

PUC Okays Pleas For Rate Boosts Of Motor Freight

BOISE, Jan. 11 (AP)—Rate increase applications submitted by two motor freight bureaus representing Idaho truckers have been approved by the Idaho public utilities commission. A 4 per cent hike on line haul rates and an increase from the present 45 cents per 100-pound minimum to 50 cents for loads under 5,000 pounds were approved. This application came from the Rocky Mountain truck line south of the Salmon river. The PUC said a hearing has been tentatively set for April 3 on a similar application from the Pacific Motor Tariff Bureau, Portland. A 4 per cent hike on line haul rates north of the Salmon. An application from the Inter mountain Coast Tariff Bureau, Denver, also was approved. This request was for an increase from 75 to 83 cents per 100 pounds at a minimum charge. Also requested was 50-cent minimum charge on shipments weighing less than eight pounds hauled between Salmon and Mackay. This application covers eastern Idaho north from Pocatello, the PUC said.

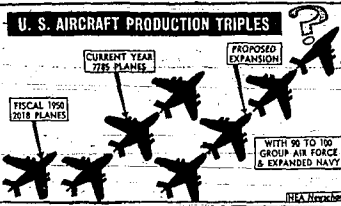

New Cadillac Is Displayed By Auto Firm

The 1936 Cadillac went on display this week at Barnard Auto company, Twin Falls. The new model of the Cadillac is similar to the 1935 model with some engineering design changes.

The major engineering change in the new model is in the hydraulic drive. The Cadillac company in its new models removed one of the major objections to the automatic drive by designing it so the car can be "rocked" to remove it from mud or snow in which it has been stuck.

The major change in front-end styling is in the "grille" which has been extended around the front fenders. Another change in the front-end styling is an enlargement of the "V" hood ornament.

Rear-end styling changes include the incorporation of back-up lights into the tail and stop light unit in the raised fin of the rear fenders. The more massive "V" ornament also decorates the trunk lid.

Interior styling changes include a completely redesigned dashboard. Features of the new dash are warning lights to replace gauges for oil pressure and generator operation and an ignition key starter.

Some models of the new Cadillac also have changes in floor-pannet design.
