B-36 Bomber Sets Record In Air Time

PORT WORTH, Tex., Jan. 17 (AP)—A B-36 bomber set a record for the type of flying non-stop for 31 hours and 20 minutes but the plane's manufacturer refused today to say how many miles it flew or where it went.

Officials of Consolidated-Vulcan Aircraft corporation said the plane, an "X-36" reconnaissance bomber, took off from Carroll air force base here at 9:06 a. m. CST Sunday and landed at 12:25 p. m. yesterday.

A navy patrol bomber, the Tusolone, established a record of 11,236 miles in 1946 during a non-stop flight from Perth, West Australia, to Columbus, O. Its time aloft was 26 hours, 18 minutes.

If the B-36 cruised at 300 miles per hour, and its top speed is reported to be much higher, the plane would have covered more than 10,000 miles.

Refused Comment
General refused comment on a report published by the Fort Worth Star-Telegram that the B-36 had cruised in great circles over the Gulf of Mexico during most of the trip.

The standard B-36 model carries 21,300 gallons of gasoline. The longest announced non-stop flight of the B-36 was a 10,000-mile bomb bombing run from Carroll to Hawaii and back in 1940.

Another Milestone
Introduction of the new Chrysler engine, which first will go on all Chrysler division New Yorker and Imperial models, is another important milestone in the trend toward the V-type, high compression motor.

Named the "firepower" engine, the Chrysler V-8 has a compression ratio of 15 to one, but the company says it uses regular grades of gasoline with efficiency.

5 Years of Research
The "firepower" is the result of five years and millions of dollars worth of work by Chrysler's engineering division. It has a uniquely shaped combustion chamber, said to reduce the effect of cylinder head

deposits, and overhead lateral valves. Also unveiled at the corporation's annual press, radio and television show of its latest engineering advancements were power steering, air-cooled brakes and a new torque converter for use with the "firepower" motor.
