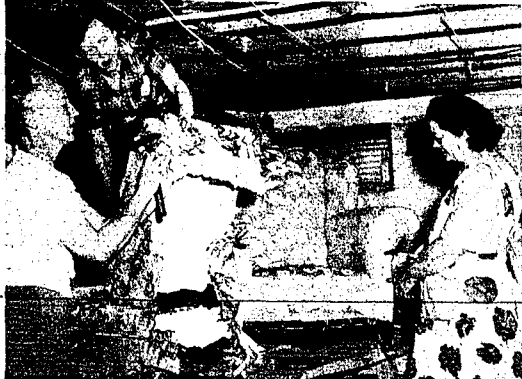

However, he pointed out, the losses would have been over \$12,000,000 in some years if no Canadian imports had been allowed.

Increased, values decreased in vegetables, fruits and horticultural specialties sold.

Sale of all livestock and livestock products valued \$2,997,242 in 1949 for a gain of \$2,947,753 over the 1944 figure. Values of dairy products, poultry and poultry products decreased with the value of other livestock and livestock products increasing from \$2,522,224 to \$1,707,673.

Animal population figures varied in the five-year period—horses down from 8,272 to 6,180, mules down from 703 to 283, cattle up from 26,681 to 61,793, hogs down from 2,466 to 6,480, sheep up from 11,831 to 125,258, chickens down from 131,460 to 90,467 and turkeys up from 1,024 to 6,189.

Less whole milk was sold, 10,151,830 gallons in 1944 and 7,122,823 gallons for \$1,890,544 in 1949; and less butterfat was sold, 64,457 pounds for \$40,118 last year and 239,701 pounds in 1944. With reports from 677 farms last year, 515,845 dozen eggs were sold for \$218,634.

Acres for corn for all purposes fell from 727 to 658 acre, production of winter wheat zoomed from 20,664 to 135,673 bushels, spring wheat from 1,149,223 to 1,280,857 bushels. Bean acreage and production decreased. Pea acreage decreased but production rose. All types of hay crops increased.

The census bureau reported increased production of these crops: Alfalfa seed, from 23,590 to 182,658 pounds; red clover seed from 1,050,400 to 1,350,229 pounds; and sugar

VA to Close State Contact Field Offices

BOISE, Feb. 20—Veterans administration contact field offices in Idaho will be closed by March 31, according to instructions received by Regional Manager Leon Fields.

Fields' letter to officers-in-charge of these contact offices said, "I regret to inform you that due to budgetary limitations I have been officially directed to close the following VA offices not later than March 31, 1951: Coeur d'Alene, Lewiston, Pocatello, Idaho Falls, Moscow and Twin Falls.

This action in Idaho is in keeping with the national reduction-in-force of the contact program which, due to a reduced budget for the fiscal year 1952, will close 321 VA offices throughout the United States. These offices are staffed by one contact representative and one clerk.

Manager Fields said steps are being taken to obtain free desk space in the offices of other agencies for VA training officers in these locations. This is being done to provide a better service to trainees and to eliminate excessive expense in time and travel to and from Boise. The guidance centers located at Moscow and Albion will not be affected by this action.

After these offices have been closed, veterans and other beneficiaries who desire to contact the VA for information and to file claims, should do so by mail or by personally contacting the Boise regional office. It is not believed any undue delay will be experienced in handling this correspondence, Fields said.

This was one of the points in a report on the 1950 census made public Saturday night by the census bureau. Among the others: The number of children under 10 years old increased 40 percent between 1940 and 1950. In the same decade the number of persons over 65 increased 37 percent.

Two out of every three Americans over 14 are married. During the 12 months which preceded the census, about one-sixth of the population moved from one house to another.

The "Marines' persistence" considered able losses in the northeast campaign but nevertheless came out as a strong fighting force with most of their equipment, including tanks and artillery.
