Public Power Backers' "Sneak" Play In Selling of Power Firm Is Exposed

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19 (Special)—The public power back in the Pacific Northwest have come very close to pulling a "sneak attack" play in sale of the Washington Water Power company in Spokane.

That they didn't succeed is almost a miracle. The effort, however, was so flagrant even liberal Senators Magnuson, Washington, and Morse, Oregon, have joined in the demand for a public airing of the matter here and in Spokane this next week.

Involved elsewhere in the proposal to sell the property was the sure fire hand of Guy C. (Fash) Myers, the promoter who brought public power to all of Nebraska years ago and in Portland last year. Here's the idea on the deal:

1. Howard L. Ailer, president of American Power and Light company, New York City, which owns the Spokane company, has been directed by the securities and exchange commission to sell the property. He made quiet arrangements with public utility districts to buy the property, then notified SEC to this effect:

"We're just letting you know the sale is arranged. Of course, it really isn't any of your business, anyhow, because you have no jurisdiction over the sale since the purchaser is a public body. And, of course, old fellows, a public hearing just isn't needed."

2. The northwest senators roll out of what was up and called a council of war. They protested in a body-to-SEC over what was cooking. The agency, slammering red and black notices, notified the senators in a secret memo last week:

"SEC can not agree to the procedure suggested by Mr. Ailer, on the basis of which the commission would determine whether or not to hold a hearing after an informal investigation and, if the decision should be favorable to American, permit consummation of the trans-

action almost simultaneously with public notification of the proposal. "If notification for intent to sell is filed, it is the present intention of the commission to give immediate notice and opportunity for those opposed to the transaction to state orally and in writing their reasons for urging that a declaration be filed."

More to the point, SEC said Ailer must "state all details of the transaction but need not include firm commitments by underwriters."

3. This made Mr. Ailer mad, so he intends to prove on Feb. 20 that SEC has no business interfering in any way in the matter. If he's proved wrong, public hearings will be held here before the full commission similar to the bitter session last February over the Portland sale.

Ailer reports he expects to sell the properties to public bodies resulting in not less than \$50,000,000 and possibly \$81,000,000 for his stockholders.

Last year Ailer sold the common stock in Portland Power and Light company to a Wall Street syndicate headed by A. C. Ailyn and company and Sears, Roebuck and company, for \$16,125,000.

In the Portland deal a rival Wall Street syndicate, which vowed that it would retain the property in private hands, tried to outbid the Ailyn group. However, direct White House intervention brought an SEC decision in favor of the Ailyn crowd, which had connections with "Fash" Myers.

It's a sure thing the current fiasco is just a bit of empty show, because the SEC attitude is preflexed. However, at least this much is gained:

1. Public hearings will give the citizens of Spokane a chance to make their view felt and may aid passage in the state legislature of a bill providing that a referendum should be submitted to the citizens there before the deal is finally made.

2. Public hearings are certain to insure that the PUDs, if the purchase goes through, won't pay a "golden rule" or "in other words, exorbitant, price for the properties."

About 25 per cent of the Washington Power company's business is in the mining district of Coeur d'Alene. They're ready or over there. The Idaho legislature hurriedly passed a bill aimed into law by the governor prohibiting the PUDs who purchase the properties from operating in Idaho.

That should strike quite a few sparks when the time comes to enforce the measure.

Idaho Solons Fail to Delay Sale Hearing

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19—Congressmen from Idaho tried without success to delay hearings on the proposed sale of Washington Water Power company to public utility districts in the state of Washington.

The securities and exchange commission has scheduled a hearing on the proposed sale for Spokane tomorrow and for Washington Friday. Representative Budge told a reporter the time before the Spokane hearing is too short to permit opponents of the sale to prepare their case.

SEC Declines
But he said the SEC declined to change the date.

Other members of the Idaho congressional delegation were out of town, but their aides, John Budge in seeking a delay.

American Power and Light company, a New York holding company, has filed with the SEC an outline of its plans to sell the Washington utility.

Company Protests
American Power says SEC has no

jurisdiction over the sale, but the federal agency is going ahead with its hearings anyway.

Budge said ownership of the system by a public corporation would deprive Idaho of taxes, probably of supervision over service and rates, and would disrupt the economy of the area affected.

The utility serves the big mining companies and timber operators of the Idaho panhandle.
