NEW YORK, Dec. 16 (AP) — War stocks raced ahead at high speed today in the market's first response to President Truman's mobilization call.  
 Orders to buy poured into Wall street from all parts of the country. Popular issues jumped \$1 to around \$4 a share in heavy trading.  
 Values Increase  
 The market value of all stocks listed on the exchange increased by around \$1,000,000,000.  
 Despite a recent diet of some of the grimmest news in years, the market closed with easy shooting distance of the highest level in 20 years.  
 Arms Stock Rise  
 Among the most favored issues were aircraft, textiles, rails, steel and motors—all of which, according to the way the market acted, would benefit from the rearmament program outlined by the President.  
 The advance caught the financial district completely off guard. Most of the experts had expected anything but a sensational advance, the largest since May 1934.  
 Traders obviously ignored the President's promise of steep tax increases, and wage and price controls.

**Pocatello Cancels 1949 Annexation**

POCATELLO, Dec. 16 (AP)—City officials have repealed an ordinance passed in 1949 annexing Phillips field in eastern Power county to the city.  
 Power county opposed the action. Thursday attorneys filed a petition in American Falls asking that district court declare the annexation null and void on grounds the area annexed was not adjacent to Pocatello as required by state law.  
 Mayor W. W. Halsey said the annexation ordinance had been adopted to bring all city owned lands within the municipal boundaries for insurance purposes.  
 "Since this condition has been corrected," he explained, "that arrangement is no longer considered necessary."

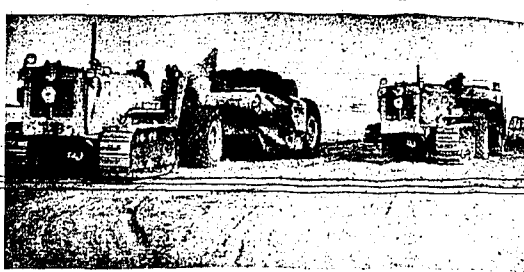

### Huge Land-Leveling Job Hikes Value of Farmland in Jerome

JEROME, Dec. 10.—Forty acres of land purchased recently by Leon Blockton, local farmer, underwent vast changes during the past two weeks of workable weather. Through assistance of technicians of the north side soil conservation district, who staked the farm and set up the plan for land leveling, the unproductive land has been turned into ideal farming property. Before Blockton purchased the land, it had no uniformity of slope on any of the fields. Production was low due to over-irrigation. Fence rows were high from drifting sands and four of the existing fields were small and had many potholes. The one large field had four separate potholes, making good irrigation almost impossible. Harold Harris, one of the technicians, explained that in laying out the land to make ideal farming conditions, the four small fields were combined into three fields and all potholes were eliminated. The one large field was leveled to water north on a uniform grade of four inches fall per 100 feet. Before the land was leveled, waste water could not be drained and could not be used on the farm. After leveling the waste water can be carried off through a new waste ditch, and part of it can be used to irrigate approximately seven acres of land. All old ditches were removed. New ditches will be constructed this fall and the banks staked to blue grass. The whole operation was done by the Halverson Construction company. More than 10,000 yards of dirt were moved from the high spots to the low spots. Four D-8 enter-

to grain in the spring and after the harvest seed it to alfalfa grass and red clover grass for a few years to build up the soil fertility. He also plans to practice conservation irrigation on the farm in the future. Blockton says that water, time, soil and labor in the future will be greatly saved by this tremendous land-leveling operation. Many who have observed the work say the whole operation has outlasted the value of the 40 acres.

### Initial Phase in Park Work Completed by City Employees

Aimed at beautifying the city park section at Shoshone falls and to provide a more satisfactory safeguard for tourists and sightseers who visit the falls, the city recently completed a new fence around the area. The 25-year-old pool, built almost entirely by hand labor, will be dismantled, filled in, leveled off and a lawn planted. Next the old tennis courts will be torn out

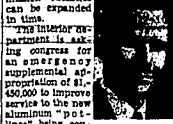

# Expanded Power Facilities Are Needed To Boost Northwest Aluminum Output

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16 (Special)—The Northwest, which already produces half of the nation's aluminum, is scheduled for a big boost in the output of this critical metal if electric power transmission facilities can be expanded in time.



The interior department is asking congress for an emergency supplementary appropriation of \$1,450,000 to improve service to the new aluminum "pot-lines" being constructed in Spokane, Wash., and Kootenai, Mont. A "pot-line" is a series of poles containing electrodes used in reducing the aluminum from the basic alumina.

Crossing northern Idaho the new lines in time will service projected war industries there. If present long range plans are carried out, this comparatively small appropriation will be used to break the power bottleneck which threatens to starve the aluminum plants in eastern Washington and western Montana. Both areas depend for their existence on electricity transmitted on "line number 5" from Grand Coulee to Spokane and ultimately through Burke, Ida., joining the Hungry Horse system in Montana.

These projected high tension lines had been originally planned for completion in 1933 but the unexpected industrial demands placed upon the aluminum mills in the two areas have necessitated finishing them a year earlier. The department warns that unless the small fund requested is promptly voted by congress production in the entire region may be curtailed sharply.

"Without the speedup that must be accomplished there will be a deficiency at Spokane in the summer of 1931 of 101 of 2,800 kilowatts transformer capacity, and by the summer of 1932 there will be a deficiency in transmission capacity between Grand Coulee and Spokane of the order of 10,000 kilowatts," John D. Davis of the Bonneville power administration told a congressional subcommittee on appropriations.

The new aluminum plants to be built in western Montana will be pinched even more than this because they depend on the same transmission line from Grand Coulee.

The seriousness of the growing power deficit is accentuated by the fact that the demand on the line from Spokane to east Montana will be in excess of 300,000 kilowatts by 1933. To move aluminum and magnesium production to any other part of the U. S. is virtually impossible.

Davis of the BPA, told congress,

"There is no power supply at present anywhere in the country for the production of aluminum."

At present American industry is only satisfying 65 per cent of its aluminum needs and the prospects are that even this percentage will be reduced as we shift toward full war production.

Chances for quick congressional approval of the request look excellent. At the semi-annual meeting adjourned the chairman, Hon. George C. Kilgus, U. S. noted that "unless this line goes through, it is going to mean a slowdown of our national defense."

In addition to the immediate need of more power for next year's gigantic rearmament program, it is longer run beneficial effect of integrating the hydroelectric potential of the Hungry Horse and Grand Coulee. Because no satisfactory link up between these two systems exists at present a minimum of 50,000 kilowatts of firm power are lost.

"There is not a single kilowatt of unused firm power left in the engineering with BPA said last week. For more than two years we have with interrupted power," he added.

Ordinarily "interruptible" power is defined as juice that can be depended upon for 11 months out of the year. Last year, however, some plants had out for as much as two months because of inability to use all the water potential in Hungry Horse and Grand Coulee.

Davis explained this with the following statement:

"Transmission capacity serving the Spokane area must be increased by the time indicated (summer of 1931) if these areas are to be served, because in addition to the industrial loads outlined, it is necessary that complete integration of the western Montana resources with those on the Bonneville main

# Life in MAGIC VALLEY

Many people think K210, which was established in 1928, was the first radio station in TWIN FALLS. Very few, however, who have a resident of the city since 1912, will argue with them that, what's more, will prove his point.

Spangler isn't certain exactly when the first station was in operation in Twin Falls but he's positive it was before he moved here. He guesses it was between 1907 and 1910 it wasn't but wireless station and it never worked because of some technical difficulty.

The first station in Twin Falls not only was the first station in this area but must have been one of the first in the country. Spangler is sure of this because the first Trans-Atlantic wireless message was sent on Dec. 12, 1907.

As a matter of fact, the 49th anniversary of the event was what caused Spangler to recall Twin Falls' first station. When Spangler came to Twin Falls he was interested in the Perrine hotel and he heard that the Perrine hotel had some equipment which it would sell. But the equipment was more than a pioneering "tham" could use. Nonetheless, Spangler looked it over and knew the story of the station.

Back around 1910, Spangler said, he was after a place to live in the mining town. Twin Falls was the closest large locality but, because of communication conditions, the two cities were two days apart. There were no telephones, no automobiles, no newspapers and no mail. He could only contact the two cities had was stage and horseback.

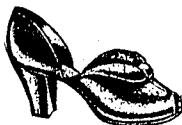

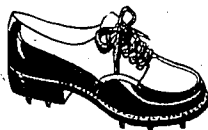
