Escaped Prisoner Nabbed; Hostages Are Not Molested

Robert Lee Gilford, 36, Tombstone, Ariz., was captured in Willard, Utah, early this afternoon to end his wild flight from Twin Falls where he escaped from the county jail and forced three police officers to accompany him as hostages. Guy Banister, FBI agent at Butte, Mont., said Gilford was captured by FBI agents, local state and county officers. The desperado is being held by the sheriff's office in Brigham City after Twin Falls police requested the FBI to handle the matter. Banister said Gilford faces three charges of kidnaping, prosecution under the Dyer act for transporting a stolen auto across a state line and unlawful flight to avoid prosecution.

"That's all you know—I'm a lifer," Robert Lee Gilford scornfully told sheriff's deputies trying to talk him out of his shifty getaway. That was the report of Deputy Sheriff Ernie Lee, while his back still itched from the point of the desperado's highly-sharpened butcher knife. Interviewed shortly after his hair-raising escape, Lee said he and James Benham, chief deputy sheriff, tried to convince Gilford he was making a mistake, the charge against him might be reduced, the sentence wouldn't be more than 30 days. That's when Gilford snapped out he is a lifer. Lee said court action against Gilford, who was held in lieu of \$500 bond for allegedly slugging Kimberly slot machines, had been
