37 Counties Hit by Polio In 1951 Toll

BOISE, Jan. 12 (AP)—Thirty-seven of Idaho's 44 counties had polio cases during 1950 as 161 cases of the crippling disease were reported. W. W. Benson, director of the public health department's bureau of vital statistics, said 11 deaths were recorded during the year, of which six victims were between the ages of 21 and 32. The other five deaths were among youngsters between the ages of 5 and 8. Twin Falls county listed four polio deaths. Two were from Bonanza and Bonneville counties and one each in Blaine, Orem, and Washington. Although the majority of victims attacked were between the ages of 5 and 9 years, the percentage of adults over 25 infected with polio increased from 14 per cent in 1949 to 19 per cent in 1950. A county break-down on the number of cases included Twin Falls, 18; Jerome, 10; Lincoln, 6; Cassia and Minidoka, 4 each; Gooding, 3; and Blaine and Elmore, 1 each. The seven counties not reporting cases were Boundary, Butte, Clark, Camas, Gem, Lewis and Teton.
