TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Gen. Douglas MacArthur would be rebuked or relieved, according to a Washington source, if he publicly criticizes the War Relocation Authority, responsible for the care of Japanese-Americans, for its handling of the White House release of the general's press release.

The only reason he has not been rebuked or relieved is due to the fact that the general's press release was so carefully worded that it did not touch MacArthur's popularity on Capitol Hill and with the American people generally.

In all reports of the release, which many officers refused to write because they considered it a violation of military discipline, it would not assume direct responsibility for them or permit quotation.

It was admitted that the general might have been replaced in late October, had there been a White House concern over the reaction in the November election and its aftermath.

SETTLEMENT—MacArthur's offense at that time, in Washington, was that he insisted on waging a more aggressive campaign against the red than American or European officials thought proper. The settlement was that the general was to be placed on the ground that it jeopardized the possibility of a general agreement with Stalin.

It was thought that the general would be a think-it-over man, but it is now clear that he is a man who is willing to make a last, desperate effort to save off a world war.

STATEMENTS—MacArthur's more recent offense was that he had been quoted in American magazines and newspaper correspondents as to learn the real truth of the military and diplomatic treaty which finds the small, so-called United Nations army "beastly" by overweighing red hordes, and possibly facing a fate worse than handed out to the Japanese.

Violating the policy-military code that imposes a discreet silence on field commanders except for a question of discipline, MacArthur has divulged information that has been withheld at Washington from congress, the press and the American people.

He felt forced to do so, obviously, because of criticism voiced of him by his own countrymen in the foreign offices of London and Paris.

BLAME—Mr. Truman denied indignantly that there has been any "taping at MacArthur" by Secretary Acheson. He said that the general's conduct for the public and punctilious Acheson has not stung in the anti-MacArthur circle.

There is a tremendous denials cannot change the fact, as a score of factual and conscientious newspaper reporters will testify, that Acheson's aides have tried to shift the blame for the Korean debacle and its even more dangerous world predicament, from Washington to Tokyo.

UMT Support Is Granted by School Group

COLUMBIA, Mo., Dec. 8 (AP)—The Association of American Universities has adopted unanimously a resolution opposing universal military training and service for 18-year-old youth.

The resolution said the international character of a period of "high level tension for the next decade or more, demands that the military strength of the United States may be a vital factor in the prevention of a global war."

The action was announced by Dr. Frederick A. Mittlebach, University of Missouri president who also is president of the association.

The association pointed out that that defense department estimates call for a standing armed force of 2,500,000 to 3,000,000 men and added: "This requirement will demand that the services of all able bodied men be made available as they become of military age."

The resolution proposed also that all industries, after completing the required period of training be referred to reserve organizations "for a period of years."

Extension of the selective service act, with certain amendments, for 10 years also was recommended.

Board Looks Over Sites for Academy

MCHORD AIR FORCE BASE, Wash., Dec. 8 (AP)—An air force selection board in completed inspection of two proposed sites in western Washington for the air force academy.

The board, headed by Gen. Carl A. Spaatz, visited McChord base and Lake Sawyer, 25 miles southeast of Seattle in King county. The four-man air force academy site selection board (CAVTS) will leave today for Portland, Ore., to investigate another proposed site near that city.

Some 354 locations have been proposed for the air force's equivalent of West Point and Annapolis. A survey conducted by the chief-of-engineers limited the field to 29 locations. The board has 12 of these yet to visit.

Details of Mail Theft Revealed

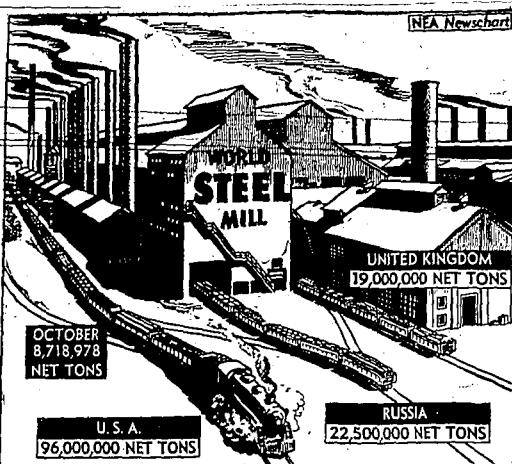
PORTLAND, Dec. 8 (AP)—The Oregonian reported yesterday it had learned some details of the "under \$50,000" theft of mail from Portland and Umatilla, Ore.

The newspaper said the amount was between \$40,000 and \$50,000 sent by the Federal Reserve bank at Portland to the Inland Empire bank in Umatilla.

The newspaper did not disclose its source of the information, but said postal inspectors did not give any details.

Postal authorities yesterday had announced they were investigating the disappearance of "under \$50,000" from the mails.

U. S. Sets Steel Output Mark



The United States turned out more steel in the month of October than in any previous month in history, according to the American Iron and Steel Institute. Newschart above shows the October output was more than one-third of the estimated 1950 production of Russia alone and nearly half as much as Great Britain is expected to produce this year. Steel spokesmen say the U. S. will turn out 96,000,000 net tons in 1950.

Ship Dispute Is Reported Settled

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 8 (AP)—A spokesman for the Oliver J. Olson company today reported settlement of a dispute which had tied up the company's ships in northwest ports.

The company source said the international longshoremen and warehousemen union withdrew its demands for 15-man gangs for handling cargo. Ordinarily 12-man gangs are used on schooners of the Olson size.

ILWU officials declined to comment.

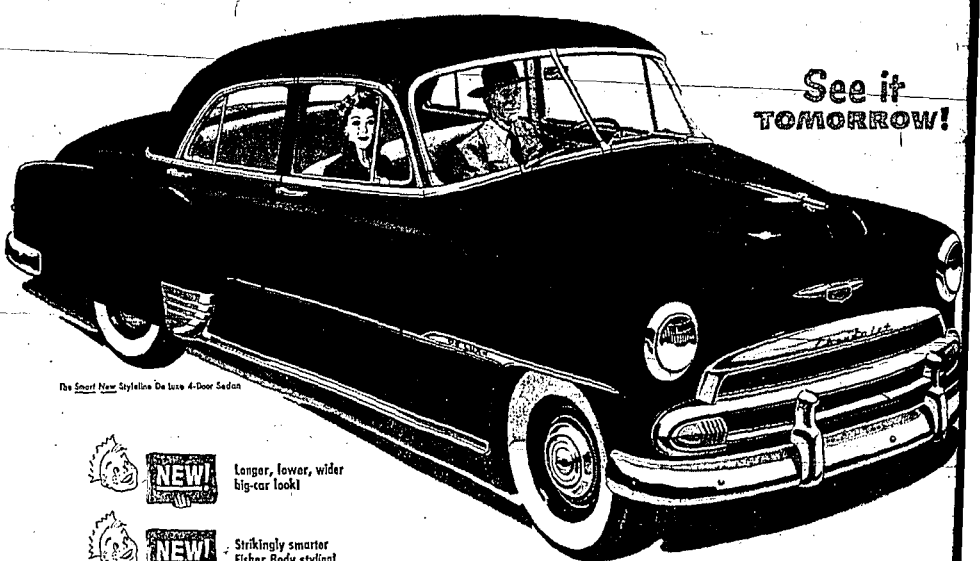
