**OUR ACE IS INDUSTRY**

The nation's leaders and most responsible observers have been worrying a great deal lately about where America would stand if all foreign aid from the United States were cut off. The stress has been laid on the danger of letting the Communists grab the huge European industrial potential.

The worry is well grounded. Our per capita income multiplied many times over Europe's came under Soviet control. But in our emphasis on the grave risk, we must not assume that in such an event our cause would be hopeless. There is no need to adopt a defeatist attitude.

Russia already has an overwhelming superiority in numbers of men. With Europe in tow, it would add greatly both to its material resources and its industrial capacity. Yet the United States has the greatest rate of productivity—production per man-hour—of any nation in the world. During World War II, our man-hour output was three times that of either Germany or the Soviet Union combined.

Furthermore, and this fact has been carefully documented by economists who studied World War II, this country actually turned out more military or war goods than did the United States, Germany, Japan, Russia and Britain together. In other words, we outproduced both the enemy and our two principal allies.

And we did it while still allowing production for civilian purposes to rise above pre-war levels.

Today, of course, our position in this field is stronger than ever. Our productivity has risen considerably since the war. More than that, we have spent more on industry and research and development and are planning to spend another \$2 billion in 1951. America's capacity to produce is thus far beyond 1944.

You might, therefore, fairly ask: If we outproduced all the rest of the world, why do we have to be better off today, why worry about what happens to Europe?

Sticking strictly to economic and ignoring the severe political and military aspects, the answer should be held, here we have to have peace.

In terms of natural resources, the raw stuff of industrial output, we are not the country we were in 1945. Our coal, iron, copper, zinc, uranium and other minerals are now imported almost half our copper and rely heavily on foreign sources of aluminum. The prime source of our iron ore for decades has been the Mesabi range in Minnesota, but this is fast becoming an official old hat. World War II still regarded that "the last war which will be fought off the Mesabi." High-grade supplies have dwindled sharply.

Russia in possession of Europe would outflank Africa and the Near East, with their vital copper, uranium (or A-bomb), and oil. The Soviet threat undoubtedly would seek to strangle us by cutting off these materials, if possible. If it came to war, Russian submarines would menace our sea lanes to vital materials we now get from South America.

All that expenditure in money and men, we could develop low-grade iron ore and aluminum and other materials to offset this handicap to some extent. But that effort would actually take us to the pits economically. Our great World War II record was made with the help of friendly countries who could assure us most of the materials we needed. Without such help, we might be handicapped to bring our great producing talents into full use.

To lose this edge would perhaps throw us into a long stalemate with a Sovietized outside world, compelling us to organize into a garrison state. We have no guarantee we would emerge on top when this situation finally ended. But, on the other hand, we don't have to assume we'd lose the war. Our industrial know-how, even with only handhaps, is unmatched anywhere. It is our great reliance.

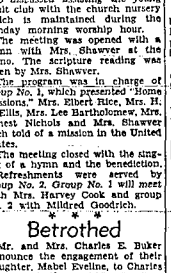

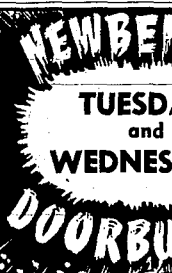

### Rubber Stock Held Plentiful For '51 Tires

By JOSEPH KUEHLER  
Industrial Editor  
AKRON, O., Jan. 22 (AP)—Barring a full-scale war, most manufacturing plants in this part of the rubber world believe American motorists will have an adequate, normal supply of tires in 1951.

A full-size year, of course, would change all estimates of the manufacturers' prospects. But aside from that, only one "if" is in the generally optimistic view.

"If there are no further waves of makers say passenger car owners should have little to worry about."

1950 Peak Year  
Last year was the greatest production year the rubber industry ever has experienced. Everyone agrees former passenger tires he made in 1951 simply because the amount of rubber available for civilian needs will be less. But there should be enough to go around.

The federal government has the final say now in the use of rubber. Last Sept. 1 it limited consumption of both natural and synthetic rubber to 80,000 tons a month, not counting military needs. It had been running well over 100,000-tons-a-month for some time. As yet defense orders are not a major factor.

Bote Importer  
Then the government announced it was becoming the sole importer and distributor of natural rubber. It also has a plan to take, federally owned, synthetic plants out of 16 plants was set up during the war at a cost of more than \$700,000,000.

The manufacturers agree the government's importing move will benefit both the consumer and the taxpayer. Natural rubber had been selling for a few months ago to a 25-year high of 50 cents a pound, but since then has been dropping.

### U. S. Forest Service Cuts '50 Fund

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 (AP)—The forest service has reported it is distributing \$2,343,000 to the states from the income from national forests during the year ended June 30, 1950.

Nearly \$11,000,000 of forest service funds will remain in the federal treasury.

The return to the states, which represents 26 per cent of the receipts from timber, grazing and other sources, is the largest amount on record; the forest service said in a statement.

"In addition to the cut of the earnings have been allocated for roads and trails in the forests and \$700,000 from grazing receipts was appropriated by congress for forest improvement.

Cross incomes from grazing fees on forest lands in the 1950 fiscal year was \$2,385,000. The sums returned to the states must be spent for schools and roads in a manner determined by each legislature.

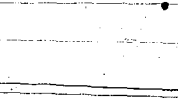

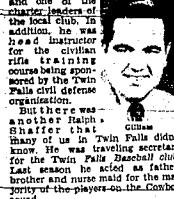
