WASHINGTON — The automobile manufacturers' announcement of higher prices for cars shocked the economic planners at the capital as violently as the Korean disaster upset the military man at the Pentagon.

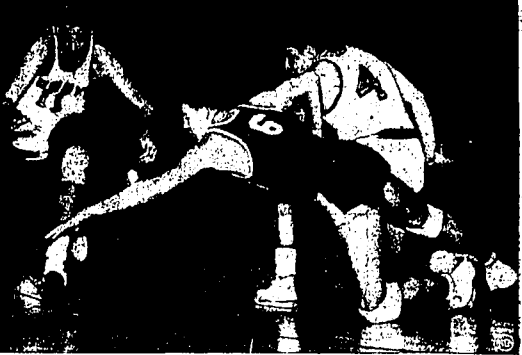
