Jordan Maps Austerity Program in Next Two Years by Slashing Budget, Asks 'SICE' Abolishment

From AP and UP Reports
 BOISE, Jan. 9—A program of austerity, with an announced slash in budget requests of \$1 out of every \$4 asked, was presented to the Idaho legislature today by Gov. Len Jordan. "I am resolved that Idaho shall not go into deficit spending..." said the Republican chief executive who took office a week ago. One of the more drastic of his recommendations called for elimination of the two Idaho teacher colleges as he asked for absorption of Northern Idaho College of Education, Lewiston, into the University of Idaho, Moscow, and Southern Idaho College of Education, Albion, into Idaho State college, Pocatello. The proposed consolidations would be effective June 30 this year.

Jordan's Program

This summary of recommendations made in Gov. Len Jordan's address to the state legislature was released by the governor's office in Boise. He asked for a total cut of \$100,000,000 from the current fiscal year budget of \$1,500,000,000. The program includes: 1. Elimination of the two Idaho teacher colleges. 2. Reduction of state payroll by 25 percent. 3. Cancellation of non-essential contracts. 4. Elimination of non-essential agencies.

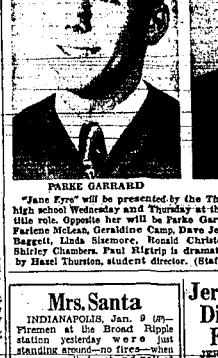
