

Army Led Forces Gain Eight Miles Before Reds Hold

(Saturday), Feb. 24 (U.P.)—Tank-led American forces fleeing communists eight miles in east-central China today brought them to a narrow mouth.

They leaped off from down positions three miles away from the town at mid-morning, and in a swift pursuit of reds fleeing north in a panic.

They picked an ideal defense position in mountains flanking a narrow muddy river through just south of Pannangin, an important highway-junction.

Heavy fighting erupted in the past as the reds poured a barrage of fire into the pursuing Americans.

Another Blast

The eight-mile advance stopped the tanks and the rest of the communist line at Poyongchang.

Twenty-five miles west of Poyongchang, a division occupied four miles forward and another four miles forward on the banks of the Hoang River south of Hoengsing, key to the central front highway network.

The four tanks of the Hoengsing column captured July 166, key to the communist defense line, and drove forward to face the Americans who were able to take over half-finished communist fortifications on the banks of the river.

Bombers Help

U. S. bombers struck the hills overlooking Hoengsing and began pouring point-blank fire into the ranks of the communist line.

U. S. bombers also helped to join the destruction with tons of bombs.

An estimated 10,000 Chinese communist troops protecting Hoengsing and the area around it were the United Nations troops arrayed against them.

The four tanks of the Hoengsing column were accompanied by a second tanking drive about a mile to the west of the Hoengsing river south of the supply road for the tanks.

Red China Takes Drastic Action As Open Defiance Rise Admitted

HONG KONG, Feb. 23 (U.P.)—Communist China, extending the death penalty to anyone who dares to speak against the underground had killed thousands of red millitarians and open defiance was spreading.

In an astounding announcement, Peking conceded that resistance had risen with the outbreak of fighting in Korea.

Some observers, however, believed the announcement was intended primarily to justify a widespread strike which they expect to increase in intensity.

Bull Grading Trip Planned By Cattlemen

GOODING, Feb. 21—Cattlemen from Gooding and Lincoln counties will hold a bull grading tour Monday. This tour is the first of the demonstration held last year. The tour, under the sponsorship of the Gooding Cattle Association, is aimed to help improve the quality of cattle on the range.

The tour will start at 9 a. m. at the Don Hancy ranch near the Wood River Center Grange hall, 18 miles northeast of Gooding and eight miles northwest of Shoshone.

The grading committee is made up of Stewart Elmer and Morris Neilson, Black Canyon association; Bam Danner and Harry Patterson, Horne Creek association; and Ed Dwyer, Gooding association. This committee will grade all of the bulls that run on the range north of Gooding.

Dr. R. Albinson, assistant livestock specialist, will accompany the grading tour as consultant. County Agent Robert E. Higgins, Gooding county, and Fred Kohl, Lincoln county, will keep a record of the results of the grading committee.

The tour will progress toward Gooding during the morning. Lunch will be served at noon in Gooding. Afternoon grading will start at Morris Neilson's ranch seven miles southwest of Gooding.

Cattle in Gooding To Undergo Tests For Tuberculosis

GOODING, Feb. 21—For the next several months federal veterinarians will be testing cattle on Gooding county ranches for tuberculosis. Dr. R. Albinson reported today.

Dr. Albinson said Gooding county was the first county in Idaho to be declared officially free of this disease. Testing began in the fall of 1952 and the original accredited status was granted the following June. Since then periodic three-year tests have been made with occasional tuberculosis reactors being revealed.

Dr. Albinson reports that there are at present 65,712,883 cattle in 5,983,054 herds in the United States under supervision of the bureau of animal industry and state officials charged with controlling tuberculosis in cattle.

Some tuberculosis still exists. Dr. Albinson continued. Retesting of cattle must be carried on regularly. As late as November, 1956, records show that in one month more than 1,000 tubercular cattle were found in the United States. To find this number 650,000 cows were tested.

County Agent Robert E. Higgins urges all farmers in the county to cooperate with Dr. Albinson and his staff. The program is vital to the health of the family, the county and the nation, he said.

Poison That Nearly Became War Weapon Used on Coyotes

HAGERMAN, Feb. 21—A poison that nearly became a war tool of Hitler during the last war now is used on coyotes and other predators in Idaho, especially in the Snake River valley.

The secret formula was developed in Belgium and smuggled into England in 1945 when Hitler's armies overran Belgium. It came from England to this country and in 1945 the U. S. fish and wildlife service started to use it for predator animal and rodent eradication. It is very deadly and has no known antidote.

Because of its potency the poison is guarded carefully and its use is restricted to only a few predator and rodent control field men of the fish and wildlife service. John Wilson, Hagerman, a veteran predator control employee with 15 years of experience, has been given special instruction in the use of the poison, commonly called 1080. Wilson works Gooding, Carnas and Coyote counties under B. L. Evans, district supervisor, who has headquarters in Carey.

Wilson says 1080 comes in a powder form contained within a capsule. It is mixed with water and injected into warm or freshly butchered horse meat with a hypodermic needle. The poison will penetrate three inches in all directions from the injection but will not penetrate the bone. Poisoned meat is placed in areas infested by coyotes in the late fall and is picked up or destroyed in the spring.

There has been considerable talk against the use of 1080 as, some persons think, it will kill cattle. Wilson said the government has made numerous experiments with 1080 and has proved that since it does not penetrate bones, it does not eat the meat. It would take 18 days to eat the meat, he says. For the desert areas, he says the best control for coyotes is the "Coyote Getter."

The Coyote Getter is a .38 caliber gun loaded with cyanide poison. The top of the gun or trigger is scented for baiting. The gun is driven into the ground so that the top is all that is visible. When the animal bites and attempts to pull the bait, the gun fires the cyanide into the animal's mouth. The coyote usually gets no farther than 10 to 20 yards away before it dies. Wilson has 575 of these guns now in operation over a 500 mile area.

Warning signs are posted on all roads leading into areas where coyote getters are set or where poisoned meat is being used.

Predator control men work all year. In the winter they work the desert areas while in summer they move higher up in the hills. There

are 33 of these men working in Idaho and it is estimated that 6,000 or 8,000 predator animals are killed each year.

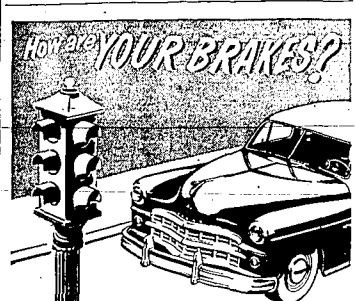
