Retiring Director Reviews Trials of Telephone Company in Minidoka County

RUPERT, March 6—George Brezsal, declared himself in a letter the pioneer spirit either to bring acre brush land under cultivation or to start a telephone company and bring it to a successful culmination. He should know because he has done both.

One of the oldest settlers on the Minidoka project, he homesteaded 160 acres of land and was one of the group to start the Project Mutual Telephone company.

As a recent meeting he retired after serving 32 years as director of the company. Oliver Frising at the same time was Charles Shupert and S. W. Beck. Jim Hanley had retired a few months before the meeting. All were old timers in service.

Speaking of the trial, difficulties and accomplishments of the company, Brezsal repeated many times, "I never where we came from but the question is, where do we go from here?"

Only the need of telephones in the country kept the first group of organizers working despite difficulties. Brezsal's son, Henry, Rupert retractor and former mayor, still tells the story of how frightened he was when, as a small child, he was sent to Rupert on his pony in the middle of the night for a doctor when his mother was ill.

Prior to the organization of the company in 1903, the project was managed by the Bell company which had a few phones in Rupert, a small mutual company in Heyburn which was managed by S. C. Blaker and later was consolidated with the Project Mutual company and the reclamation service which had a switch board at the reclamation office for Minidoka dam, water officials and ditch riders of the project.

The first board consisted of Luke Williams, Frank Sherrer, Charles Sanfrisco, J. Doth and Brezsal. J. L. Bush was the first president and Frank Randolph was secretary. Money was raised for the venture by selling stock with a return agreement with farmers for four subscribers to the mile and \$10 for each phone.

Then trouble started. There was no money, the firm was \$20,000 in debt, everything was mortgaged and equipment was bought on time. Behind on government taxes, Charles Sheban, Bellevue, assistant federal tax collector under G. C. Blaker, Heyburn, came with a warrant to close the company.

About this time Brezsal and Luke Williams signed a personal note for \$5,850. When the newly organized company started to cross the tracks

into Rupert the Bell company served an injunction on them. An amended law, however, permitted them to continue. The Bell company then offered to sell out. Each company furnished an appraiser and a third appraiser helped to settle differences between the other two.

During the depression of the early 20's, the company voted to sell out the installation plan at the rate of 25 cents a month. Brezsal said the plan really was a life saver.

"We didn't derive much income from this small amount," he said, "but the method brought in a large number of subscribers and the \$175 service charge saved the company."

The company is now in good shape with nearly \$100,000 annual revenue and a yearly pay roll of \$33,000. There are between 1200 and 1400 active stockholders with approximately 725 paid up and 600 who are paying on time. Personnel includes telephone operators, a manager, board of directors and two linemen.

Mrs. Rachel Cox, who served as chief operator most of the time since the company started, now is toll ticket clerk. She is assisted by her daughter, Mrs. Wilma Rich. Mrs. Betty Throckmorton and Mrs. Glenn Schneider are bookkeepers.

Mrs. Lola Rasmussen Nelson is present chief operator. L. H. Tangiary was the first manager. Donald Dickson was appointed manager a year ago. Prelling they were entitled to a well-earned rest. Four of the old directors this year declined to run for reelection. Charles Easton, Paul who has served the years, has declined at a recent meeting, with David I. Garner, farmer, Oliver

Hanzel, Ward Woolford and Bill Hanchett, business men, elected to fill the vacancies. Henschel was named president and Woolford, vice president.

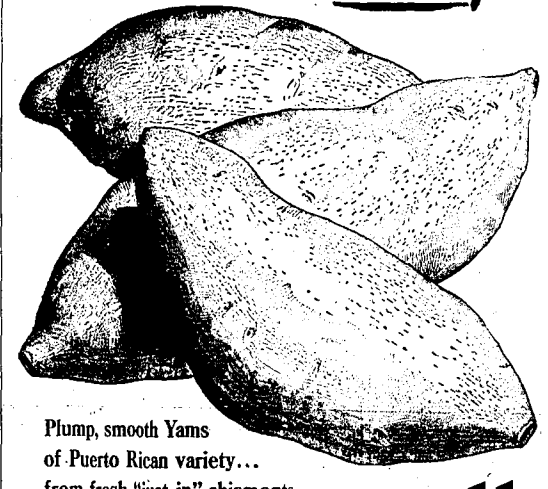
