WASHINGTON, March 7 (AP)—Announced American casualties in the Korean war reached 52,448 today, an increase of 1,773 in a week. The total representing notification to his next of kin through March 2, included 7,857 killed in action, 24,832 wounded and 8,899 missing in action.

The wounded included 911 who died of their wounds and 85 among the missing are known dead, making a total of 4,983 deaths.

The missing figure also included 390 men who have since returned to U. S. military control and 110 known prisoners of war, leaving 8,724 currently missing.

Total army casualties rose 1,662 during the week, reaching 43,589. Navy losses increased by six to a total of 596. Marine corps casualties were 149 to a total of 1,738. Total air force casualties reached 416, an increase of 10 over last week.

If any Russian venture in Yugoslavia should touch off a general war, Stalin has 175 million troops to strike. Divisions are of 100,000 men, smaller than in World War I, but with a full strength U. S. division which numbers about 15,000 officers and men.

Just in case, 100,000 crack Russian troops are standing by in Austria, France and Germany.

Bulgaria, Hungary and Romania have some 600,000 men under arms. Soviet troops and planes give these satellites more air power than Tito's forces can match. If they are suddenly needed, satellites probably could win.

The news also tells the story of what might happen if Moscow should order her satellites to attack Tito this spring. Success of such a "local war"—as from the Korean pattern—would strengthen Russia's Balkan flank, weaken North Atlantic defense blocs and impair the west's position in the near east without loss of a Soviet satellite.

State High on Mental Home Crowded List

WASHINGTON, March 7 (AP)—State institutions for the mentally defective were overcrowded by almost 12 per cent in 1948, the national institute of mental health said today.

Overcrowding was reported by 27 states, with conditions most serious in Louisiana—58 per cent overcrowded; Rhode Island, 49.2 per cent; Oklahoma, 46 per cent; Idaho, 44.5 per cent; Illinois, 42.2 per cent; and Maryland, 41 per cent.

The agency, a division of the U. S. public health service, surveyed 84 institutions in 1948. They reported 101,605 mental patients and 38,700 epilepsy patients under care—2.3 per cent more than in 1947.

"It can be presumed that figures for 1949 and 1950 will show increases corresponding to the general increase in population and expansion of facilities," the agency said in a statement.

School Chief for Hansen Resigns; Coach Also Quits

HANSEN, March 7—Resignation of Ed Kane, local school superintendent for the last five years, was announced yesterday by W. G. Stanger, school board chairman, who said the board is seeking applications to fill the vacancy.

Kane's resignation is effective at the end of the school year. Kane said his plans are indefinite but he is considering other taking further training at the University of Arizona or seeking a position in a larger school system.

Meet Held on New Garbage Rule for T. F.

Groundwork was laid Tuesday afternoon for a Saturday discussion of suggestions to be incorporated in a completely revised and improved city garbage and rubbish disposal ordinance when a group of city officials met in the city managers' office.

A. L. Bladest, sanitation engineer and D. R. Madock, forest and rodent-control specialist, both of the Idaho department of health, met with officials to review and suggest minor changes of the proposed ordinance.

According to City Manager W. R. Smith, officials will study various phases of the revision Saturday. Then it probably will be submitted to the board of city commissioners. Meetings of Saturday afternoon, F. Cross, commissioner of public works; Vincent Young, city engineer; H. H. Ballenger, street and water superintendent; Robert Hallsen, city attorney; James H. Traylor, city engineer.

The officials will discuss various phases of the ordinance and make minor suggestions made by Bladest and Madock Tuesday. Both men said they suggest only minor changes and termed the proposal "very good."

Items outlined to be discussed Saturday, as parts of the tentative ordinance, are a clear definition of garbage and rubbish; inspection of collection trucks; collection schedules; new regulations on use of disposal areas; formation of a department of sanitation as part of the street and water department with responsibility for operation placed on one person; definition of containers as to location, size and weight; separation and preparation of garbage for collection; restrictions on the burning of rubbish and authorization for garbage collection in private collectors.

Attending Tuesday's meeting were Lloyd Leitch, Hurley city engineer; Smith, Young, Ballenger and Ingalls.

Misled Ivan Knows Only What Soviet Leaders Want-Here Are His Beliefs

The average Russian hears and reads only what his government officials are good for him. Only a few persons behind the iron curtain have the equipment and the courage to see in an such foreign broadcasts as the Voice of America.

From Ivanostich, his n.e.w.s.y. from the Moscow press, the Russian newspapers and magazines made by communist officials whose job it is to tour the country and "educate" the masses. Based on what Moscow has printed and broadcast in recent weeks, the average Russian thinks things stand about like this: "The United States—Working 24 hours a day trying to start World War III. Most of the work is being done by a group of Wall Street millionaires who give orders to President Truman. The millionaires enjoy such luxuries as refrigerators, television sets and yachts, but the great majority of the American people live in squalid homes and work long hours at low pay to turn out goods for the millionaires. The Wall Street men want another war so they can make more money selling munitions to the British and French."

There is some hope for France because of the large communist bloc in the chamber of deputies. Even though Britain has a socialist government, she is completely under the domination of Washington and approves everything the United States does.

Grassland Agriculture Stress Is Explained by County Agent

"Grassland agriculture" is a new phrase in our agricultural vocabulary and people of Idaho will have an opportunity to understand the reasons for its existence at a meeting under present plans of the University of Idaho extension service, according to C. W. Daugh, Twin Falls county agent.

C. O. Youngstrom, associate director of the Idaho extension division, states this program has never been very far from the top of the leader in so far as extension policies and objectives have been concerned, but will be given new punch as the University of Idaho joins with other land grant colleges in the nation in helping to bring more stability to the farming industry through this new aid to a balanced farming program.

The foremost goal of the national program is to promote a system of farm operation in which grasses and legumes are used to the fullest extent for enriching the American soil and the soil as announced by E. W. Whitman, University of Idaho farm crops specialist chairman of an extension committee, will explain and give attention to the various phases in this new field of activity.

Crop Worker Plan Eyed by Area's Solons

WASHINGTON, March 7 (UP)—A labor department proposal to provide a "look-out" for labor supply will be introduced in the senate this week.

Chairman Magnuson, D. Wash., told a reporter either he or Senator Murray, D. Mont., of his work would introduce the bill, with other northwest senators joining as sponsors, Magnuson is chairman of the senate labor committee.

The department bill, Magnuson said, is more suitable to Pacific northwest needs "than the farm labor bill introduced last week by Chairman Ellender, D. La., of the senate agriculture committee."

It has been estimated the northwest area alone may need as many as 7,000 imported farm workers this year for its hops, beans, sugar beets, apples and other crops.

Major difference between the two bills concerns growers' participation in the workers' transportation costs.

For example, according to the 1950 agricultural census, only about 10 per cent of our crop land is used for pasture, being 20,560 out of a total irrigated acreage of 218,000. Another 51,884 acres is used for alfalfa hay and pasture crops, accounting for 6,244 acres. Therefore, our total income and grass acreage accounts for less than one-third of total irrigated acreage.

In order to further study this grassland program, Daugh and all county extension agents in south central and southwestern Idaho will attend a two-day conference in Boise March 5 and 6 under the leadership of the state committee.
