Washington, Jan. 29 (AP)—The United States will withdraw from the United Nations, according to a speech by "Woods" Wilson, U. S. ambassador to the international organization in New York.

Wilson's speech, contained in a long, 20-minute broadcast on the radio, was one of the most scathing attacks against the United Nations since its inception. He said the United States had been deceived into joining the organization and that it had been used to support the interests of the Soviet Union.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29 (AP)—A new attack on disease, which—Congressional Leonard O. Schemm said—may lead to a new era in medicine has been launched by the public health service.

Secretary of the health service, Oscar R. Ewing, federal security administrator, said through the grants "the government is aiding research into the synthesis of and substitutes for ACTH and cortisone, still expensive and in relatively limited supply."

The grants also support research on their medical usefulness in a wide variety of disease conditions, including rheumatic fever, rheumatoid arthritis, congestive heart failure, leukemia, asthma, peptic ulcer, ulcerative colitis and goiter.

Time Short on Raid Shelters, U. S. Believes

HULL, Que. Jan. 20 (AP)—A top American civil defense official reported the U. S. is switching away from a construction program of large air-raid shelters because Washington "doesn't think we'll have time" to finish them.

James A. Wadsworth, assistant director of civil defense, told Canada's first civil defense force that the American plan is being switched to a "remedial urgency" based on belief Russia might attack at any time.

He said the U. S. had under study a program of large, small, single-purpose shelters, but both are being rejected and use of other potential refuge, such as swimming pools, is being strengthened.

Official statements at the meeting indicated neither Canada nor the United States was being ready to cope with heavy attacks on civilian populations. But both, it was indicated, are getting their preparations into full stride.

Wadsworth said North America must be prepared for atomic, bacterial and gas attacks.
