Report Gives Jerome Weed Control Data

JEROME, Jan. 27.—Figures released by County Weed Supervisor Hiram Meacham show the county weed department destroyed a total of 69,939 gallons of carbon bisulfide during 1950. Of this amount farmers applied 11,825 gallons and county crews applied 57,200 gallons. Meacham said the total is somewhat smaller than used last year, showing Jerome county farmers are doing a steadily better job of weed control. A total of 73,144 pounds of sodium chlorate was distributed. Farmers purchased 45,449 pounds and county crews applied 27,195 pounds. County crews also applied 1,031 gallons of 2-D and farmers purchased 1,919 gallons for application, making a total of 2,932 gallons for 1950. This amount is an increase over the previous year. Meacham said. A total of 216.4 acres of land was cultivated for noxious weeds in 1950. 58.9 by farmers. Of this total 228 acres were put under cultivation in 1950 for the first time. 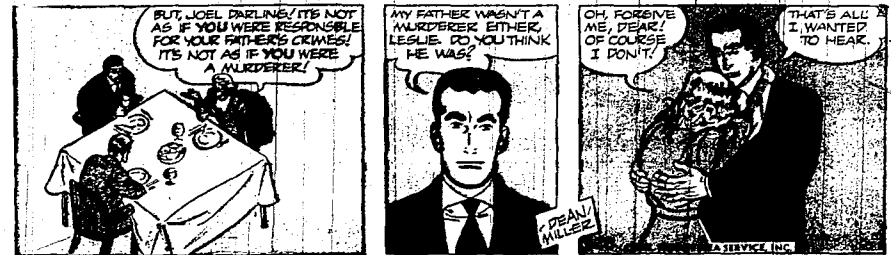
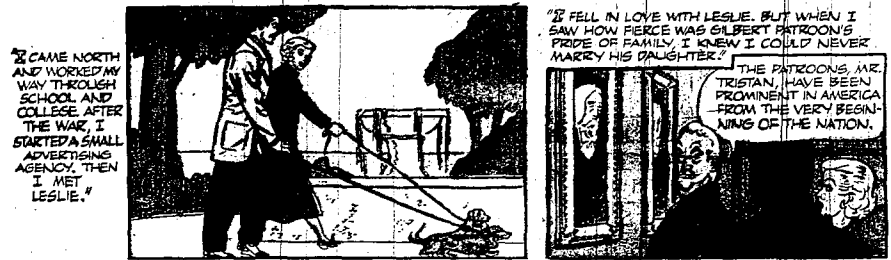
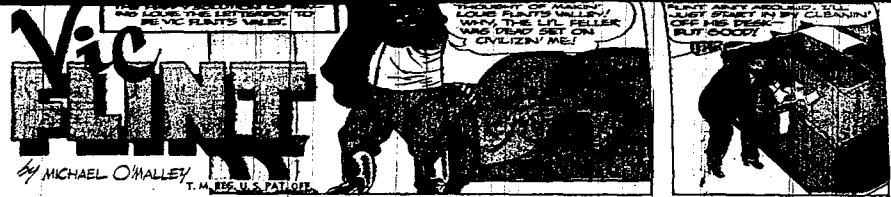

Higginbotham had to be prepared to meet the varied demands of his customers. His shelves were lined with food, clothing, hardware, cutlery, pins, flashhooks and candy. The store owner-farmer also was a carpenter and one of the buildings he erected in Filer, is the Methodist church.

In his spare time, he and his always seemed to have some. He was civic minded and interested in anything that helped Filer. He was a member of the first town board in 1909 and when the community advanced to city status he served on the city council. He also put in one term as mayor.

Higginbotham kept a diary and many interesting items of daily life in Filer tucked away in the pages of his day-by-day account. With an eye always to the future he even planned his funeral service, complete down to the last detail, and placed the plans in an envelope to be opened after his death.

His last wishes and instructions were carried out to the letter.
