U. S. Tanks, Guns Plaster Seoul Hull

TOKYO, Feb. 8 (AP)—U. S. tanks shelled Seoul's battered ruins today and howitzers, wheeling into early morning, plastered Chinese positions north of the frozen Han river tonight. Puerto Rican doughboys seized a commanding height only 4 1/2 miles south of the former Korean republic capital. The army also advanced another mile or more toward Seoul. The eighth army said: "Destruction of communist forces in the pocket south of the Han in the western sector, the objective of the current phase of the limited offensive, is proceeding and may culminate as a sizable victory in terms of enemy losses."

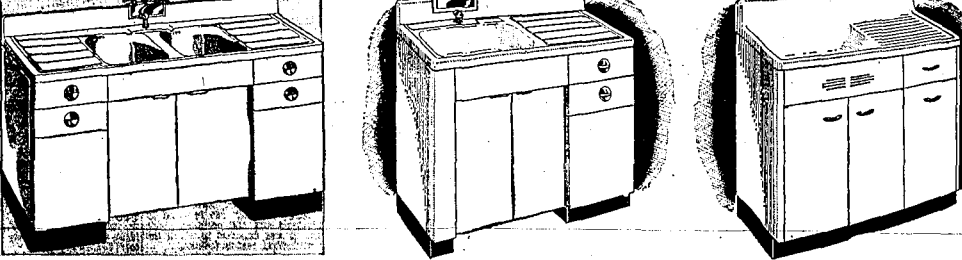

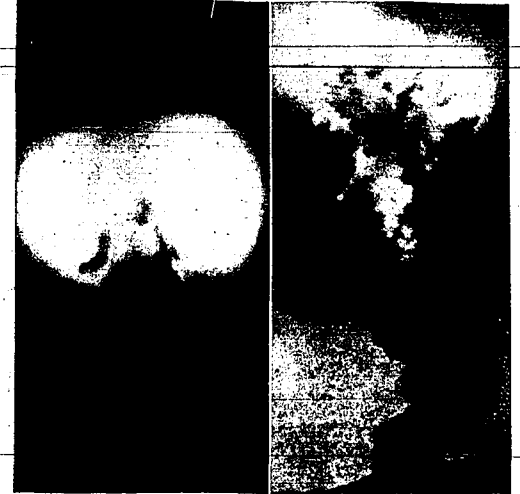

Romania Reds Have Trouble In Oil Fields

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8 (AP)
 The semi-cooperative communists of Romania admit they are running their oil business like the Marx brothers.
 Their best scientists are keeping books, while the unskilled workers are deciding where oil wells are to be drilled.
 The oil bosses have turned into a bunch of bureaucrats who claim their machinery is breaking down when they know it is being sabotaged.
 Everybody is always wanting vacations.
 Enough of this, cried the Romanian government in a scathing directive to the oil industry.
 Broadcast Monitor
 The directive, broadcast over the Bucharest radio and heard by American monitors, said Romania had failed to meet its goals of oil production or drilling since the properties were seized from Anglo-American interests.
 It seems, too, the Romanians have been drilling wells without setting up pipes to handle petroleum should they strike oil.
 To overcome the problem, the Romanian government ordered bonuses to workers and more clothing ration cards.
 Gain Title
 The government also thought the oil workers would take more interest in their jobs if they have titles. Hereafter, the man in charge of a well will be called a brigadier and a foreman directing a party of tough workers will be called a chief brigadier.
 The Romanians praised Russia for providing valuable equipment and technicians. But the Romanians did not mention what the people already knew—the wells were working fine when under the direction of Americans, the Socom-Vacuum Oil company and the Standard Oil company of New Jersey.

Gold Becomes Artistic, Gains Market Value

NEW YORK, Feb. 8 (AP)—Gold is going into a big and profitable way. Gold bring \$44 an ounce after being fixed at a little for the free market. And monetary gold brings only \$35 an ounce at Fort Knox.
 This \$8 an ounce incentive is attracting an increasingly larger percentage of the world's gold production into the free market.
 Purchase 60 per cent of the gold mined in South Africa—the world's greatest gold producer—is being sold for artistic, commercial or industrial uses at the higher rate, although the South African government holds formally to the \$35 level for currency purposes.
 Canadian gold miners are pestering their government to let them sell at least part of their 4,000,000 ounce annual production at the artistic rate, rather than the Fort Knox price.
 All governments keep a sharp eye on the sale of gold, but in the black markets in the orient gold sells even higher than the \$43 in the free markets of the world.
 Black markets exist because no government allows its currency to be exchanged freely for gold. Foreigners with different ideas of what gold is worth buy and sell what they can get in the black markets.
 Method Explained
 This is how the artistic gold deal works:
 Gold is fashioned into figurines, spoons, cigarette cases or bands and sold. If they choose, the buyers can melt the articles and down. They get \$43 an ounce in the free market.
 Gold miners at the U. S. Treasury price of \$35 an ounce is too low, and if the farmer and manufacturer get more for their products, the gold miner should get more for what he produces.
 With gold fixed for monetary purposes, but the price of other commodities fluctuating, the profits of gold mining usually go counter to the trend of the rest of the economy. Gold production is the most profitable during depression, because it buys the most goods, and least profitable during monetary inflation, because then it buys the least.

 This \$8 an ounce incentive is attracting an increasingly larger percentage of the world's gold production into the free market.
 Purchase 60 per cent of the gold mined in South Africa—the world's greatest gold producer—is being sold for artistic, commercial or industrial uses at the higher rate, although the South African government holds formally to the \$35 level for currency purposes.
 Canadian gold miners are pestering their government to let them sell at least part of their 4,000,000 ounce annual production at the artistic rate, rather than the Fort Knox price.
 All governments keep a sharp eye on the sale of gold, but in the black markets in the orient gold sells even higher than the \$43 in the free markets of the world.
 Black markets exist because no government allows its currency to be exchanged freely for gold. Foreigners with different ideas of what gold is worth buy and sell what they can get in the black markets.
 Method Explained
 This is how the artistic gold deal works:
 Gold is fashioned into figurines, spoons, cigarette cases or bands and sold. If they choose, the buyers can melt the articles and down. They get \$43 an ounce in the free market.
 Gold miners at the U. S. Treasury price of \$35 an ounce is too low, and if the farmer and manufacturer get more for their products, the gold miner should get more for what he produces.
 With gold fixed for monetary purposes, but the price of other commodities fluctuating, the profits of gold mining usually go counter to the trend of the rest of the economy. Gold production is the most profitable during depression, because it buys the most goods, and least profitable during monetary inflation, because then it buys the least.

Addition of Fluorine to Water Helps Tot Tooth Decay

(Editor's note: Past experience in adding fluorine to water is reported in this column. The following is a report on the addition of fluorine to water as an aid in reducing tooth decay among youngsters.)
By RICHARD KLEINER
NEW ROCHELLE, N. Y. (AP)—People around here won't taste it, but they're going to get a little something extra in their drinking water soon. It's fluorine, a chemical which reduces tooth decay.
The New Rochelle area is the latest in a long list of cities to switch to fluorinated water. The city of New Rochelle has been sweeping the U. S. as news of the "tooth" spread.
Some U. S. localities have natural fluorine in their water. Dentists noted people here, however, have the normal amount of tooth decay, then proved the same happy result could be obtained by artificially adding the chemical to local water supplies.
First, however, the idea was tested thoroughly. Controlled studies took place in Wisconsin, Michigan, New York, Texas and Illinois. Scientists decided the fluorine did the trick, but with certain reservations.
1. It only works if the fluorine is taken when your teeth are calcifying. That is when you are a child. In the main, only children through 8 get any benefit, and the most benefit goes to youngsters born and raised on the stuff. It won't help adults.
2. It's not a cure-all. Even children who drink fluorinated water from birth will still have cavities, though not as many.
3. It won't help the rural population, unless they have a public water supply system, at present, too many can't get it.
4. It has to be put in the water carefully. Too little will result in benefit; too much can irritate the teeth.
Scientists point out the present data is still far from complete. For one thing, the recommended amount of fluorine to be added may be fine for tested climates but prove wrong for others.
They also are incomplete as far as long range effect is concerned. Some of the experimental cities have been using fluorinated water for more than seven or eight years. Further results may change "for better or worse—or a longer stretch."
It'll cost money to work even a junior grade miracle like this. Estimates are that the cost per person is somewhere between 5 and 15 cents a year.
Despite the scientific hedging, however, it is clear that fluorinated water has proven beneficial. Most authorities agree that if the chemical is properly supplied, dental decay can be reduced by from 60 to 65 per cent in those who drink it from birth.
To cite one example, a four-year test in Newburgh, N. Y., showed that the DMF rate—the number of decayed, missing and filled teeth in every 100 permanent teeth—dropped from 20.5 to 12.8 in the children tested. In that same time, the DMF rate in the non-fluorinated control city, Kingston, N. Y., remained the same.
Another of fluorine's good points is that it is odorless and tasteless. And moderate under-dosing or over-dosing does no apparent harm. In Newburgh, a dental research project to the company one deal with

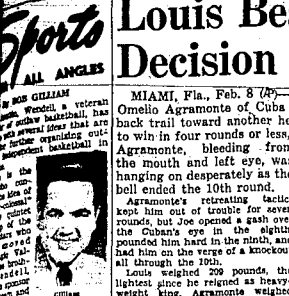

Refugees of War Fed by U. N. Forces

ON THE WESTERN FRONT, Korea, Feb. 8 (AP)—Only a few miles behind the front lines where United Nations soldiers are battling communists, the allied army takes time out each day to fight another enemy—hunger.

Korean civilians who are flocking back to their homes at fast as the U. N. troops free them from spots are being fed by a U. S. army detachment.

The detachment, headed by Maj. M. W. Shugart, Cahoon, Ga., is located in Yodginsay, a ramshackle Korean village about five miles east of Suwon.

"Civilians come from miles around to get rice from us," Shugart said. "We are feeding 10,000 of them right now and the number increases daily."

The milling lines of these hungry victims of war begin forming each day at dawn. Until dusk they file by tables where their names are checked. They are handed enough rice for two days.

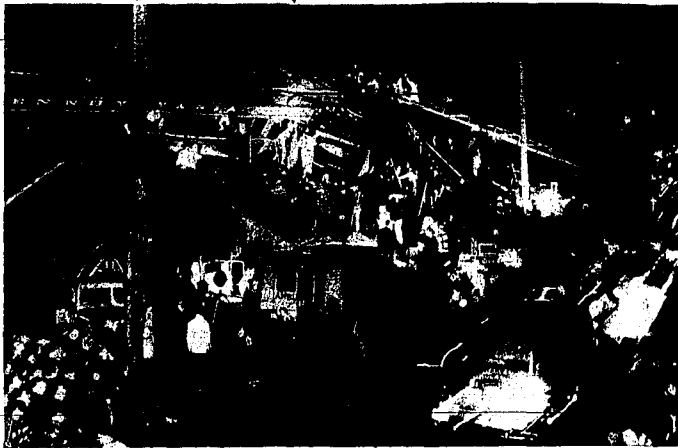
"We give the adults a pound and the children a half a pound," said Shugart.

Monsanto Informs AEC It Is Ready to Start Study of Atom Power Production

ST. LOUIS, Feb. 8.—Monsanto Chemical company announces it has informed the atomic energy commission it is ready to begin a study of the feasibility of developing and operating nuclear reactors for the production of plutonium and the ultimate goal of producing electric power.

The company made its position known in a letter from Dr. Charles Allen Thomas, executive vice president, to Dr. H. D. Smyth, acting chairman of the AEC.

Monsanto's announcement follows a statement from the commission in which the commission suggested to Monsanto conditions under which it would be willing to go forward with the first step of a plan which was originally proposed by Dr. Thomas in a speech made at Hobart College, Geneva, N. Y., last June, and subsequently developed in detail with the commission.

In the letter to Dr. Smyth, Dr. Thomas said Monsanto is ready to make a study of basic data with the following objectives: (A) Determine if sufficient materials and information exist to permit the design and construction of a nuclear reactor producing power and plutonium.

(B) Determine if such a reactor could make plutonium at a cost equal to or less than present costs and at the same time produce power at an economic cost, after application of credits for the plutonium produced.

(C) Recommend any additional research and development work re-

Snowfall and Moisture Are Above Norms

Snowfall and water content on the upper Snake river watershed were above normal at nearly every station in the snow survey of Feb. 4, according to Lynn Grandell, Idaho Falls, district forest service engineer.

Only three of 27 snow stations showed snow with a water content below normal. On Henry's fork, Valley View station had only 83 per cent of normal water content and Island Park station had 96 per cent normal. The Salt river division had water content of 99 per cent normal.

Leads Surver
The Black Rock station on the Buffalo river had the greatest water content with 114 per cent of normal. Bryan Flat on the Hoback river showed water content 134 per cent of normal and Gray's Boundary on Gray's river showed 131 per cent.

Moisture Given
Percentage of normal water content on stations of other rivers of the watershed were 99 to 122 per cent at the four stations of the Salt river; 83 to 103 per cent at the three stations of Henry's fork; 126 to 144 per cent at the four stations of the Buffalo river; 122 to 132 per cent at the nine stations of Snake river and 106 per cent at Grassy Lake station at Fall river.

In addition to the snow at Moran when the survey was taken, a new snowfall of 27 inches was recorded at that station Saturday and Sunday. This raised the total snow depth at Moran to 40 inches.

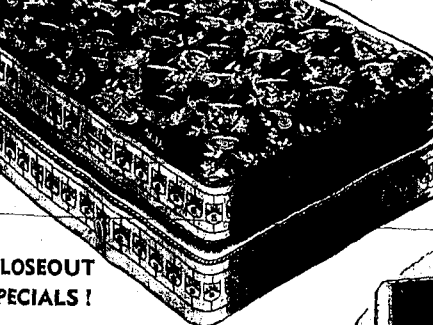

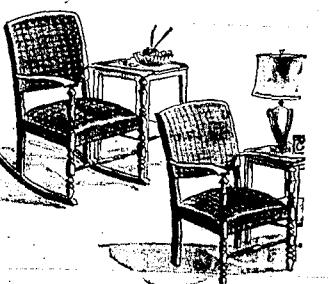

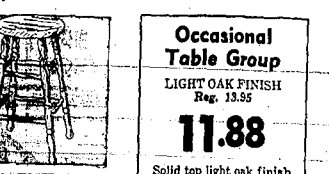

Safety of Arco Atomic Plant in Hands of Idahoans; Exams Set for Patrolmen

The safety of the Idaho reactor testing station of the atomic energy commission is in the hands of Idahoans, the AEC says. An announcement from the commission disclosed that the patrol force which guards the reactor testing station is made up of Idaho men. Of 44 men on the patrol force only three are not natives of the state. These three were transferred from other AEC installations to be a nucleus for the patrol force when it was organized in Idaho. The AEC also said the patrol force will continue to be made up of Idaho men. The policy of the force is to fill administrative positions from the ranks when vacancies occur. A training program assures the presence of trained men to fill vacancies. Patrolmen are selected on the basis of competitive examinations. Interviews with prospective supervisors and physical examinations. After they are hired they are given a basic course in firearms, first aid and general police techniques. This course is followed by a continuing training program in AEC security procedures. The course includes traffic control, general atomic energy information, fire protection, criminal investigation, first aid, and police techniques. Legal aspects of patrol work and other subjects. Patrolmen who are assigned to show cause in writing. If they have any objections to the above description should be answered to said District, 1001 E. Main St., Boise, Idaho, 83702.

Educational requirements are at least two years of high school. Each applicant also must undergo an investigation for loyalty, character and association. Applicants must apply on application forms available at Idaho state employment service offices. They will be given preliminary interviews by the 1952 and then assigned to various times and places for the examination.

The Idaho operations office of the AEC plans to hire more Idaho men as security patrolmen and for this reason has scheduled examinations for 1951 applicants from southern and eastern Idaho towns in February. Examinations will be given in Twin Falls Friday and Saturday, Feb. 23 and 24, and at Burley Wednesday and Thursday, Feb. 28 and March 1. The examinations will be given by AEC representatives. Future appointments to the patrol force will be made from the list of men who pass the examination. The patrolmen positions pay \$2,200 a year with an automatic increase to \$2,500 on the basis of seniority and satisfactory service. The AEC furnishes uniforms and equipment. Applicants must be war veterans between the ages of 18 and 30 years. Physical condition of applicants must be good and vision must be at least 20/30 in one eye and 20/40 in the other, corrected to 20/20.

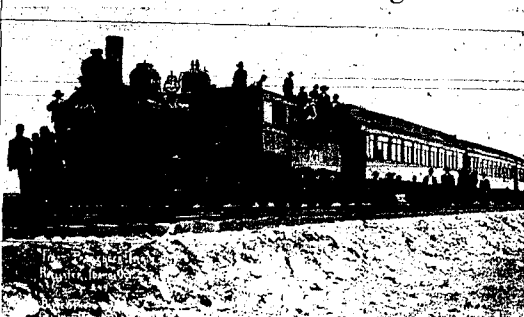
