllium, chromium, cobalt, chromium-tantalum, copper, corundum, fluorapatite, graphite, manganese, niobium, denium, nickel, platinum group metals, sulphur, talc, tungsten and zinc.
- He said the list may be changed as defense needs change. Applications for government assistance should be sent to him at the interior department, Washington, Boyd said.

No Field Staffs
The FDMA will not maintain a field staff but will rely upon the bureau of mineralogical survey teams in various districts.

Boyd said field headquarters will be established at: Juniper, Alaska; Spokane, Wash.; San Francisco; Denver; Minneapolis; Joplin, Mo.; Knoxville, Tenn.; College Park, Md.; and Washington, D. C.

AMA Opens Drive To Help Schools

CLEVELAND, Dec. 7 (AP)—The American Medical Association (AMA) launched a brand new million-dollar campaign Wednesday, this time to help medical schools train future doctors.

If money isn't raised privately to aid hard pressed schools, then federal government subsidies might be used, AMA officials said.

"And we don't want the government stepping in and telling medical schools how they should be run," they added.

The AMA has asked millions in fight compulsory health insurance, which it terms "socialized medicine." It put \$500,000 in the fight this today to start the new fund.

The announcement hit at federal subsidies of various kinds, and broadened the AMA's drive against what its leaders call the threat of government control of medicine and "overall trend toward state socialism."

Allied Aircraft Kills 2,350 Reds In Korean Battle

TOKYO, Dec. 7 (AP)—Allied aircraft claimed today more than 2,350 communist troops killed yesterday on the Korean war fronts in continuation of their devastating aerial assault.

U. S. fifth air force headquarters said its night bombers and fighters accounted for at least 1,100 of the reds killed during the day. An additional 500 communist casualties were inflicted by carrier-based marine pilots who raked seven troop concentrations. Moreover, they said navy pilots of task force 77 struck at 18 troop concentrations, inflicting heavy casualties.

Four F-51 fighter planes attacking the Sinuiju airfield were jumped by four Russian-built MIG-15 jet planes. After one ineffective diving attack, the MIGs broke off and left. A short time later four U. S. F-80 jet fighters engaged four other MIGs, but the enemy pilots refused to fight and fled into Manchuria.

Two hundred communist troops were reported killed in a single strike at Daegu, 200 more at Amhwa and 200 at Kwangju.

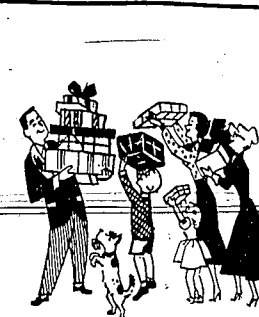

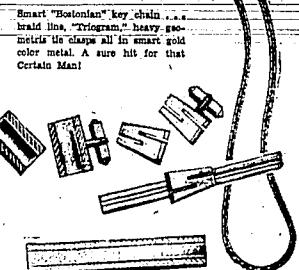
