

# N. Forces Drive Ahead On 70-Mile Korean Front; China Red Losses Heavy

TO, March 8 (UP)—The eighth army plumed ahead up to two and one-half miles on the Korean front today against red forces already reeling from the loss of a record in the first 24 hours of the mammoth assault.

Dispatch reported signs of a general communist withdrawal behind a screen of smoke and gas. Resistance was reported from non-existent to heavy on this second day of the "killer" offensive.

Red divisions were slipping and sliding in the Chinese front. One division of 150,000 men, the Canadian division, was reported to have been driven back to the rear in a ground action along the 70-mile front in the Korean front.

At least 200 prisoners were taken.

# Agent Explains OPS Meaning and Effects

Approximately 75 Twin Falls retail merchants Thursday heard Victor Goertzen, business analyst of the Boise office of the Federal Reserve Bank, explain the provisions and the effect of the ceiling price regulation No. 7.

Goertzen told merchants the new regulation supplants the general ceiling price regulations of Jan. 26 on 85 per cent of basic commodities. He said that at the time of the original OPS ruling it was recognized that its provisions were not well suited to all classes of trade and business. Therefore, regulation No. 7 provides a different type of price control for a large segment of retail trade, he explained.

He emphasized that an adequate price control at retail level is of the utmost importance and that it is here that the consumer feels the effect of inflation and stabilization. That is why the new regulation is a clear and effective and enforceable way to control prices on the retail level, he said.

The regulation allows merchants a reasonable markup on merchandise but prevents them from making unusual markups because of shortages, he said.

Certain sale price level can be obtained until the market returns to normal. Controls are placed on all levels. The plan met the approval of all concerned and a campaign was launched to raise \$1000 by solicitation to start the building. The remainder of the amount needed was to be borrowed from the bank.

Labor for construction was volunteered by residents. At the first meeting Lawson was elected temporary general chairman.

Temporary board members elected were Robert Currier, chairman; Mrs. Martin Curran, James Abbott, Mrs. Odien Sheppard and Lawson. This board made the necessary arrangements for incorporating the hospital as a non-profit corporation. Articles of incorporation were filed Sept. 7, 1950.

The permanent board elected by stockholders on Dec. 27, 1950, includes James H. Ellis, president; Robert Lawson, vice president; Maurice Bevin, treasurer; Silas Condit and James Abbott, Mrs. Howard Carlson, Charles Lundberg and Sam Collier who donated their services. Carpentry, wiring, plumbing and electrical work was done by many local residents.

Carlson was elected secretary of the corporation. The cost of the hospital cost \$2,500. Estimated value of labor is \$4,000. Total building value has been set at \$12,000. The equipment in the building is valued at \$4,000. Approximately 80% of the donated funds came from Gooding business firms and approximately 20% was donated by Wendell business men. The balance of the donated funds came from the former and vicinity. The hospital has been completed without government aid and since its opening has handled several emergency cases.

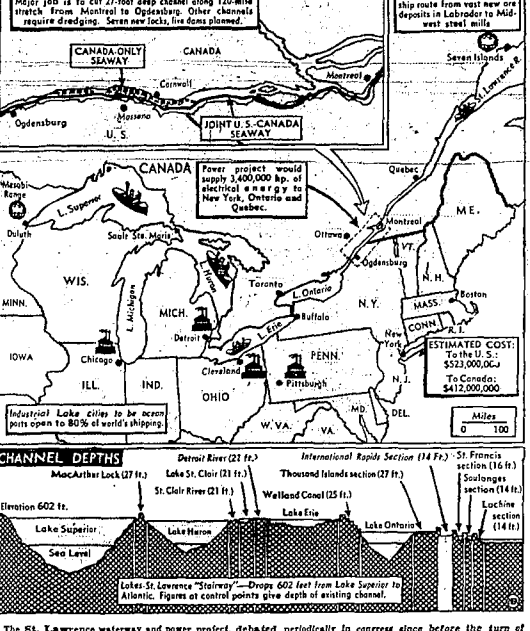

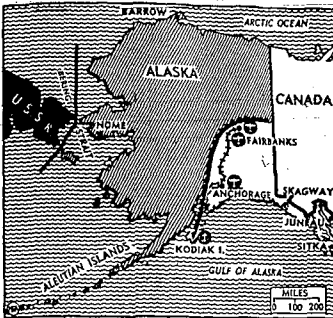

### MacArthur Asks Big Question Again, But No Answer Expected Right Away

 Gen. Douglas MacArthur has asked the big question again, but there is no indication he will get an answer from the United Nations.

He said on a battle-field visit to Korea yesterday that the Korean war was likely to settle down into a stalemate unless some "high level" decisions were made. He meant he wanted the U. N. to decide whether he should go all-out in an attempt to drive the Chinese communists out of Korea or let things go along the way they are.

He needs two things to win the war: More troops and permission from the U. N. to bomb the Chinese any place he chooses, including across the boundary in their own country where they outfit their troops. It is unlikely he will get either one any time soon.



All delegations in the U. N. act on instructions from their home governments, and you only have to take a look at the situation in the three capitals to see why MacArthur is unlikely to get a reply.

Paris — There isn't any government to instruct the French U. N. delegation. France is going through one of its frequent cabinet crises and no major policy decision can be made. Even if a stable government were in power it is doubtful if Korea would get much attention. Delegates of America, Russia, Britain, and France are meeting right in the middle of Paris, but they are not talking about Korea. They are talking about how to prevent the cold war from blowing into a hot one.

London — Britain would like to see the Korean war through a compromise with red China. She doesn't think MacArthur ever should have

crossed the 38th parallel in the first place and she is going to try to prevent him from doing it again. Britain recognizes the communists as the legal government of China and finds herself in the strange position of making war against a regime she officially approves.

Washington — Would like to win a quick victory in Korea and probably would be willing to go all-out to do it. But the official position is that this is a United Nations, not an American problem, and no step will be taken unless it is approved first by Congress. The matter that engages the attention of congress at the moment is not whether to reinforce MacArthur but whether to send 100,000 American troops to Europe.

Selma Harper, U. N. delegate from Turkey, summed up the attitude of many nations last night when he said: "On the question of doing more, we ought to, but whether we could is another question. Korea is not the only interesting spot in the world for many countries."

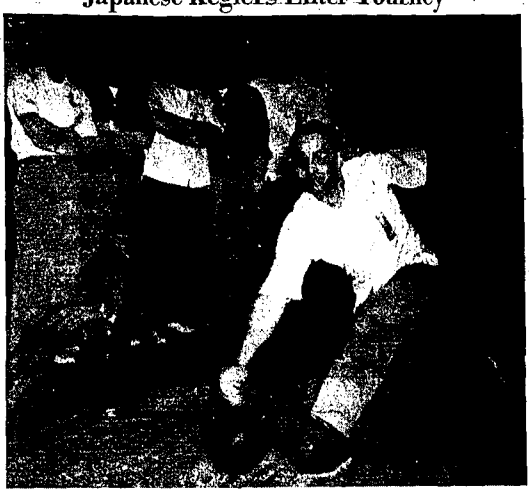

It's a future peopled with pretty girls who have written proposals of marriage to him; secured financially with a \$100,000 trust fund, and warmed by the thought of little business of his own with his brother, Has Good Cheer.

Perhaps best of all, 20-year-old Bob Smith, Middletown, Pa., can look forward confidently to doing for himself almost all the things people with their own hands and feet can do. And, very important to him, he is something of a little child of Korea did not take from him along with his limbs—the good cheer with which he looks out on life.

It was last November when Bob, downed by a wound, lay in a ditch of a North Korean village until his hands and feet froze next evening. The Army flew him here late in December.

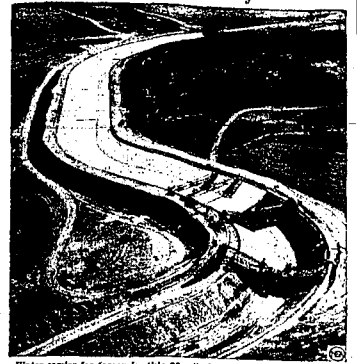

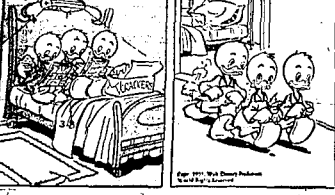

### Neill Reports Income Levy Figure Gains

BOISE, March 8 (AP)—Individual state income tax collections have averaged \$60.42 per return so far this year compared with an average of \$40.13 on 1935 returns, State Tax Collector F. G. Neill reports. However, he remarked that the average per return always is greater on early filings. Later when warmer returns came in larger numbers, the average will be reduced, he said.

Tax collections on 27,699 individual returns through Feb. 29 totaled \$1,733,042.25, compared with 27,209 returns totaling \$1,301,765.84 at the same time last year. Average payment on returns at this time of year amounted to \$49.53.

Neill said corporation revenue is showing a constant decline since 1934. The average return has been \$39.21 this year compared with \$70.55 at this time a year ago. Corporation tax revenue has amounted to \$32,306.88 from 1,023 returns, compared with \$612,292.89

### Simple Little Bootlegging Case Poses Puzzler for High Court

WASHINGTON, March 8 (AP)—It seems a strange problem to put before supreme court justices, cloistered as they are in their incomparable marble buildings with their magnificent law library.

But it is there. The justices are worried about bootleggers and the standing they have in their communities.

Specifically, the court must find an answer to this question: Is a man who peddles booze illegally guilty of a crime involving moral turpitude?

In their scholarly researches the justices have considered the extent or lack of same, in which bootleggers are held in Kentucky, home state of Chief Justice Vinson. And they've even heard a reference to

that amateur chemist of the prohibition era who mastered the art of making bathtub gin.

Although the justices treated some of the arguments lightly, there's no doubt the question is a serious one for Sam de George, half owner and chef of a restaurant in Harvey, Ill.

If bootlegging is a crime involving moral turpitude, he will be deported to his native Palermo, Italy, where he came 30 years ago.

If bootlegging doesn't involve moral turpitude, he will be allowed to continue to serve spaghetti to the good citizens of Harvey.

De George's case got to the supreme court as an aftermath of two convictions of conspiracy to violate the internal revenue code. Which is a fancy way of saying that he and some pals were making liquor and neglecting to pay the tax.

He served a year and a day in the penitentiary for the first, two years for the second.

The immigration law says any alien who, more than once, is sentenced to terms of a year or more

in prison is subject to deportation. Provided—and this is what the argument is all about—the sentence is for "any crime involving moral turpitude."

Okay, what's moral turpitude? That's the rub. Congress passed the law, but it never did define what moral turpitude meant.

John F. Davis of the collector general's office maintained in his argument before the court that not paying taxes on whisky is fraud and that fraud involves moral turpitude.

Thomas F. Dolan, arguing for De George, said merely making whisky is no crime. Distilleries do it every day. And failing to pay taxes, Dolan said, is not an act of baseness, wickedness or depravity, as some dictationaries define moral turpitude.

Davis admitted that in some areas moonshining isn't regarded as the worst of all possible crimes. "I believe that is true of Kentucky," he said.

"Just Kentucky?" asked Vinson.

Justice Frankfurter, who asks more questions than any other justice, remarked that for some reason moonshining was considered romantic, and he observed:

"Gambling and alcohol have always stood apart in the law—and one other profession."

Dolan said one reason bootlegging isn't more frowned upon is that dur-
