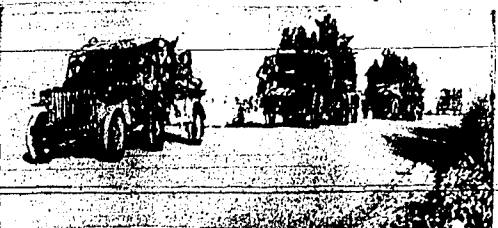

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—In a sharp and amazing reversal of the Truman policy favoring the growth of "small business," the federal trade commission now seeks to smother the growth of "little fellows" to the wall and promote the expansion of many of the nation's industrial concerns.

In view of the apparent inconsistency of the FTC's clashing decrees, and the fact that no member of this agency has any real business or industrial background or experience, it is suggested that it should be renamed the "federal anti-trade commission."

FUNCTIONAL—The FTC's latest decree is directed against what is known as "functional pricing." Although it is a highly technical matter, so simple that it lies at the foundation of our laboriously built industrial system.

"Functional pricing" is the granting of special prices when the article in question is used as a component part of another article. It is a "quantity discount" and is sometimes confused with it, but it is quite distinct. The manufacturer of radio tubes, for example, grants a "quantity discount" to the manufacturer of radio sets who takes care to buy a "quantity discount." It may offer another discount to manufacturers who buy the tubes in large quantities.

The FTC has already challenged some quantity discounts and now it is challenging functional pricing.

PLUGS—The current litigation happens to involve three spark plug companies which make essential parts for hundreds of firms which make such auxiliary articles as gears and rubber heels for shoes, buttons and bows, just to name a few.

Hundreds of firms are in these fields, and they must sell and sell in billions of units every year. It is the industrial system frequently described as "bits and pieces," and under which several hundred different articles are assembled into an automobile as a central plant.

TARGETS—The immediate targets of the FTC are the AC, Auto-ite and Champion spark plug companies. AC is a wholly-owned General Motors subsidiary, the second largest spark plug company in the world, and a big customer for Ford. It makes only spark plugs, nothing else.

Incidentally, the FTC makes no charge of price-fixing or conspiracy against these firms. It simply maintains that they cannot sell cheaper to manufacturers than to retailers. But also says that retailers scattered around the country. If FTC makes its order stick, hundreds of firms in other lines will be affected.

MARKETS—What will happen if these relatively small supply companies cannot continue to give the price advantage to big buyers? The answer is obvious. The big companies will turn to their own suppliers, the big plants will obtain the same by buying their own plants for manufacture of these parts. Ford will make its own spark plugs.

Shoe firms will fabricate their own laces and rubber heels. Garment makers will turn out their own buttons and zippers and sell them to their own makers. Vertically and hundreds of small suppliers will fold up for lack of markets.

DELAY—The most serious and immediate damage will be dealt to the attempt to mobilize industry and agriculture on a national basis. The delay in progress on two fronts, if FTC's scheme should be permitted by the courts to go into effect.

It is not hard to place the restriction and disruption will delay output of planes, tanks, trucks, jeeps, heavy artillery and even small arms. Few of our military supplies are made in this country. The cost of every weapon, piece of equipment, uniform and ration will drop above present day levels.

Should the FTC declare against functional discounts after current arguments, Congress undoubtedly would override such a decision, at least in the long-run, point dispute.

NO TIME TO BE STUBBORN
President Truman has reacted in characteristic fashion to the Republican gains in the recent election.

It may be that President Truman has decided that "good offense is the best defense" in his coming battles with congress. By proving his demands for "fair deal" domestic legislation as though nothing had happened in the election, he may have to drive better bargains in the field of foreign policy than otherwise might be possible.

It is also possible, however, that by taking an unyielding stand on his entire program—foreign and domestic—the President may create the impression that it will try to scuttle the whole administration plan. The United States and the world.

Farming Instructor Describes Trip to Florida School Tract

A visit to a school farm for vocational agriculture students was among the highlights of Ralph Edwards' trip to Miami, Fla. Edwards, agriculture teacher and PFA sponsor at the Twin Falls high school, represented Idaho at the annual American Vocational association convention in Miami.

In Chicago, he attended the international livestock exposition and saw every type and breed of swine, sheep and beef. He also saw a Hereford bull which later sold for \$100,000. In Miami he attended meetings, luncheons and tours for vocational agriculture teachers five days.

Edwards was interested especially in the 80-acre school farm, where 130 ninth to twelfth grade students come from Miami-Edition and Miami-Jackson schools for two hours of instruction daily. Class, shop and laboratory work is performed. Practical projects are provided for students needing them.

The farm is operated strictly on business basis with students financing their projects or putting up a deposit. If a student does not do for his project, property is taken over by his PFA chapter, or sold to another student.

Examples of charges to students are two cents per chick for fryers, one cent per dozen eggs, 30 cents per month on livestock, \$1 an hour for tractor use, and 10 per cent of labor income, not to exceed \$10 per acre rent per crop on vegetables.

Another point of interest was a visit to a hypersons farm, where crops are grown without soil. The crop nutrients are placed in water, which in turn feeds the plant.

The farmers around Miami are planning their crops now. They grow beans, corn, tomatoes and cucumbers. Edwards stated it reminded him of scenes around the Twin Falls farming area in May and June.

Road Safety Discussed at Burley Meet

BURLEY, Dec. 13.—Sheriff Paul Clark and State Patrolman Marvin Snyder were speakers at the meeting of the Burley Rotary club Thursday noon. They discussed the safety driving program being conducted in high schools of Idaho.

Both speakers favored the accident driving courses as a help in avoiding careless drivers among the teenage group. Patrolman Snyder said that fatal accidents are 16 to 21 years of age who had not been taught the laws and correct methods of driving.

Student driving schools are helping to reduce traffic accidents, Snyder said.

Idaho has had 216 fatalities so far this year, he said. This is a 63 per cent increase over last year. There have been 9 fatalities in Cassia county and 5 in Blaine county so far this year, he added.

Sheriff Clark backed up Snyder's statements on the importance of student drivers' schools, claiming it was the only way to reach young drivers. Clark urged the addition of such courses to the curriculum of each officer in the budget.

Both Clark and Snyder praised the safety driving program being carried on in Magic Valley. The publicity given the drive has helped to reduce fatalities because both the people and officers have been more traffic conscious and are on their toes to help promote the program, they said.

Clark also urged the establishment of a state training school for law enforcement officers where every officer, from top officials to constables, could attend training courses each year.
