Appointment of a local price stabilization assisting committee will be made in the next few days by J. Schweindman, chairman of the board of city commissioners, announced Monday night following receipt of a telegram from Michael V. DiSalvo, director of the office of price stabilization.

The telegram stated:

"The office of price stabilization is convinced those laws and regulations are most respected which are best understood and easiest to observe."

"It is essential in this national defense mobilization emergency that every citizen be acquainted with all measures being taken for the common good and be informed of the steps each individual may take to carry out his part of the OPE of the economic stabilization act."

DiSalvo asked the commissioner chairman to consider the immediate appointment of a volunteer emergency stabilization cooperating committee to assist regional and district OPE branches in encouraging general public knowledge and observance of regulations adopted in the interest of a sound national economy.
