## Truman Talk to Blueprint Buildup Plan, Dewey Asks Fast and Full Mobilization

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15 (AP)—President Truman calls on Americans tonight to unite in greater sacrifice behind the critical effort to build up the free world's military might. The tempo of that effort already was being speeded up rapidly, but members of congress and others were demanding definite manpower and production goals.

NEW YORK, Dec. 15 (AP)—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey last night demanded an immediate mobilization of American military and productive might to stem the spread of communist aggression. In a speech before the New York County (Manhattan) Lawyers association, the governor urged universal military training, a U. S. army of 100 divisions, all out production for arms and a pay as you go policy to crack down on inflation. The governor also urged immediate call-up of 25 new inactive national guard divisions.

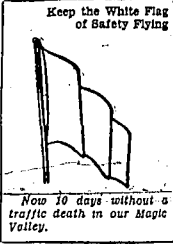

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15 (AP)—The United States took a forward step in the atomic race with Russia yesterday, announcing a three-nation agreement to promote the recovery of uranium as a by-product of South African gold.  
 The agreement was reached with Great Britain and the Union of South Africa, the atomic energy commission announced.  
 Four South African mining firms will produce the rare element, prime source of atomic energy, and the United States and the United Kingdom undertake to buy it. If necessary, they will lend money to cover the costs of the uranium processing plants.

**Good News**  
1. The bulk of the 6,000-man United Nations army to north-east Korea expected to check, stop and withdraw successfully to the Hamhung beachhead. Gen. Douglas MacArthur visited the Korean fighting front and reported his command still undefeated and with morale high. He said United Nations forces in Korea still packed a terrific fighting punch.

2. Britain became the first of 16 European nations receiving U. S. help to get back on its financial feet. Britain announced no longer need Marshall plan aid after Jan. 1, 15 months ahead of schedule.

3. Republican and Democrat leaders met with President Truman and agreed the need for a "very rapid increase in our military strength." The conferees predicted an official new tempo in our mobilization efforts soon.

**Bad News**  
1. The official Chinese communist radio at Peking blasted, at least temporarily, hopes for an early peace in Korea. The broadcast repeated previous demands that the United Nations get out of Korea, that the U. S. get out of Formosa, and to end to western powers' armed expansion and war preparations in the East. The Chinese parliament received and was expected to pass unanimously a bill providing the death penalty for "warmongers." It was aimed particularly against West German cooperation with United Nations allies in the North Atlantic pact, and was timed to coincide with western efforts to incorporate German units in an Atlantic pact army to be commanded by Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower.

2. The U. S. air force noted indications the communist air force in Korea is starting to wage air war in Korea.

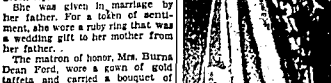

### Korean War Forces Shift Of U. S. View

By J. M. ROBERTS, JR.  
 AP Foreign Affairs Analyst.  
 The United States has been forced to shift from consideration of a new world war as an ultimate possibility to its presence as a constant threat.

The shift will hope that it can be averted for two or three years, when the western powers will be in a position to regulate it to their strength instead of from the weakness which now encourages Russia to the chances with such things as the Korean affair.

**Reasons Discussed**  
 "The reasons why it would seem that Russia should not precipitate a war now have been discussed in this column frequently. They include the old communist line that the western countries will eventually hang themselves in their own noose, permitting communists to walk in; that it is believed to be a challenge to the industrial strength of the west; that she is far from being the devastation; that she is having enough trouble trying to digest her post-war acquisitions.

But she has dared to risk what may yet turn out to be the sake of a relatively minor gain in Korea.

**Raise Adminis Controls**  
 She has just now boldly admitted her control of the Korean situation through Malin's statement at the U. N. that Chinese troops will withdraw from Korea if other foreign troops do likewise.

Nobody is quite sure just what was meant by Russia's announcement that she would not "tolerate" western German armaments, but it sounded mighty like the Chinese pronouncement some weeks ago that they would not stand idly by while the U. N. forces occupied North Korea.

Malininsky told the United Nations some time ago that an American decision to continue fighting in Korea would be to cast the die for World War III. Just how strongly he meant it was not clear.

But all in all, the hope of averting a new world war seems to lie in the possibility of facing Russia with an assailable strength before she is ready, rather than in negotiation. For Russia is now rather generally expected to strike, probably in Europe, when she feels ready.

**Both British Parties Join in Thanks To U. S. as Marshall Plan Aid Ends**

LONDON, Dec. 15 (AP)—Government and opposition spokesmen have joined in expressing thanks for Marshall plan aid to Britain, which is to be suspended Jan. 1.

Economic Boss Hugh Gaitskell said the American financial help was "one of the most important and generous, magnanimous acts in history."

On behalf of the opposition, Deputy Conservative Leader Anthony Eden told the house of commons: "No generosity could have been more freely given nor more warmly appreciated than that of the United States to us in the immediate post-war period."

Britain has been allotted \$2,684,000,000 under the program, which began in April 1948.

The early suspension of the aid is a sign that Britain, for the first time since World War II shattered her economy, may now stand free or free security on her own feet, or pay as she goes.

But, besides American dollars, this was accomplished by scrapping, doing without, and tight-lightening of ordinary Britons.

The nation's new defense program now brings up the prospect of further demands. Gaitskell, chancellor of the exchequer, told a news conference that the standard of living will be so much less, but at the same time the contribution which Great Britain can make to the western defense program will be so much larger.

What Marshall aid has done to bring Britain to her present state of relative economic security can be illustrated in figures for one year, 1949.

In that year, more than 13 per cent of all British imports were financed by Marshall aid. These imports represented two and a half per cent of the total resources available to the country then.

The United States dug down into its own pocket.

It has been estimated that, if the Marshall aid to Britain were divided among British families, each would get \$150.35.

In addition to imports, Marshall aid has contributed almost to many major capital projects, such as steel works and oil refineries.

The plan helped Britain to import such as well as materials. American experts in agriculture, animal husbandry and geological surveying created the Atlantic to give British scientists a helping hand.

William L. Batt, American minister in charge of the Marshall plan mission to Britain, said the technical aid will continue.

He emphasized Britain's dollar "some time."
