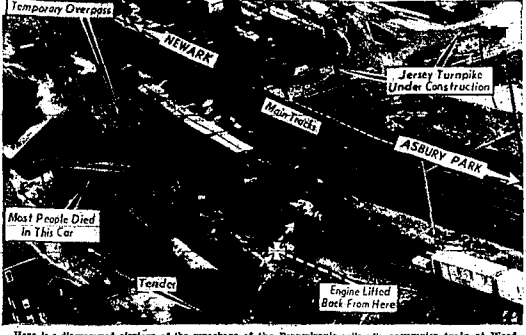

Problems for School Board Aired at Meet

BURLEY, Feb. 9—Cassia county classroom teachers met Wednesday night to discuss problems of the teachers and to suggest resolutions to be presented to the school board for action.

Mrs. Ruby Leary, Burley, president, had charge of the meeting and Robert Gooch, Burley, was chairman of the panel discussion, attending the meeting were teachers, school officials, business men and parents.

Francis Carter, member of the school board, told of the financial condition of the board and said that the board is operating this year with less funds than last year. The district has levied the maximum mill rate allowed by the state constitution. It fifth from the bottom in assessed valuation of property per school child in Idaho, he said. There is an enrollment of 3,473 pupils and the assessed valuation is only \$1,999,000. A number of local business men took part in the open forum discussion. 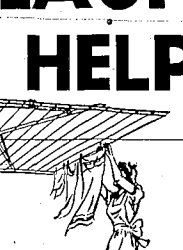
